that was selling newspapers to Houston's Post magazine by phone. This is the foundation for Michael Dell to start building his business.

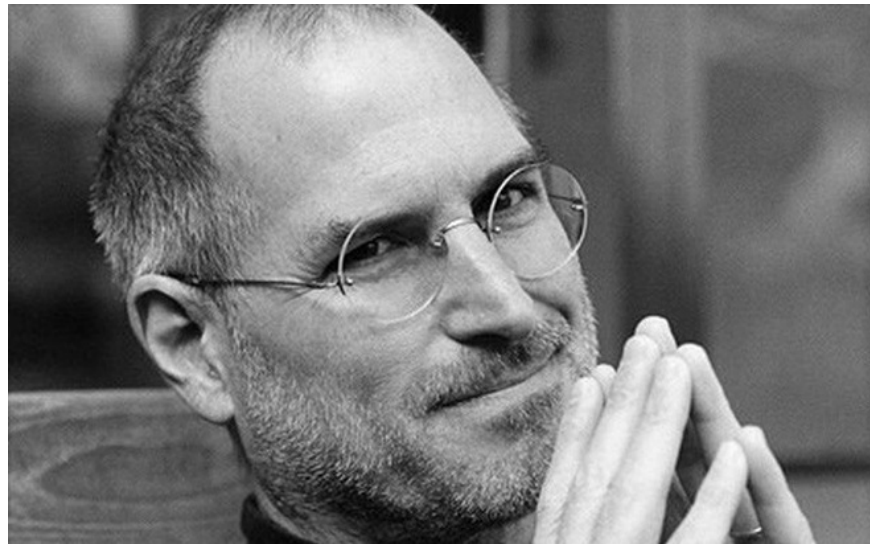

After that, he sent a lot of newspapers in consecutive weeks as wedding gifts to these couples. As a result, the customers who received this gift felt very happy and decided to place the newspaper long. After the deal, Michael received \$ 18,000. After having capital, he used them to buy old computers to repair and resell. Gradually he opened his own company, so that it now becomes an 'irreplaceable' brand in the computer world - Dell.

Bill Gates - Programmer

Referring to billionaire Bill Gates, we often think of a person who dares to drop out of school to mobilize himself and achieve great success.

With a passion for technology in people, even when he was a student Bill Gates worked as a computer programmer for TRW.
