

Computer Tips : How to reset Windows 11 to its original state

If your Windows 11 computer is running slow or crashing, you can revert the system to factory default settings to solve most common problems and improve performance. How to reset Windows 11 to its original state has been detailed by TipsMake in the article below.

There are many reasons why you want to **reset Windows 11** to its original state, such as junk files that accumulate for a long time, taking up a lot of storage space and slowing down your PC, maybe you have installed some components. software that messes with the system or you want to give or sell your PC to someone else.

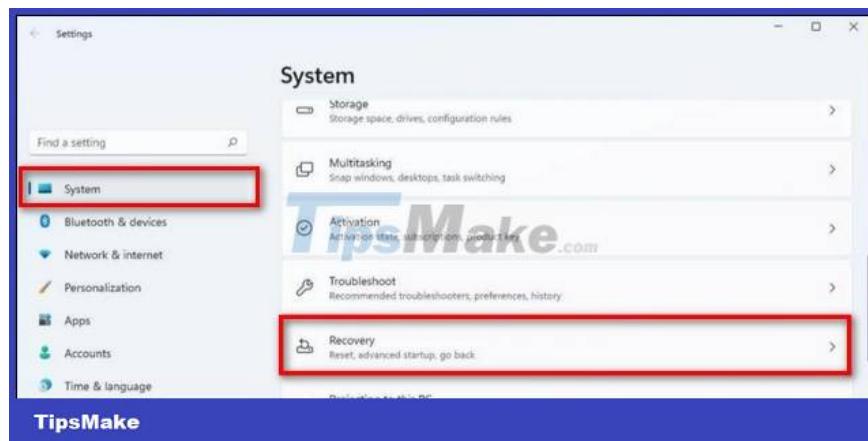
You can download the Windows 11 ISO and do a clean install, but that's not necessary. Like Windows 10, Windows 11 also has a built-in function that allows you to restore your computer to factory settings. Soon, TipsMake will guide you "**Computer tips** " how to *reset Windows 11* to its original state.

How to reset Windows 11 to its original state

To reset Windows 11 to default settings, do the following:

Step 1: Click on the Windows icon on the taskbar and select Settings or press the Windows + I key combination to open the settings application.

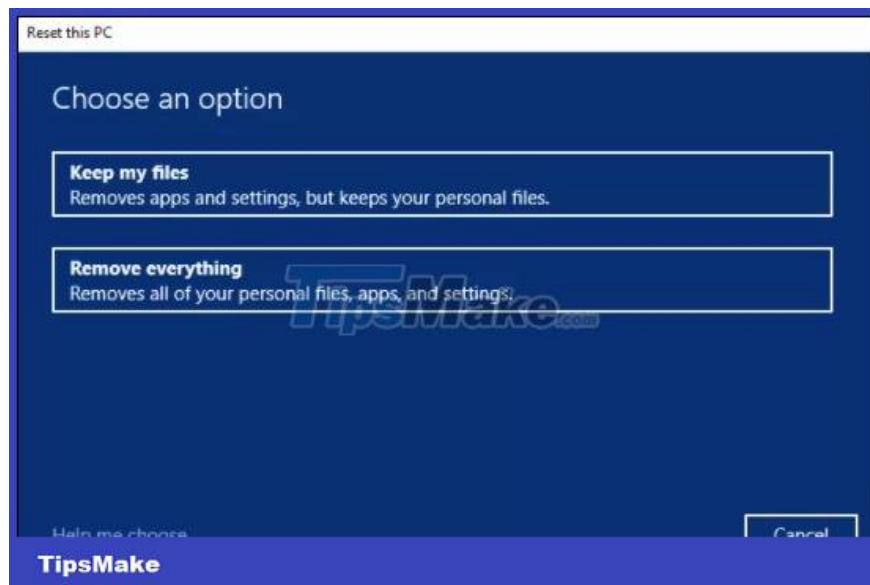
Step 2: Next, select System > Recovery.



Step 3: Under the Recovery options section, click the Reset PC button next to the Reset this PC feature.



Step 4: You will have 2 options to **factory reset Windows 11**: Keep my files and Remove everything.



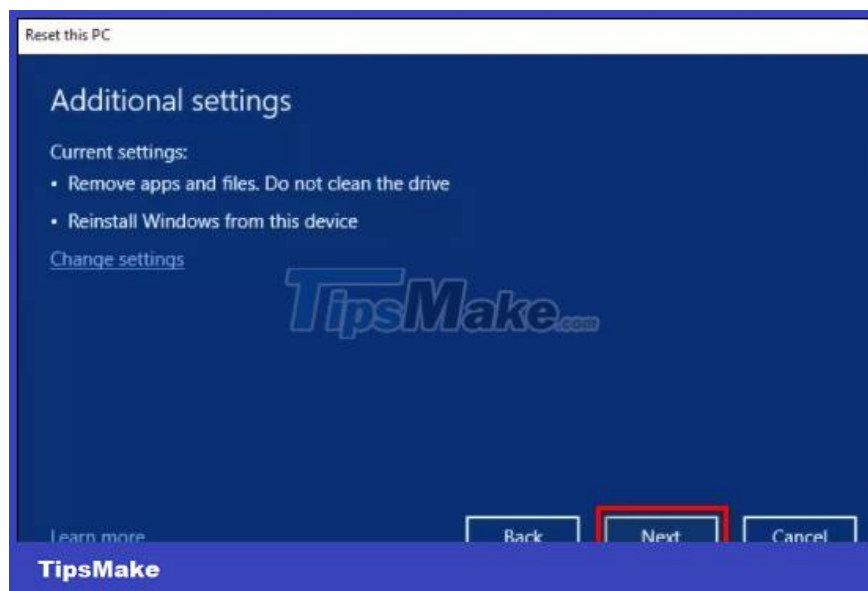
1. If you want to reset Windows 11 without losing data, choose Keep my files.
2. If you want to restore Windows 11 and erase everything on your computer, for example, to give your computer to someone else and make sure they can't access your data, select Remove everything. Note before choosing this option, you should back up your data to restore when needed.

Step 5: In this step, you will choose how to *reload Windows 11*.

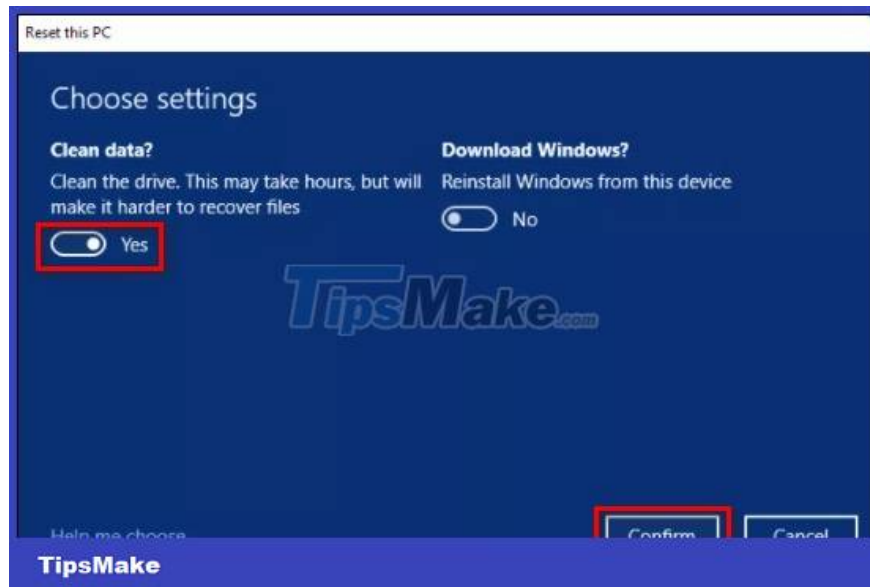


1. Cloud download: Download a fresh copy of the installation from the cloud and reinstall Windows 11. However, this option will not restore the tools, applications, and configurations that came with the original manufacturer-provided files. grant.
2. Local reinstall: Use existing files to reset the computer. If your computer comes from brands like Dell, Asus, Lenovo., this process will restore the original drivers, settings and tools.

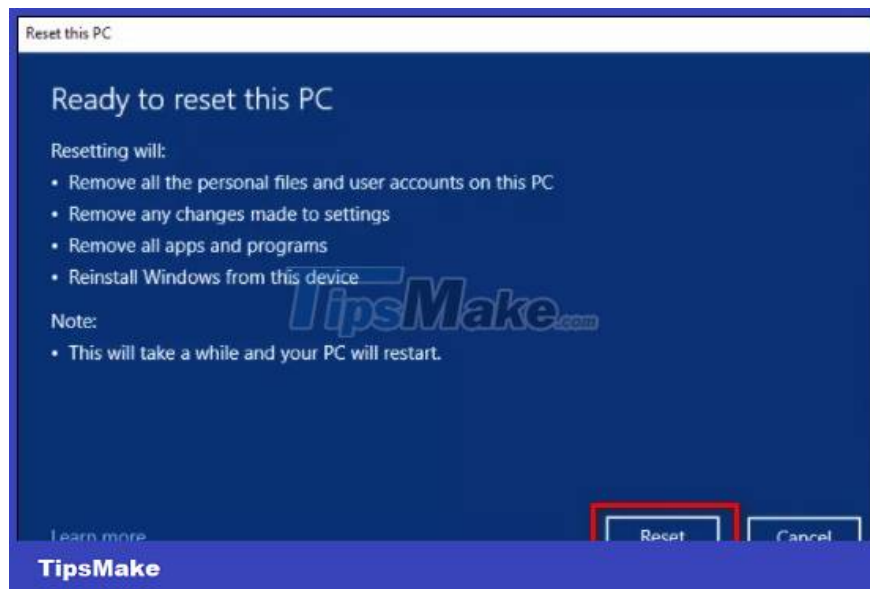
Step 6: Click Next to continue.



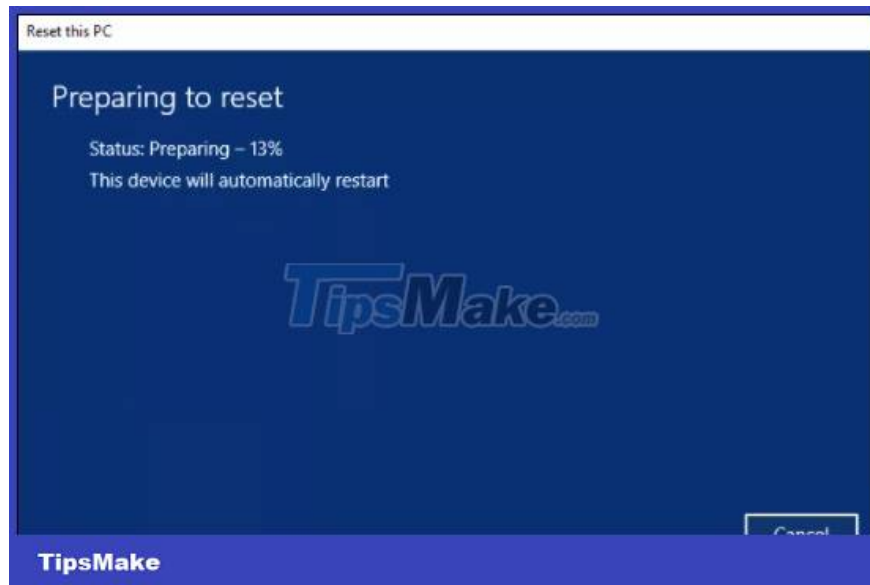
If you **reset windows 11** with the Remove everything option in step 4, you can click Change settings and enable Clean data? to clean the drive. This will prolong the time it takes to reset the computer, so only do it if you are really worried that someone will use this computer and run some kind of recovery software to find your files, or prepare to sell it. computer. Otherwise, keeping the default reset settings is recommended.



Step 7: Click on Reset button.



Step 8: The device will take a few minutes to prepare before automatically rebooting.



After that, the Windows 11 reset process begins. You will receive the same questions as when performing a clean install of Windows 11. Follow the prompts to complete the reinstallation process. These will include choosing a country, keyboard layout, and privacy settings, along with signing in to a Microsoft account.



Above is how to *reset Windows 11* to its original state. Your computer may reboot several times during this process. Reset time can be quite long, so you should plug in the charger during the installation if using a laptop. Or if you feel that it is not suitable to use Windows 11 or your machine cannot afford to use this operating system, you can downgrade Windows 11 through the computer tips shared on Tipsmake.
