After being caught up in a series of scandals involving Flashback malware on its operating system, Apple had to change its marketing message for OS X. Specifically, the company changed OS X's statement. " *virus-free* " to "*safe* " and "*protect your data without doing anything* " into " *Safe. Integrated*". Graham Cluley, a senior technology consultant, said this showed that Apple began to pay more attention to security.

According to *PC World* , in addition to changing marketing messages, Apple has also released a security guide for the iOS operating system and introduced the latest OS X 10.8 Mountain Lion for Mac computers. OS X 10.8 is equipped with the Gatekeeper feature, which limits the applications that can be installed on the device.

In a recent interview with Computerworld Australia, Eugene Kaspersky, co-founder of Kaspersky, said Apple should extend the timeframe for support for older operating systems. He said millions of people were using older versions of the operating system that "*Apple*" stopped supporting. This makes computers running this operating system vulnerable to infection and malware. Typically, OS X 10.5 has been discontinued support in May this year and replaced by OS X 10.7.
