

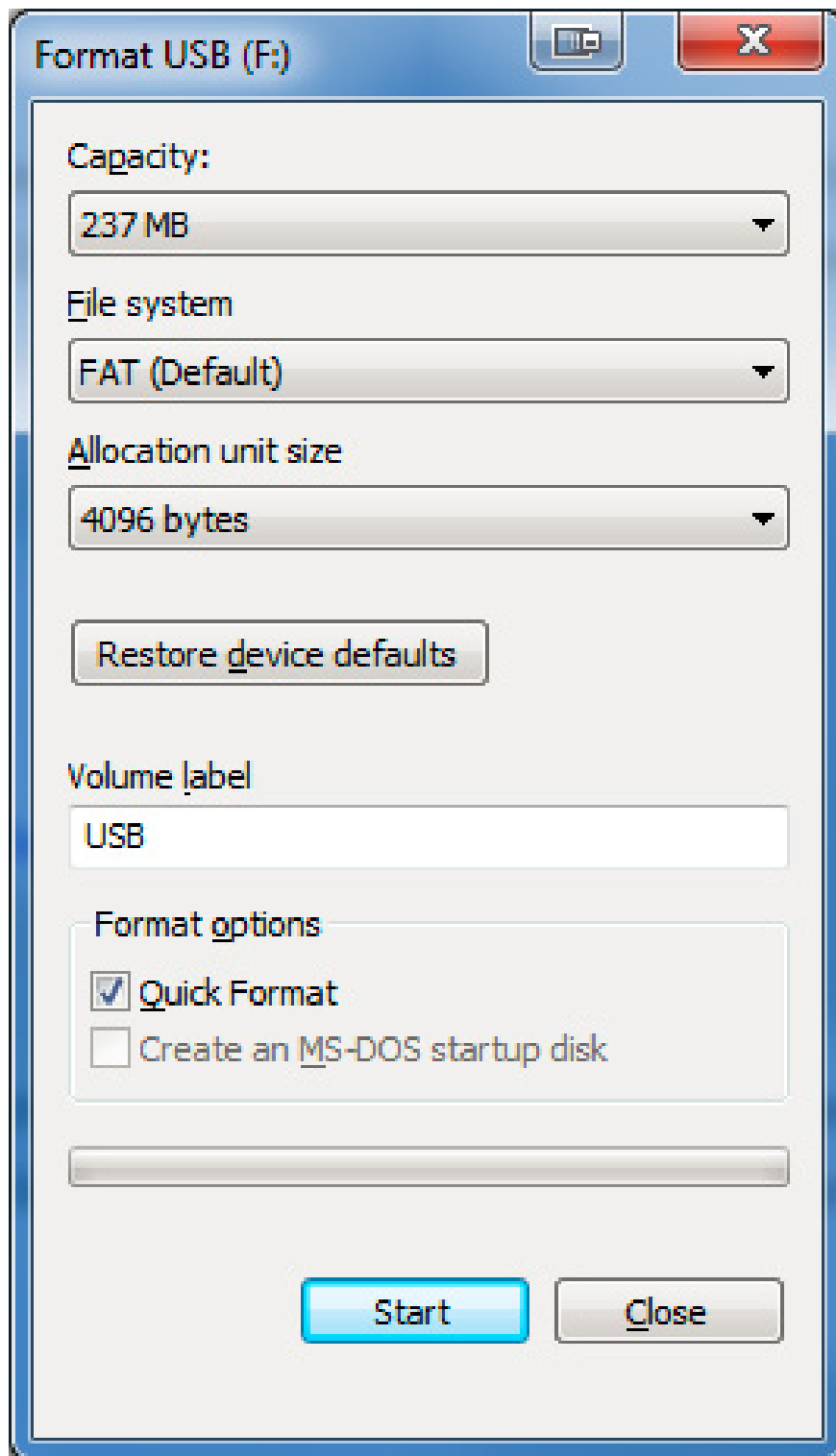
Create Windows Password Reset Disk on Windows 7 with USB Flash Drive

In the following article, the Network Administrator will guide you through the basic steps to create a password recovery tool - Windows Password Reset Disk with a USB drive on Windows 7 operating system in case if you forget the login password. Enter, you can still access your computer and create a new password.

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Technically, the **Password file Reset** after creating only has a capacity of about 2 KB, so you should choose and use the USB drive so that it is not wasted (because most Flash drives today have minimum capacity). is 2 GB).

The first step is to plug the USB drive into your computer, then copy all the necessary data and store it in your computer. Next, right-click the USB drive name and select **Format** :

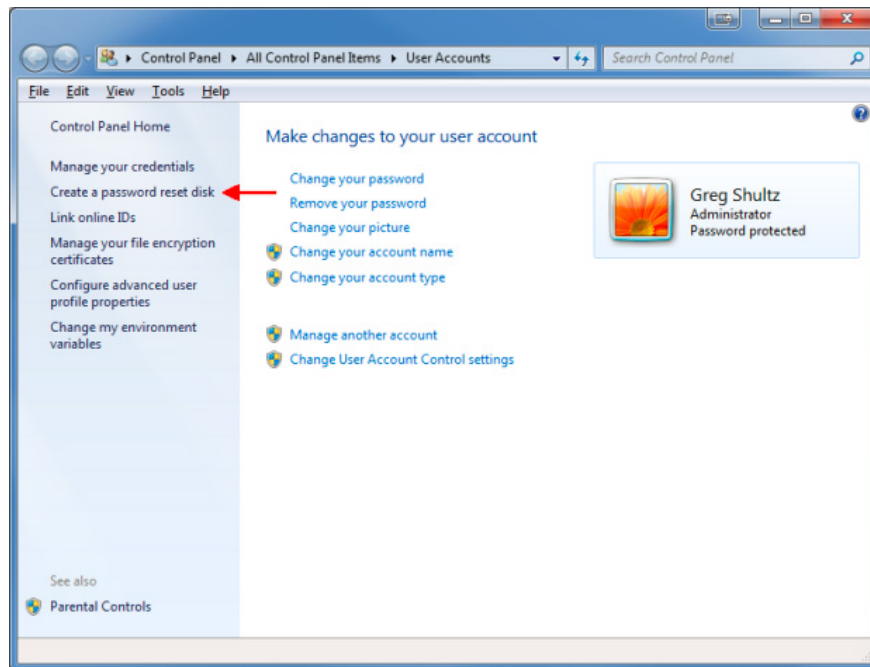


This is a required process when you want to create a Password Reset Disk drive

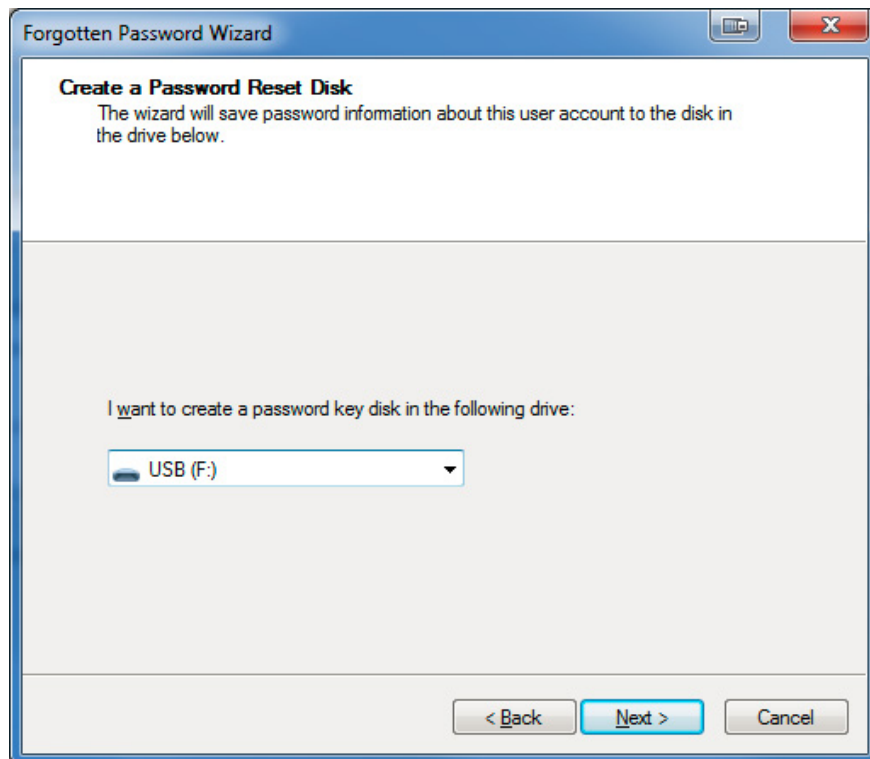
1. Create Password Reset Disk

The steps to creating Password Reset Disk are quite simple.

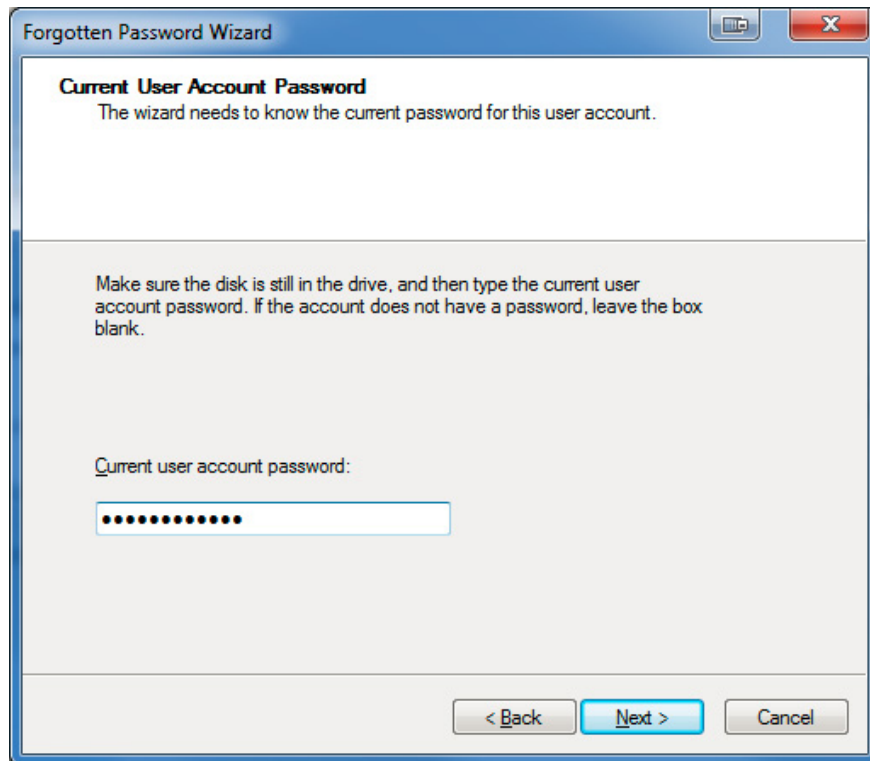
First, open the **User Account** section in the **Control Panel** or go to the **Search Menu** . In the left-hand window, click the **Create a Password Reset Disk** link as shown below:



The **Welcome screen** of the **Forgotten Password Wizard** window appears . Here in section **I want to create a password key disk in the following drive** , select the correct USB drive and then click **Next** .



Next enter the current user account password and then click **Next** :



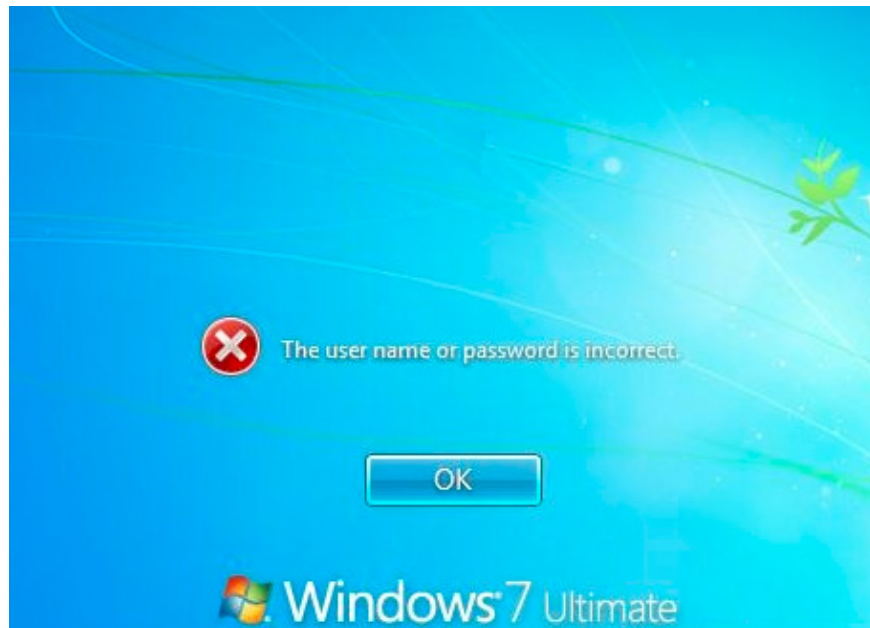
Wait until the process is finished, signal when the progress bar is displayed 100%. Then click **Next** .

On the Forgotten Password Wizard interface, click on **Finish** to finish the process.

Finally, you just need to remove the USB drive from the computer and store it somewhere safe. To avoid confusion, we should mark this **Flash** drive with a specific name, such as **Password Reset** for example.

2. Use Password Reset Disk

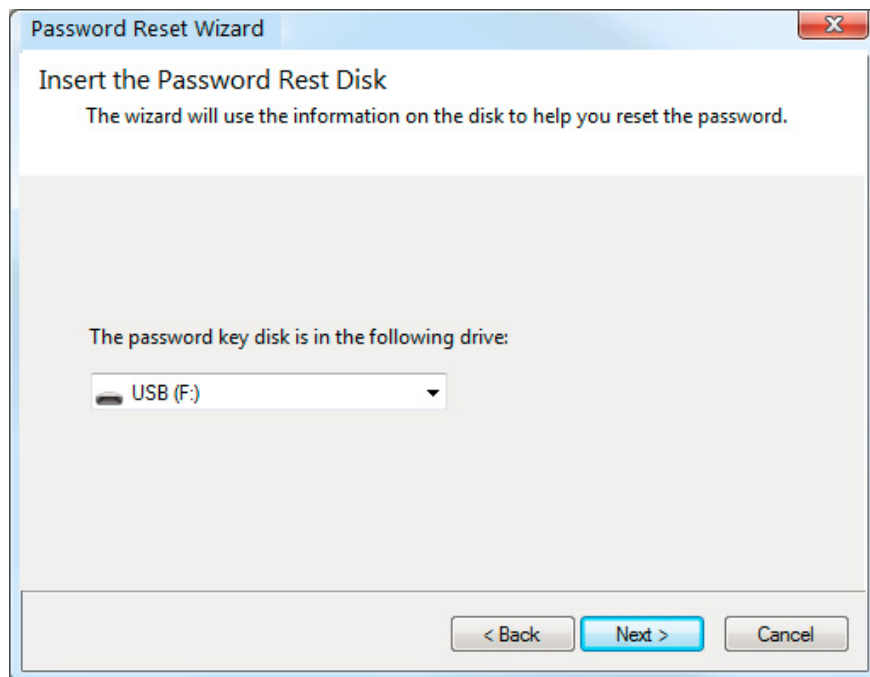
In case if you forget your login password to your computer, **Windows** will display a message like the one below:



After clicking OK, you will return to the initial login screen. Now, plug in the USB drive (created with **Windows Password Reset Disk**) on your computer, then click the **Reset password** link directly below:



Immediately, the familiar **Welcome** screen of **Password Reset Wizard** will appear. Here you select the correct USB drive and select **Next** as shown below:



Then, **Password Reset Wizard** will open the saved file in the **USB** drive, read the information about your previously stored password and perform some other operation (of course in underground mode, we cannot know.). When successful, the system will ask you to enter a new password for this account:



Click **Next**. At this time, the success message appears, here you click **Finish** .

The last step is to log in to your Windows computer with the password you just created.

Note:

After using the **Password Reset Wizard** to change the password, all the information in the USB drive will run out of "valid". You need to use the **Forgotten Password Wizard** process to re-create the **Reset Password** file again.
