

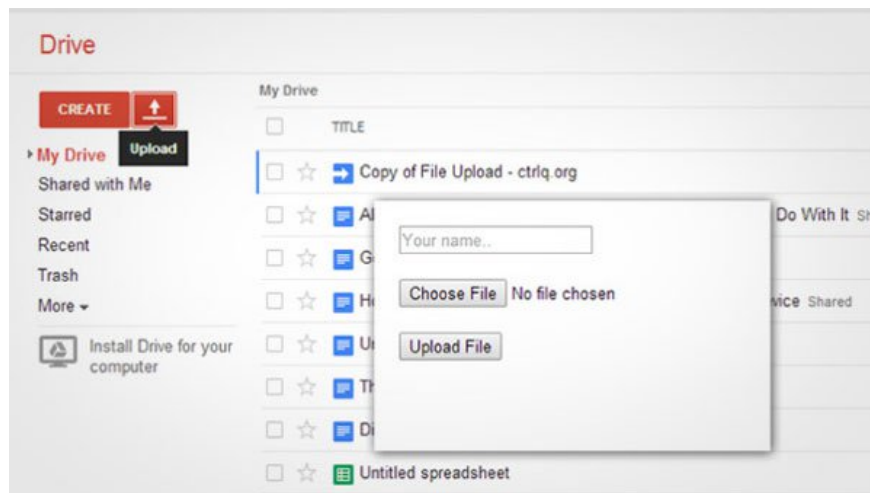
Allow others to upload data to your Google Drive

In fact, the trick to allowing users to upload data to your Google Drive is through a script developed by Digital Inspiration. This script allows anyone to upload files to your Drive account, even if they don't have a Google Drive account. You also do not need to undergo any verification process.



First, copy the script for your Google Drive here. Next, grant script permissions to your account by selecting **"doGet"** from the **Run** menu that appears.

In the next step, select **"Deploy as Web App"** from the **Publish** menu, click **"Save new version"** , then select **"Anyone, even anonymous"** , finally press the **Deploy** button.

Now the script will give you a URL form and anyone can use this form to upload data to your Google Drive.
