There are some interesting library applications available that can do more. Many of these options feel like "familiar library apps". This helps longtime Android users feel more comfortable.

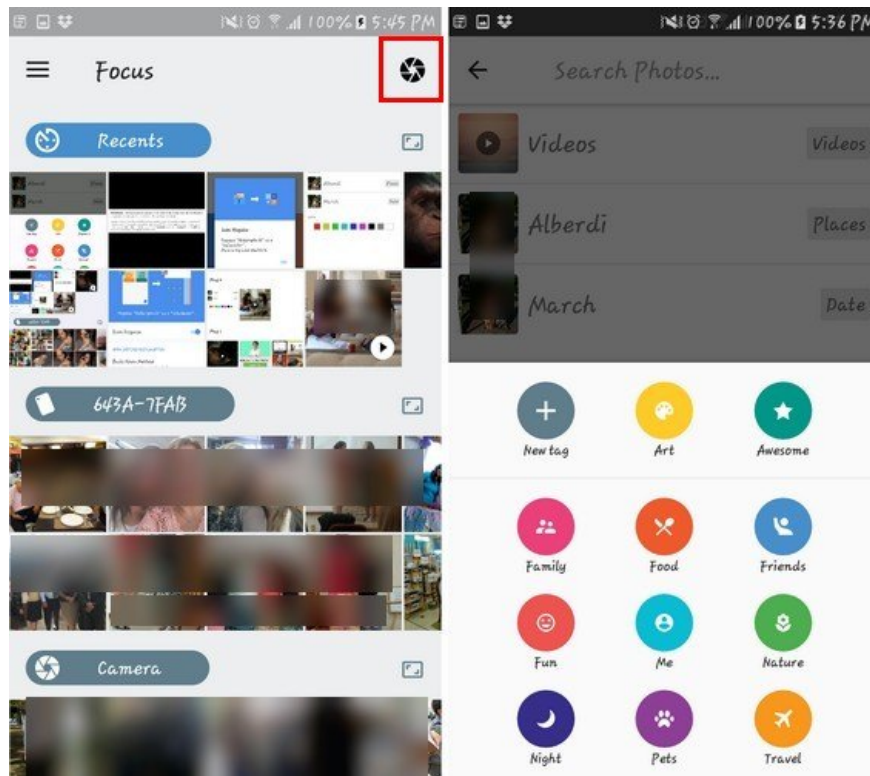

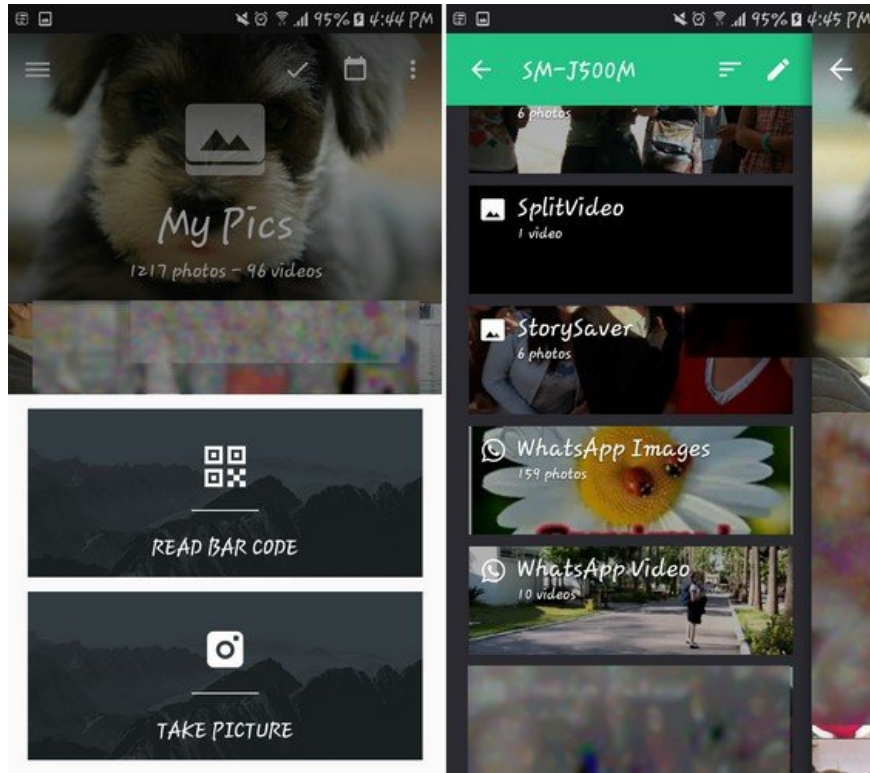
1. Focus

Focus is a simple and easy to use library application. The application does not have too many features, but it provides quick access to the device's camera. Just click on the camera icon at the top right and take a picture.

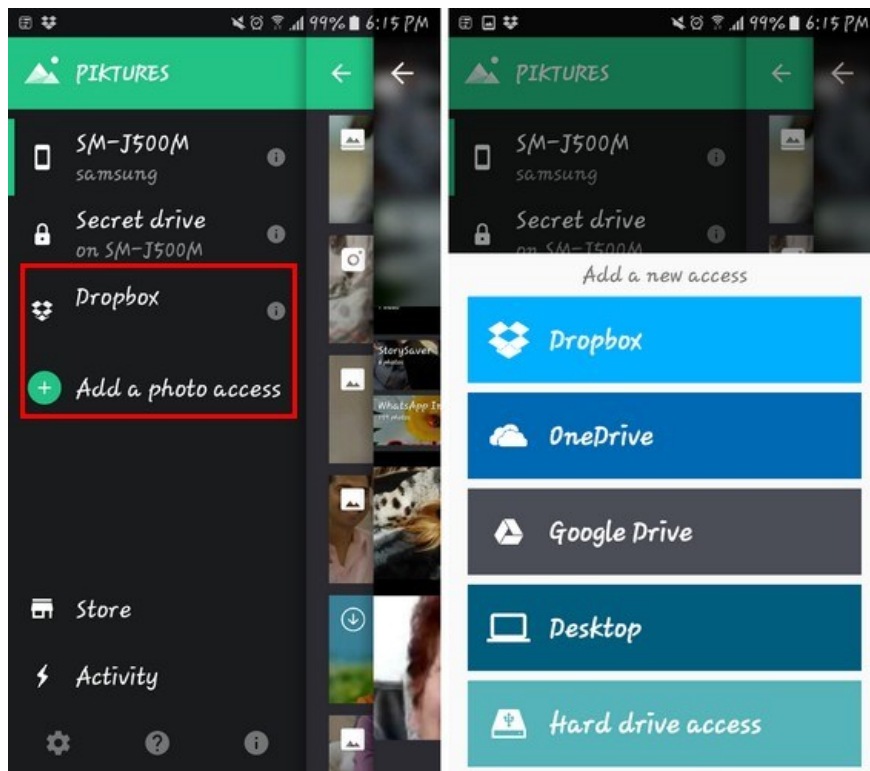


Although it is not possible to change the icon, you can change the theme of the application. For example, you can choose topics like Black, Christmas, Fingerprint, Paint, and Cake. You can allow the application to skip system settings to rotate images based on device sensors.

2. Piktures

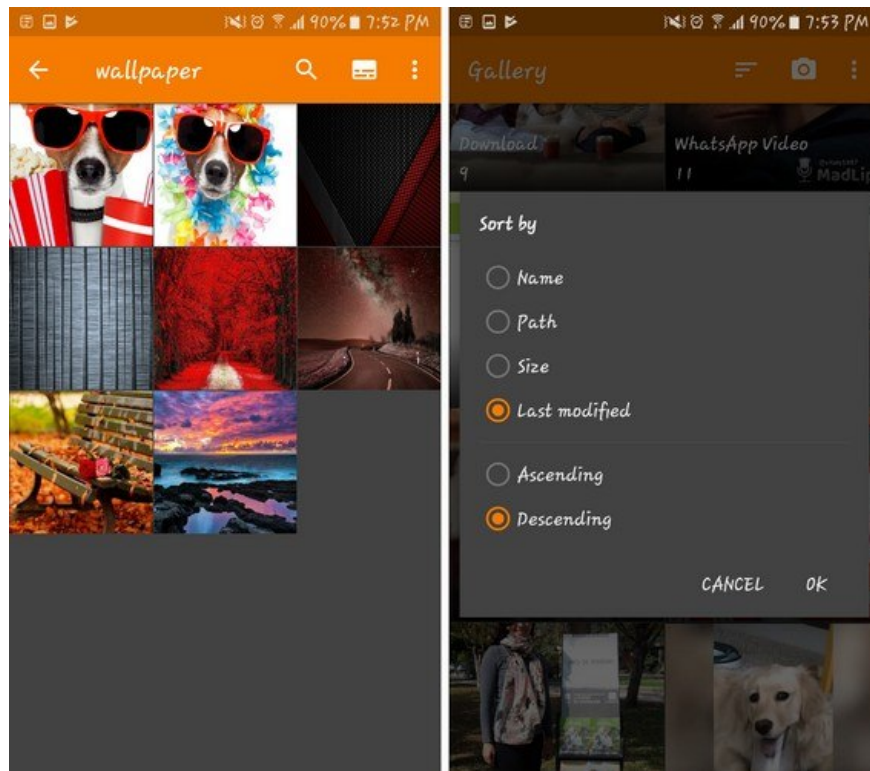


Pictures is a feature-rich photo library application that provides many useful options like syncing with Dropbox, OneDrive and Google accounts. You can also connect the application to the desktop or use the hard drive access feature.



By clicking on the calendar icon at the top right, you can view images by date. Touch the ? -> Album Settings -> Grid Settings to sort photos by column, by default, by name, date, size and last modified.

3. Simple Gallery

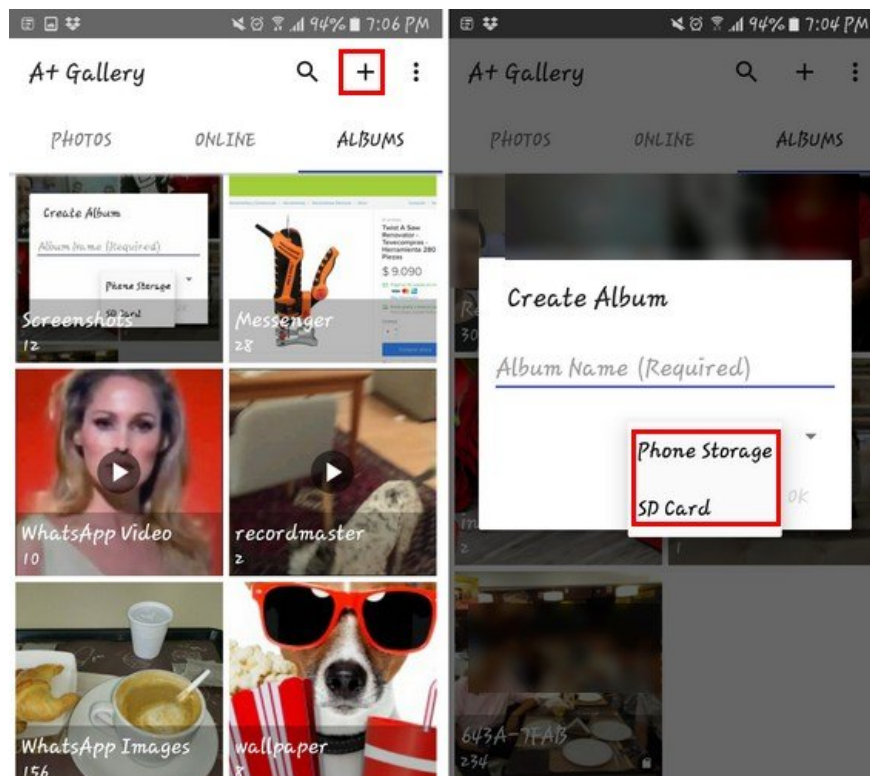


Simple Gallery is designed similar to the default Android library application, but the feature is different. Click on the three ? marks at the top right, you can increase / decrease the number of columns that display images.

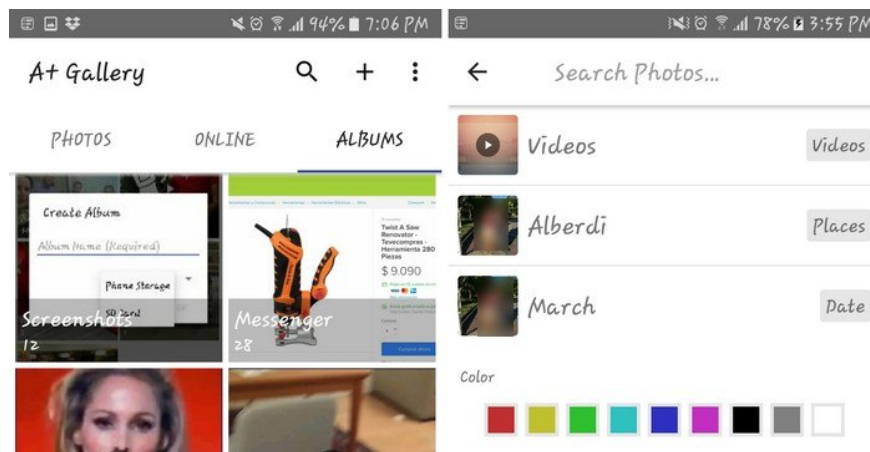
The application does not contain advertising and only requires the necessary permissions. The application also features a date display on images.

4. A + Gallery

A + Gallery also allows syncing with your accounts. But unlike Piktures, the app lets you connect to accounts like Facebook and Amazon Cloud Drive (as well as Dropbox). When creating a new album, images will be added to the saved album on both device and SD card.

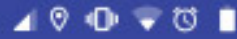


The application provides a secure directory, you can save photos that you don't want others to see. Your photos are automatically sorted by location and time. You can search for images by color - just click on the search icon and select the color in the bottom row.



5. F-Stop Gallery

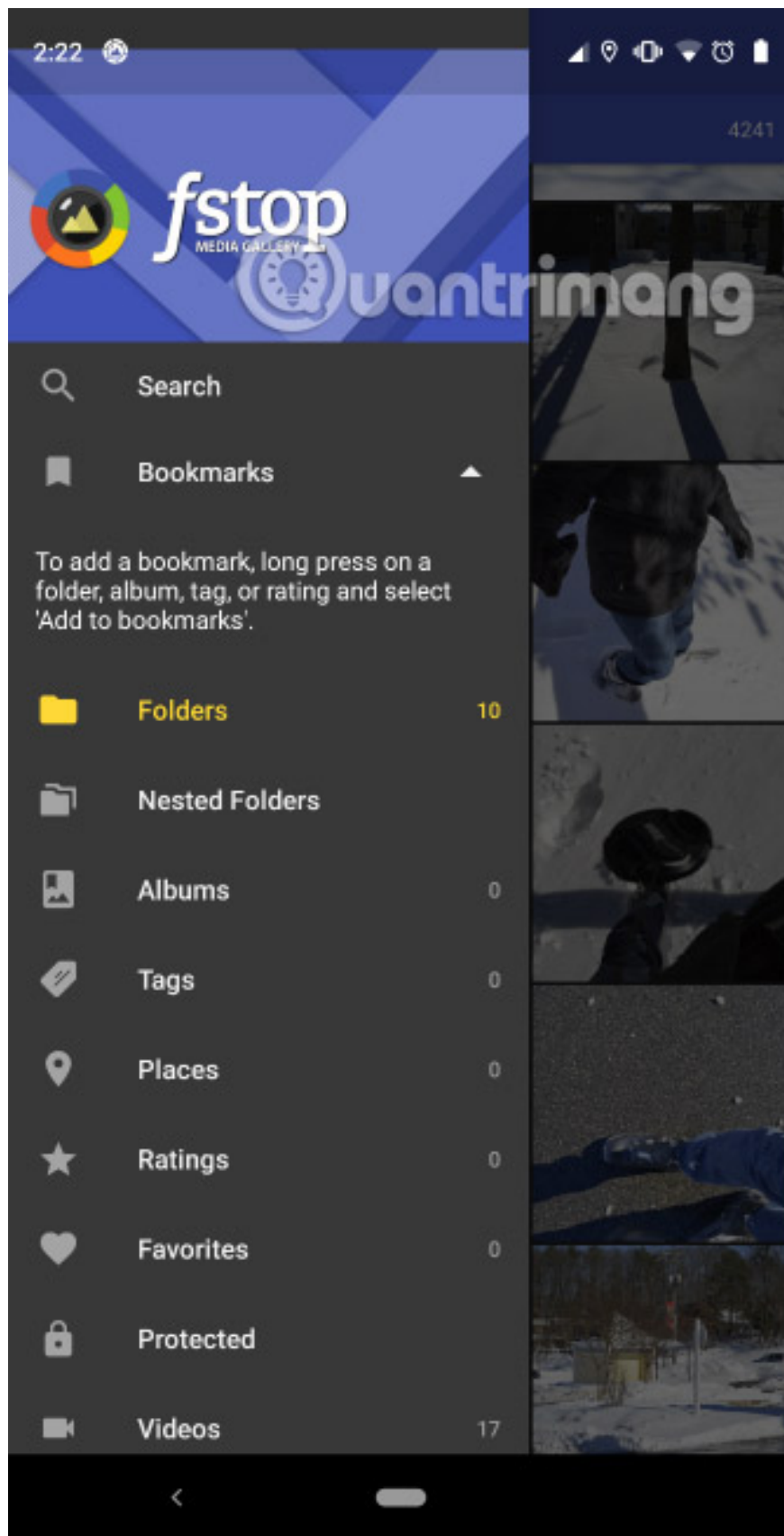

F-Stop Gallery features **Places** that map geographic location data from your photos on a map. You can also view the exact coordinates of any image on Google Maps.

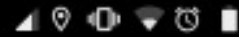
There are many sorting options in this app. In addition to sorting by name and shooting date, you can also sort by size and even by day, week, month or year. Each image can be evaluated by pressing and holding when viewing the full screen.

Although the application has a free version, the upgrade to the Pro version will unlock features such as writing metadata, custom arrangements, themes, nested albums and more.

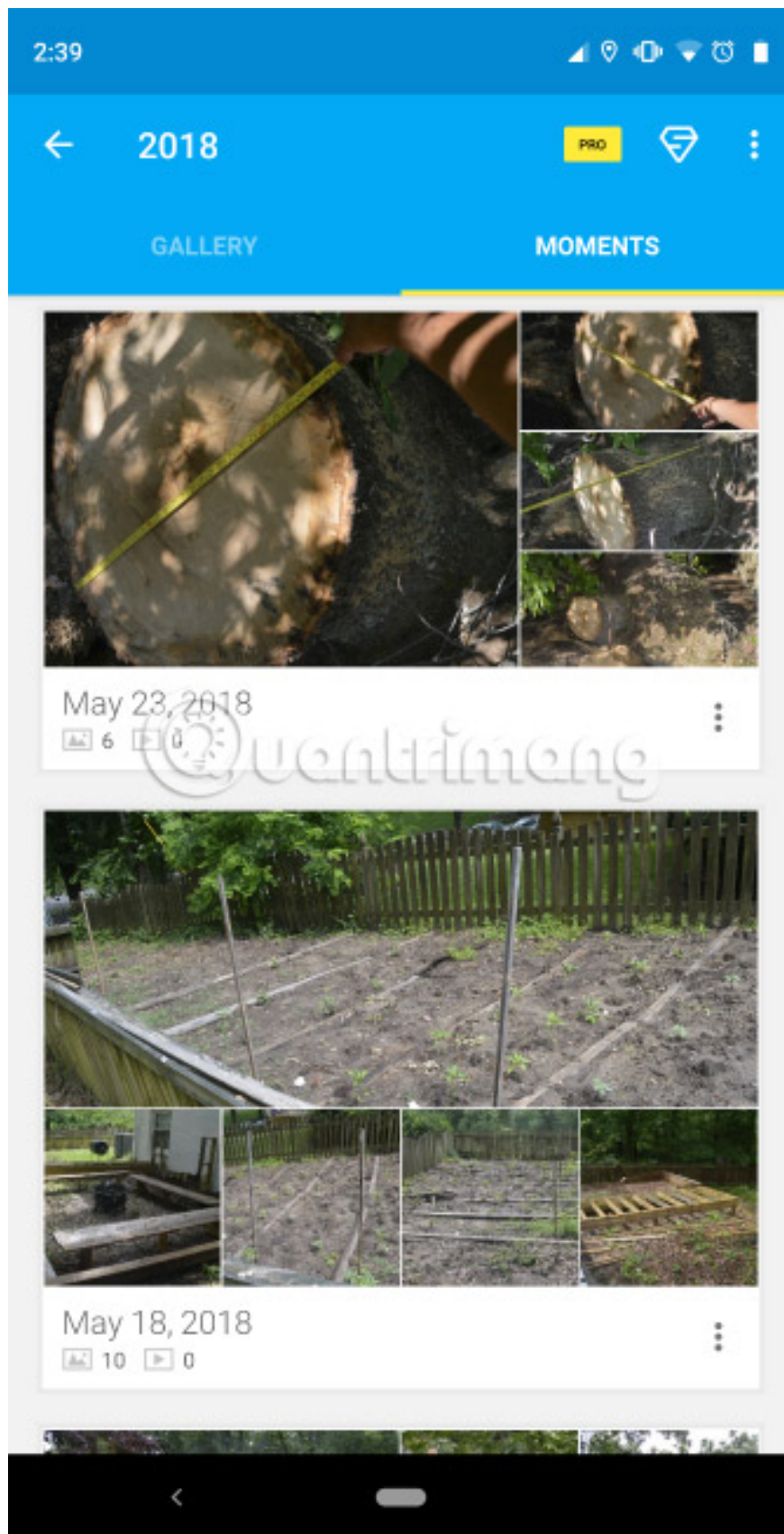

The most unique aspect of Gallery (formerly MyRoll Gallery) is a feature called "**Moments**". It places the image of each day in a separate folder, so it is easier to select photos on a particular day.

There is also a handy play button to display photos from a specific "moment." **Smart Mode** creates a personalized album, highlighting the best photos on your phone. Basically, the application determines the image that it thinks should go together and group them together. The library also supports Android Wear, allowing smart watchmakers to watch and even delete photos directly from the neck. their hands.

Application displays ads in the free version. Upgrading to the Pro version will remove these ads.

Download Gallery (Free, premium version 3 \$).
