

After Facebook, Instagram is also about to feature the memory of the deceased

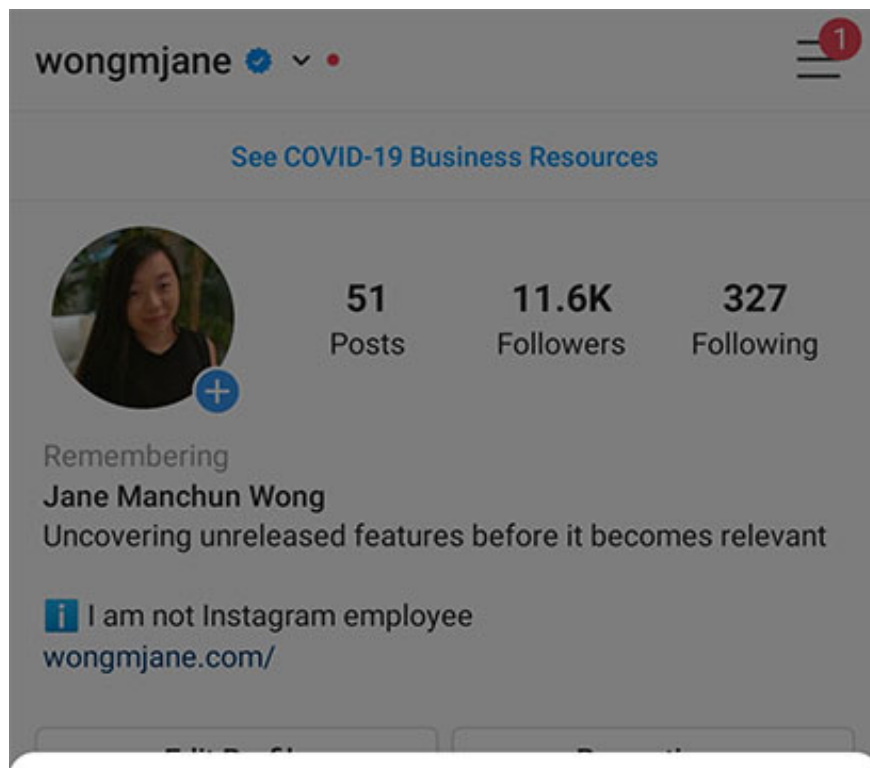
Instagram should have had this feature for a long time.
