

Connect your iPhone or iPod phone to Windows 7 via Bluetooth

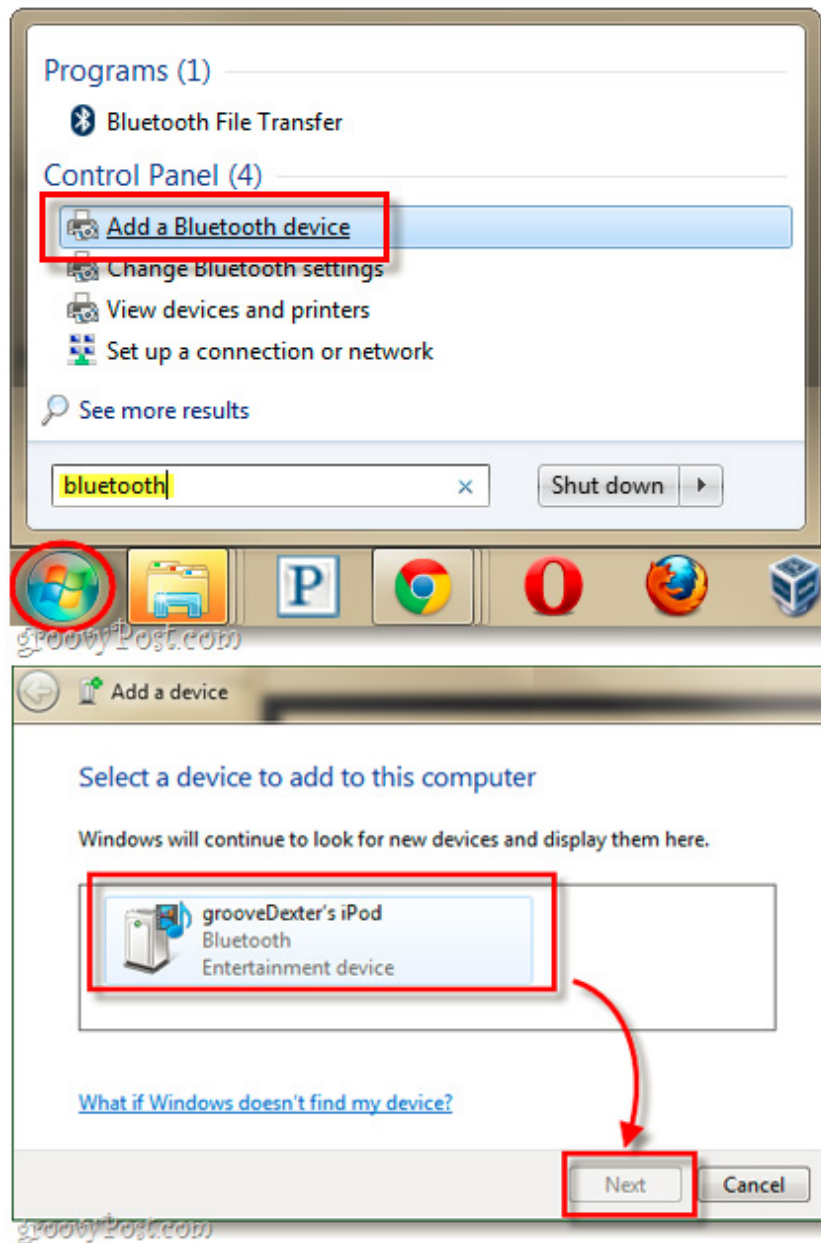
In the previous tutorial, we presented some basic steps to connect mobile devices to Windows computers via Bluetooth. And this time, we will continue with a product using the iOS operating system, specifically between an iPhone or iPod Touch phone with a Windows 7 computer.

In the previous tutorial, we presented some basic steps to connect mobile devices to Windows computers via Bluetooth. And this time, we will continue with a product using the iOS operating system, specifically between an iPhone or iPod Touch phone with a Windows 7 computer.

First, on your phone, select Settings on the main monitor screen and open **General > Bluetooth**. Here, switch from **Off** to **On** mode to enable this feature:

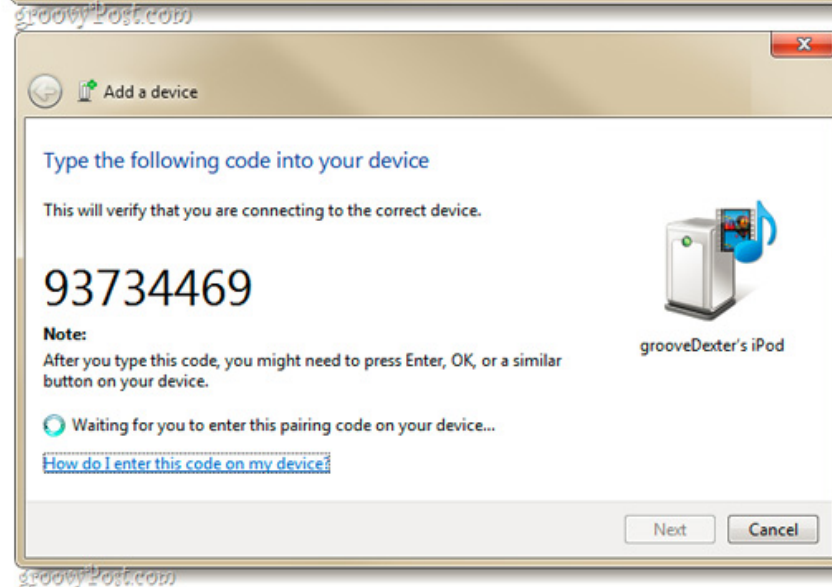
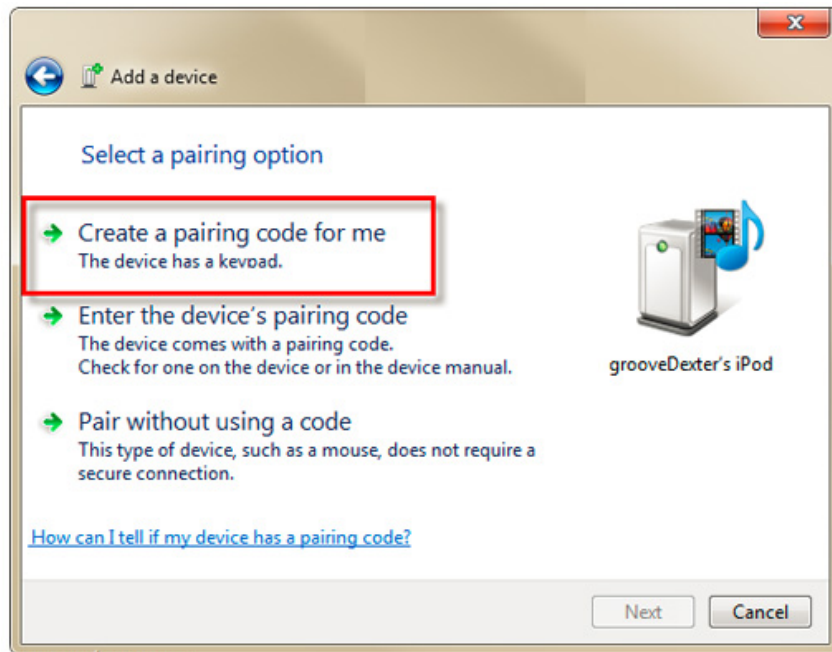


Next, switch to a Windows computer, open the **Start Menu** (press the Windows button) and type the word **bluetooth** into the search box, then select **Add a Bluetooth device** in the list of results displayed. The next pop-up window appears, where you will see the name of the iPhone or iPod phone appear, select the correct device and click **Next** :

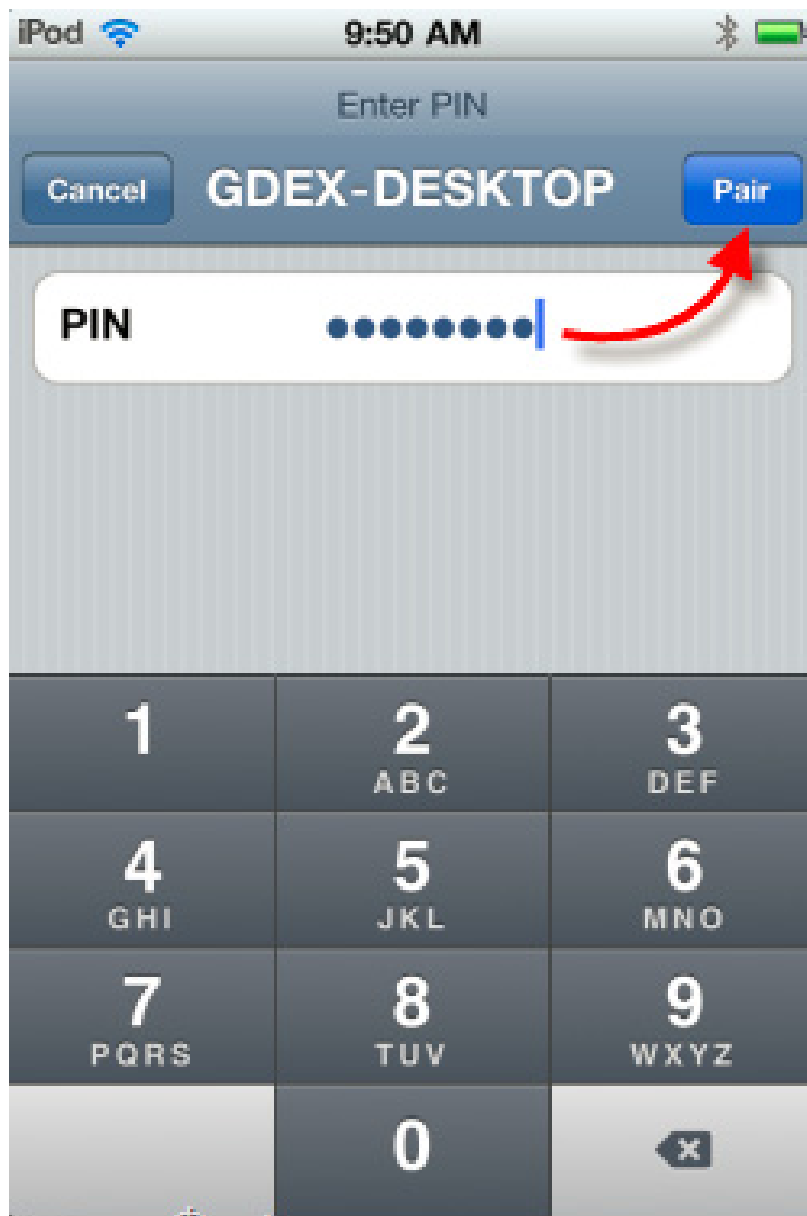


Note one important thing that before clicking Next, make sure the iPhone is not **locked** or not in **Sleep** mode. And next, there will be two situations, depending largely on the Bluetooth software installed on the computer.

In the first case , the system will offer 3 different **Pairing** options for users. Here, you click **Create a pairing code for me** and next, people will receive a sequence of characters including 6 - 8 digits:

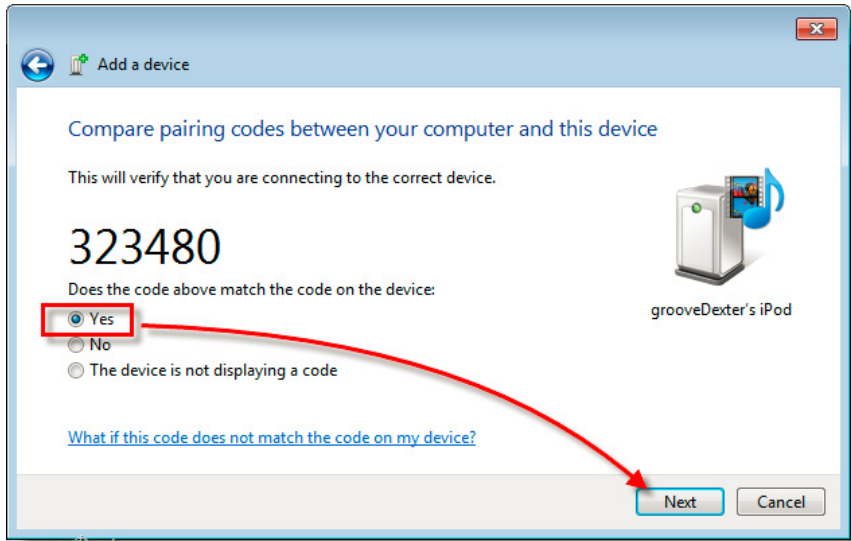


Next, on your phone will display the screen asking the user to enter the **PIN** code, enter the serial number that appears on the computer at the previous step and press the **Pair** button:

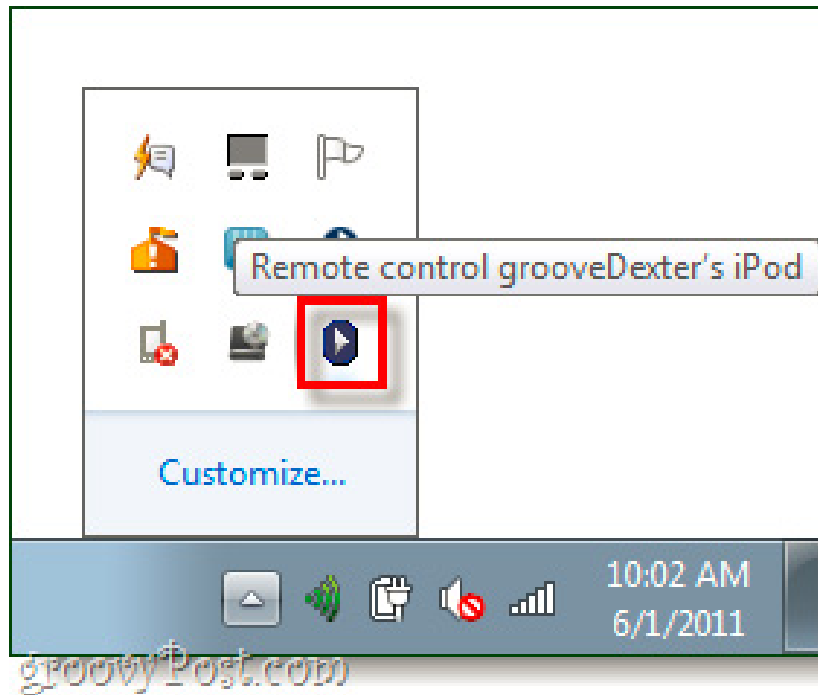
The second case : if things don't work like this, then in this step, Windows will automatically create a sequence of battery numbers, and on your phone will also appear a small dialog box informing the device. trying to connect. Compare on the screen of your computer and phone, then select **Yes> Next** first, then press **Pair** on the phone:

And everything is done according to our wishes, the Windows 7 computer has successfully connected to the iPhone or iPod Touch phone via Bluetooth. From the computer, the user can perform some simple operations on the phone such as listening to music, watching movies . via the control button at the bottom of the system tray:
