

After all, Microsoft seems to be working on moving the taskbar feature on Windows 11

Tech blogger with the nickname Albacore, who is known for his highly accurate comments about upcoming technology products, just stumbled across a situation where the taskbar could be moved to the top edge. of the screen in the Dev Channel Windows 11 test channel.



However, currently the implementation is quite basic and absolutely no information has been disclosed. This raises the question of whether Microsoft is really 'determined' to bring the feature to users. Anyway, the good news is that early testing shows that the UI does not crash when interacting with the repositioned taskbar.

In the past, Microsoft has always maintained that the option to move the taskbar is not a really urgent or vital requirement with Windows 11. Instead, the company wants to spend time on a tweaks they deem more necessary

to the user experience, such as the flexible taskbar collapse and expansion on small touchscreen devices or tablets.
