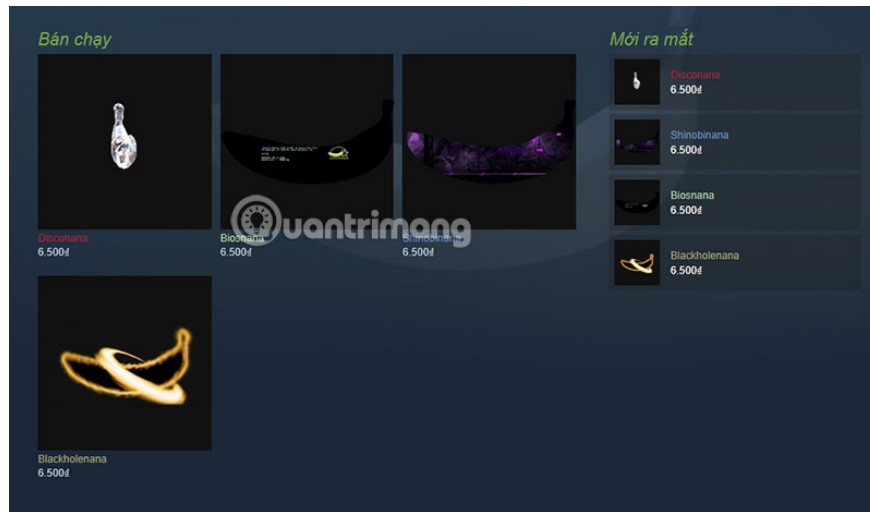

These are the numbers that really attract gamers on Steam.



But those are only a few of the valuable bananas in the game, most of the bananas in the game only cost from a few thousand to a few tens of thousands of dong. Many people wonder, what effect do those bananas have? The answer is that they have no effect at all, other than they are overpriced just in that game and someone will buy your banana.

And perhaps, the real winner in Banana is Valve, in every transaction of buying and selling "agricultural products" in the game, Valve will receive a percentage of the revenue. Of course, the bananas in Banana still deserve to be considered inanimate "agricultural products" and they have no meaning or any practical value. However, Banana is still maintaining the number of more than 600,000 players every day.
