In the past, grass was a popular material used to make houses. People often braided grass paintings in sheets (for roofing or erecting walls) according to the size appropriate to the size of the house, this process is called 'painting'.

Fighting is a difficult technique, requires high aesthetics, the grip of paintings (also known as a squeeze) must be regular to the roof to look beautiful and will not be wet with rain.

Thus, the word 'squeeze' in 'squeeze pictures' is the noun. And the idiom 'All Like Painting' means to do something very evenly.

A roof made of thatched roof is very durable and cooler than that of a tile or corrugated iron. With 15 - 20cm thick roofs, life expectancy is up to 20 - 30 years.
