

Create 3D images for Desktop with BumpTop

BumpTop (provided under two copies, free version and \$ 29 Pro version) can make Windows two-way desktop, turned into a 3-dimensional room. It can help you organize your files and desktop icons, but if you want to get these cool and catchy images you have to spend a lot of your system resources.

BumpTop (provided under two copies, free version and \$ 29 Pro version) can make Windows two-way desktop, turned into a 3-dimensional room. It can help you organize your files and desktop icons, but if you want to get these cool and catchy images you have to spend a lot of your system resources.



With this software, you can spread your shortcuts and files to the floor or four walls of BumpTop's room, or you can do pretty interesting things like 'grab' and 'throw' it to it. into another surface. The application can help you organize your belongings by collecting it into self-created columns - these columns are created by drawing a circle around multiple icons and files - or you can automatically collect everything. into 3-D stacks (called columns) based on their type (the types here can be: documents, folders, program shortcuts, .).

When creating a column, you can double-click it to expand the column as a grid, then press down. Right-click a column and you will have to choose other options, such as scrolling the items inside it or dissolving the column.

BumpTop will start with a few frames. Frames can loop through images pulled from a folder on your hard drive, or from an RSS feed from websites such as Flickr or Picasa Web. You can also get some widgets to upload photos to your Facebook account when you drop it on the widget icon.

It is also possible to develop or shrink a certain icon to observe accordingly, search for certain keywords in your desktop items or filter a slideshow of photos in the room. The program windows will display normally and if you stop BumpTop by right-clicking its icon in the system tray you will see a normal Windows desktop.

BumpTop can be said to be interesting for those who like to discover and beautify computers, its columns can help you organize a personal desktop. However it uses quite a bit of memory to maintain 3D graphics display and partly CPU performance when you move items.

BumpTop currently has two versions, free and \$ 29 Pro. The Pro version adds some other features, such as flipping items in a column by rolling your mouse or automatically developing icons for files that you use regularly. When installing, you will be prompted to select the free or Pro version.
