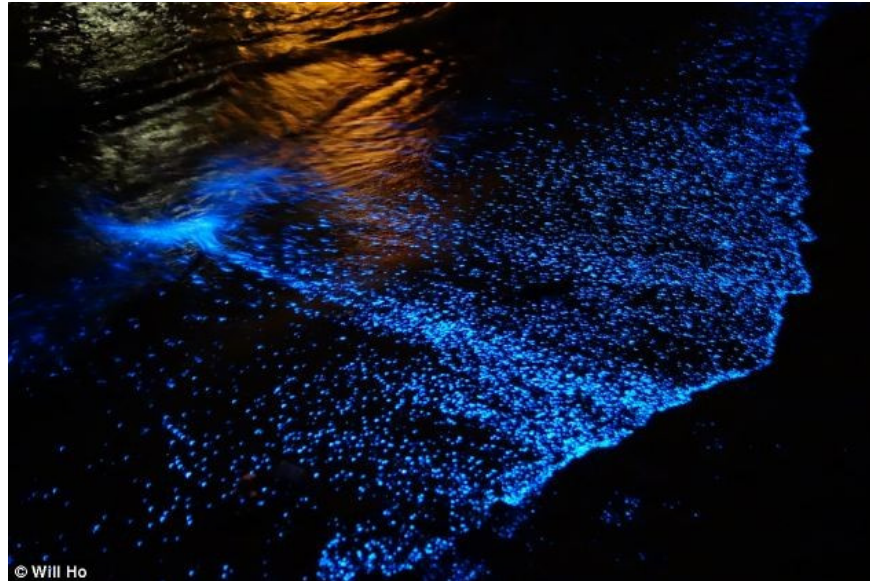
**Nintendo was founded over 120 years ago, in 1889**
