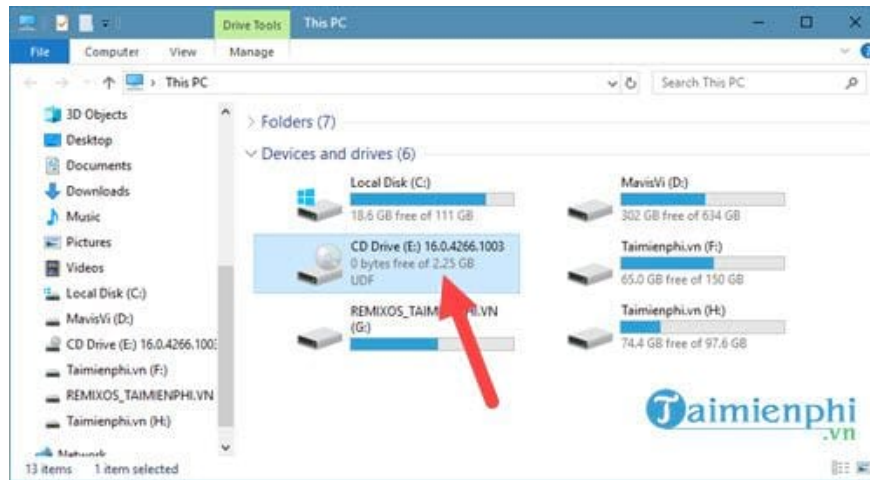

Back up DVD/CD/VCD discs to ISO using UltraISO.

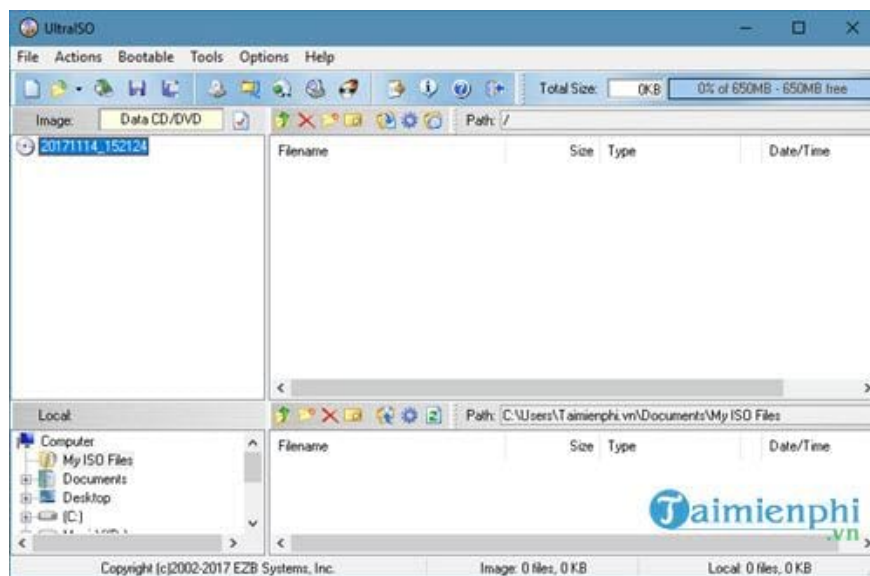
Step 1: First, you need to download and install UltraISO on your computer before proceeding. TipsMake has already provided instructions on this, so please refer to the **UltraISO installation** guide before backing up your DVD to ISO.

Note: Remember to restart your computer after the installation is complete.

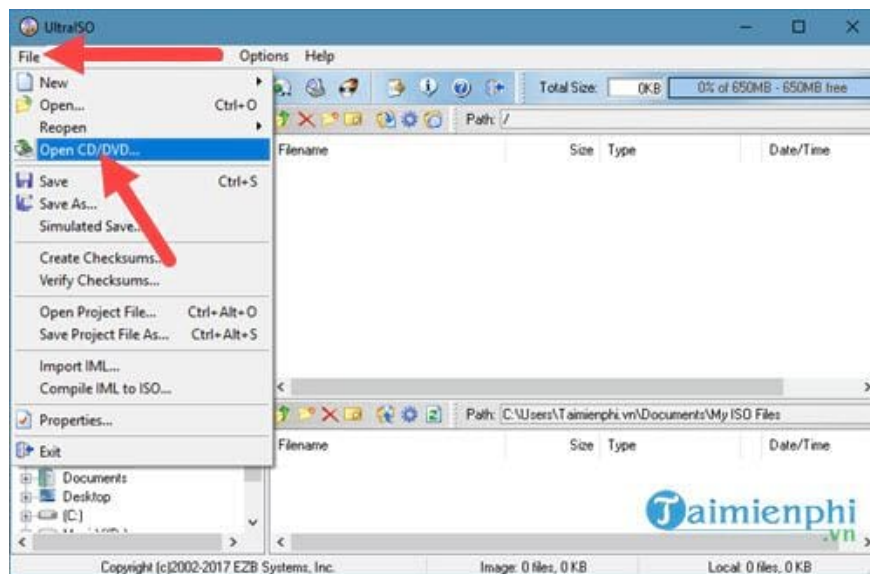
Step 2: Open My Computer (or This PC in Windows 10) and make sure the DVD/CD/VCD disc you want to create an ISO file from is installed.



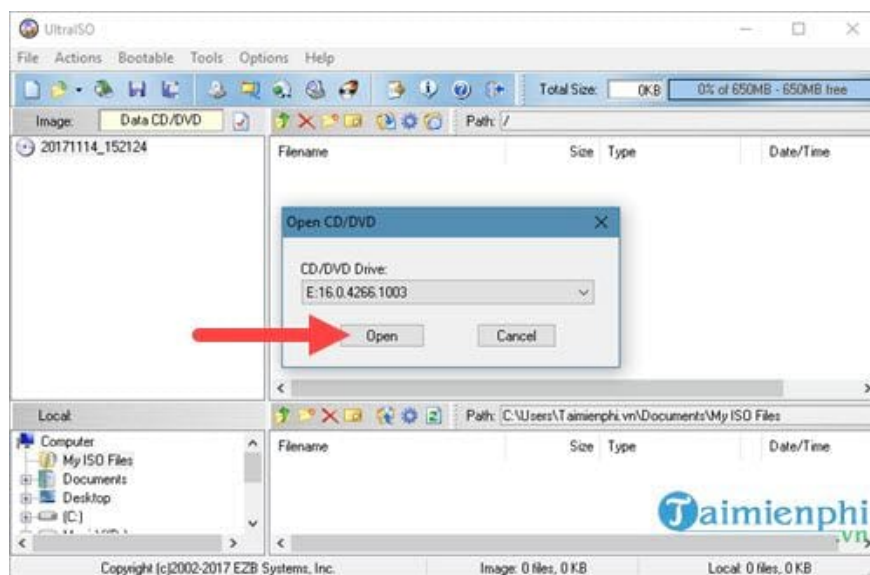
Next, open the UltraISO software .



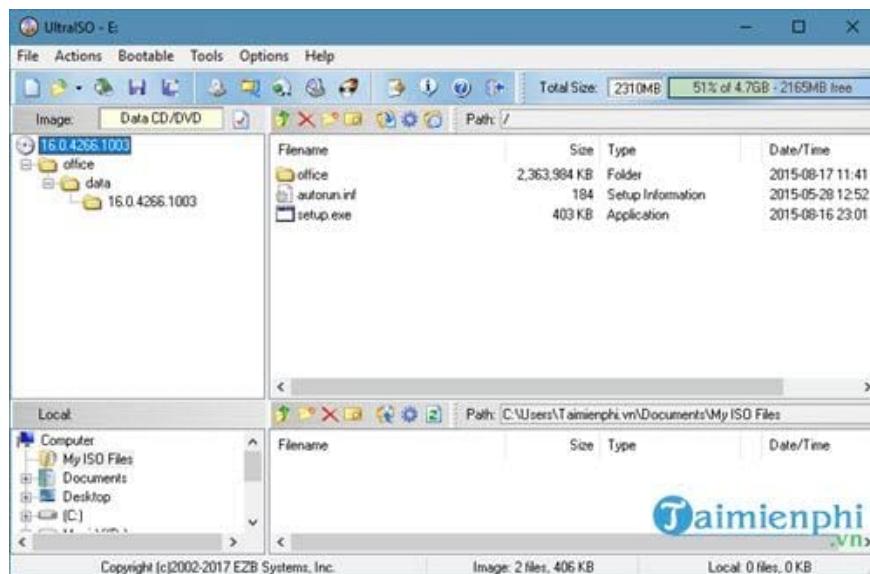
Step 3: On the UltraISO software interface, select **File > Open CD/DVD** to mount the drive on your computer or laptop.



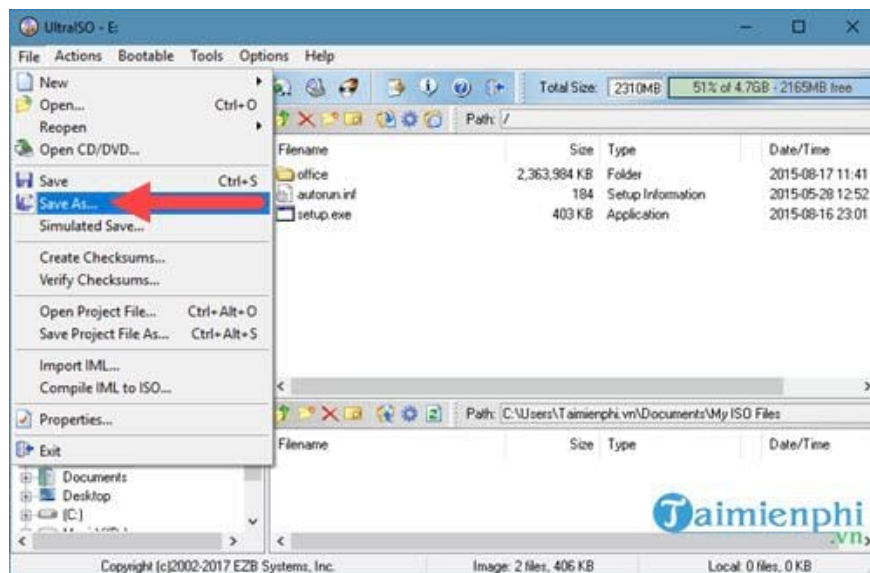
Next, select the drive containing the DVD/CD/VCD that you want to convert to an ISO file.



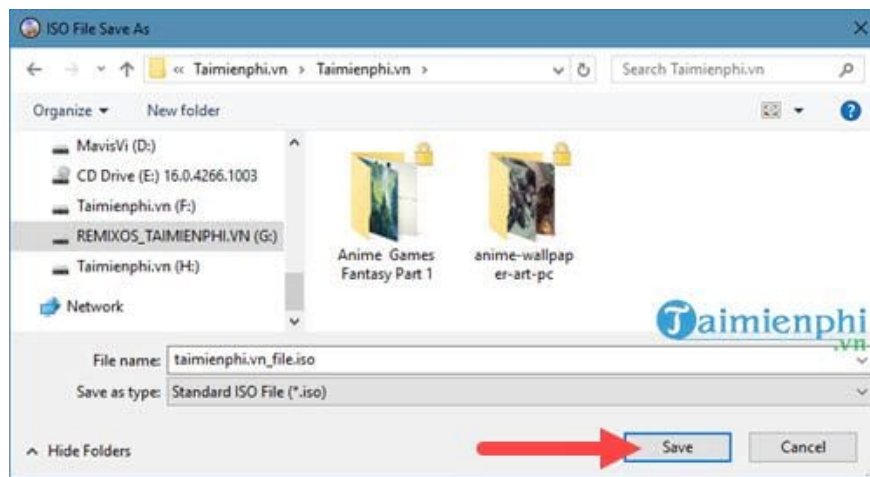
Step 4: The list of files on the disc is now in UltraISO. Let's begin backing up the DVD to ISO.



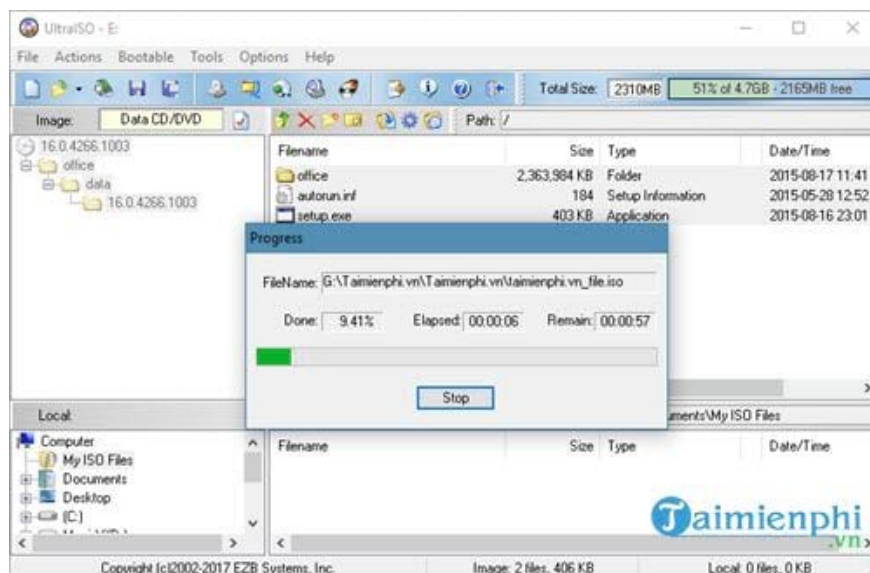
Step 5: Next, click on **File > Save As** . This is similar to backing up a DVD to an ISO file.



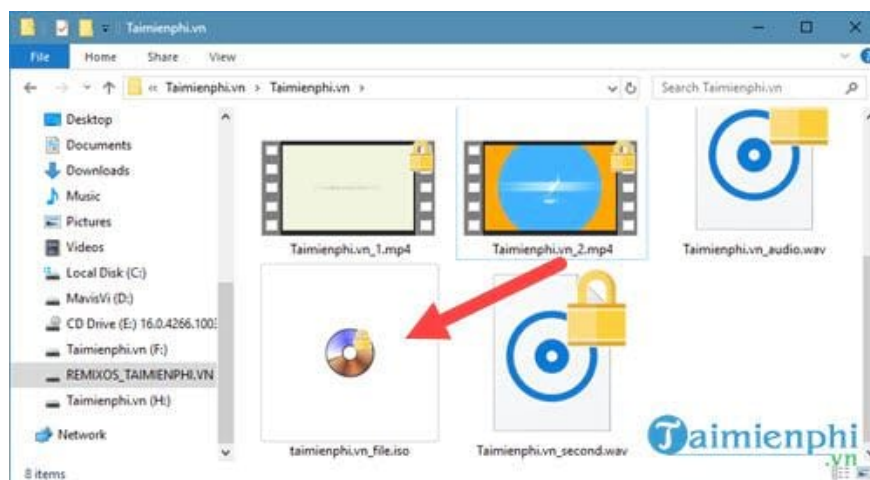
A window will pop up asking you to enter the name of the ISO file you are creating and press save to confirm your agreement.



The speed of this process depends entirely on the file you want to back up and the speed of your computer, but it shouldn't take too long to wait.



And finally, let's see the result of what you've just done: backing up your DVD to ISO using UltraISO is complete.
