

Create a password for the Guest account on Windows XP

Windows XP has an account that allows everyone to access it without having to enter a password - Guest account.



By default, this account is always turned off and if you need an administrator to open this account for all users, it is not allowed to set a password. So when this account is opened, your computer almost reduces the level of security required. To fix this, you just need to follow a few simple steps in this article to set the password for the Guest account.

Log in to the computer in the Administrator or admin account.

- **Go to Start -> Run** enter **cmd**

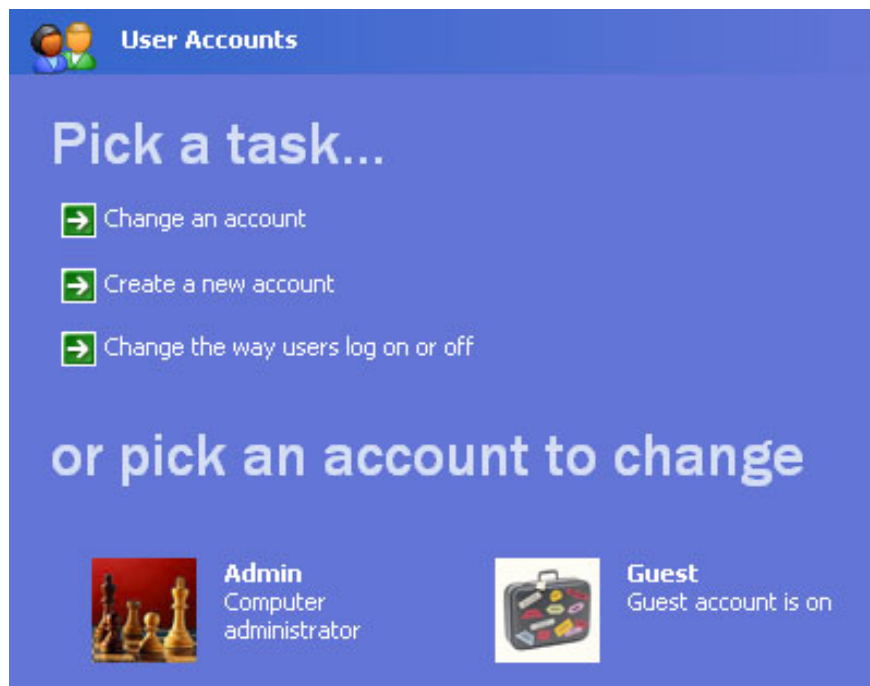
- At the input window: **net user guest**

In it is the password you need to set for the Guest account



```
Administrator: C:\Windows\system32\cmd.exe
Copyright (c) 2009 Microsoft Corporation. All rights reserved.
C:\Users\>net user guest 123_
```

Go to Start -> Control Panel -> User Accounts and activate the Guest account to *Turn on* .



You can also use the above command to change the password for the Guest account (if you want to remove the password, leave the section blank)
