According to DigiTimes, Apple aims to sell pharmaceuticals from 19 to about 20 million iPhones around the world early next year, DigiTimes is a technology specializing in news about Taiwan suppliers.

According to a report from Apple, they will first produce CDMA-enabled iPhones in the next quarter, "Apple" also invests in the production of models using this technology more, there will be about 5 to 6 million iPhones. CDAM sold in the US, Asia - Pacific in the first quarter.
