

Decorate the Mid-Autumn fruit tray with roses, chrysanthemum, water lily made from super beautiful papaya

The Mid-Autumn Festival is coming very close, to help your family's Mid-Autumn Moon tray be more lively and eye-catching, in this article we will show you how to trim the flowers with extremely single papaya. simple. Let's follow it!

1. Trimming beautiful roses from papaya



Prepare

1. A peculiar papaya fruit: cut the head of the fruit to trim the flower
2. A thin and sharp knife
3. 1 brass ice

How to trim as follows:

Step 1:



Use a knife to mark the split points of the full block into 10 equal parts. Then, from the middle of the two points, cut the shell close to the end of the stem. Ignore the middle of the next point and continue cutting the shell close to the next two points. In turn, you will get 5 blue wings to make the petals. The green shell is also sticking in the middle of each wing, you peel it off.

Step 2:



After cutting the basic and necessary wing parts for the flower, the green skin is also sticking in the middle of each wing, you peel off.

Step 3:



In this step we will use scissors to prune the pointed flower wing forward.

Step 4:



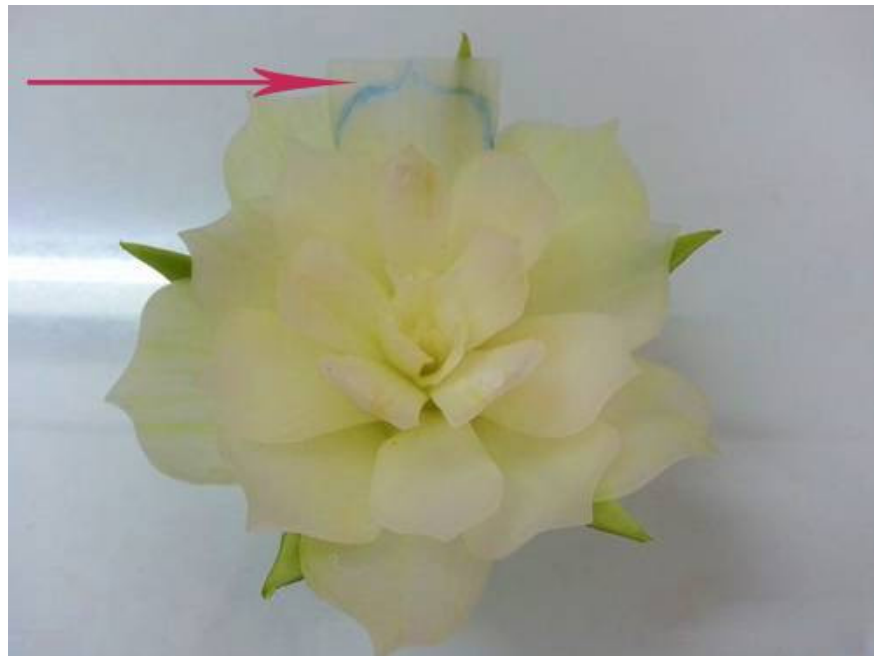
At this point, your papaya is hexagonal. You will use a knife and cut into thin pieces along the sides of the hexagon so that the last part does not leave the papaya.

Step 5:



Continue to cut each wing staggered until each part of the papaya.

Step 6:



Use scissors to cut flowers into petals.

Step 7:



Soak pruned flowers in cold water with ice to harden the petals.



If you want to have more vivid colors for flowers, you can soak the flowers in colored water for about 1 hour.

2. Pruning waterlily



Prepare

1. 1 papaya: choose a smooth, thick, and cut pod
2. A sharp, thin knife
3. 1 brass ice

Making

Step 1:

Cut the papaya into 6 equal petals to make the calyx. Note, the top should be thin but the more you reach the end of the stalk, the more you trim the thicker!

Step 2:

On the 6 cut flower petals, you continue to prune thin petals into the interior. Trimming how these layers staggered against each other.

Step 3:

Use a knife or scissors to trim back the sepals and petals so that the flower becomes more vivid. If you want to make buds, you can use just tying each wing layer from the inside out.

Step 4:

Now use the hand to bend the petals to the outside, then soak in the cold water basin that you have completed the flower gun.

Note , if you want the water lily to look upright like a fresh flower, you should peel the upper part and slightly thick in the lower part when you trim each wing!

3. Trimming chrysanthemum with papaya



Prepare

1. Thin, sharp knives
2. 1 papaya: choose the left-right fruit, cut the head
3. Pull serrated

Making

Step 1:





First cut the papaya in half, then take the part that you want to trim the flower, using a clean cut.

Step 2:



Use a sharp knife to prune the papaya into thin vertical wings of the flower. Just cut a layer and then cut a part of the fruit so that you can stratify for the flower. And staggered like that until the end of the core.

Step 3:



Use a knife to cut away the inner core, then use regular scissors or pull the serrated edges to cut the papaya into small pieces of 0.5 cm width. Keep cutting like that until the end of the wing.

Step 4:



Soak previously cut papaya flowers in a basin of cold water for 10 minutes to make the petals harder. After soaking the cylinder, use a stick or scissors to stroke the flower to have a certain curvature.
