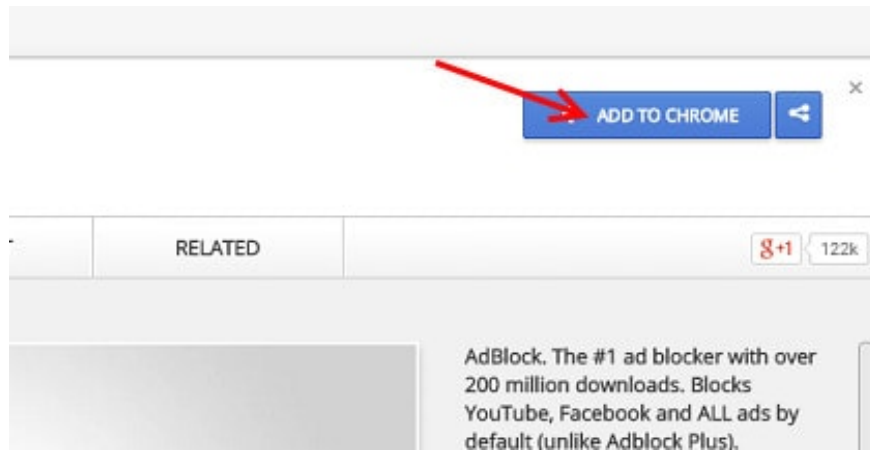

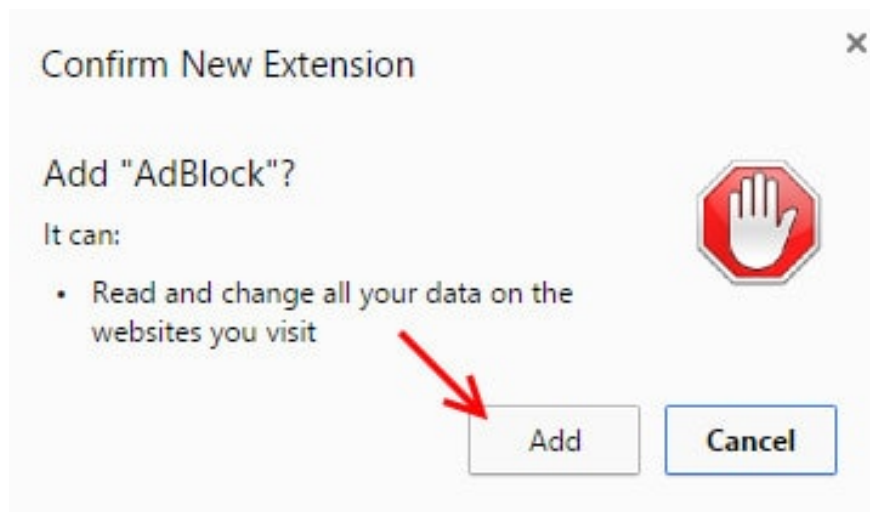
To download the Adblock for Chrome app: **Download Adblock for Chrome**

Step

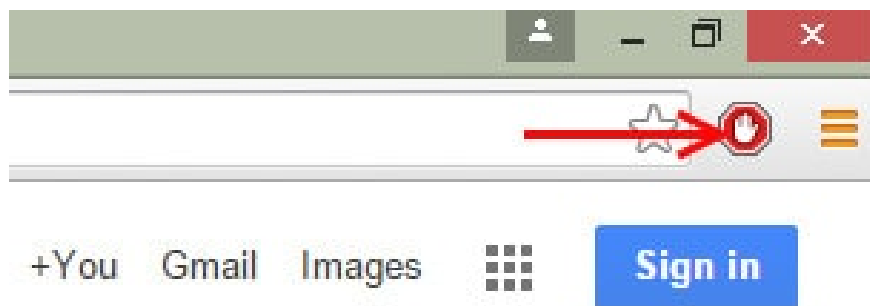
1: Click on ADDED TO CHROME to install it into Chrome.
