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iFixit can provide a closer look, even showing individual pixels, of the iPhone's case, adhesive, and display. There are zoomed-in views of everything from the battery connector to the magnets inside the Taptic Engine - a Vibration Motor that recreates the feel of a touch or press, like a trackpad or conventional hard key. .



The images in the video show that the iPhone 15 has a design that is largely unchanged compared to the iPhone 14.

iFixit also discovered that the iPhone 15 has a larger 48-megapixel camera, not the same 48-megapixel camera found on the iPhone 15 Pro Max. iFixit confirms that the 4-pixel "group" in the iPhone 15's camera is about 22% smaller. This means that the iPhone 15's camera cannot perform as well in low light as the camera in the iPhone 15 Pro Max.

Finally, iFixit gave the iPhone 15 a score of 4/10, meaning it's quite difficult to repair, despite Apple's efforts to ease repairability requirements.

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
