One day, just returning home from the library, the doctor was amazed to see two white mice doing experiments locked in an iron cage in front of a mirror that had died hard ever since. The "killer" mirror continues to "cause a crime".

After dissecting these white mice, he was stunned to see that in his brain they were full of stagnant blood. So, like the 38 previous victims of the mirror, they died of a blood spill. Dr. Waine peeled a few pieces of chips on the wooden frame of the mirror to model the experiment. The results showed that the wooden frame of this "killer" mirror was made **of coura** wood, a very rare timber that has become extinct for over 100 years.

Coura wood contains an extremely toxic substance. When strong natural light shines on, the poison from the wood evaporates to create a poisonous air. If this gas is inhaled, the victim's blood vessels immediately become clogged, cracked and quickly spill blood into the brain and die soon after.
