You can use oatmeal to clean stains on your hands by mixing oatmeal with water, applying it to your hands, then rinsing with cold water.

You can use rice to clean the inside of vases or bottles with too small a neck. Pour about three parts warm water into the pitcher, then add a tablespoon of rice. Cover the mouth of the bottle with your hand or screw the cap back on, shake vigorously. Rinse the jar or bottle again after emptying the rice.

Cook green tea and use this tea to soak the rusted items for a few hours, then wipe with a cloth, the rust patches will disappear. Remember to wear gloves when cleaning to prevent rust from sticking to your hands.

Use cornstarch to clean grease stains on carpets

Use cornstarch to clean grease stains on the carpet by putting cornstarch on the grease stains, leave for 15-30 minutes and then use a vacuum cleaner to vacuum the cornstarch.

Use Soda to Brighten the Surface of a Stainless Steel Sink

Use soda to brighten the stainless steel sink. Wipe the surface with a soft cloth moistened with soda, then dry with another clean cloth.

Use hydrogen peroxide to disinfect computer keyboards

Computer keyboards are a breeding ground for germs. You can disinfect a computer keyboard by soaking a cotton ball with hydrogen peroxide, carefully wiping between the keys and the keyboard surface.

Medical alcohol wipes oil stains on wooden floors

With medical alcohol, you can easily clean oil stains on wooden floors. The way to do it is very simple, take a cotton swab soaked in alcohol to wipe it, then wipe it with a dry cloth.

Use glycerin to wipe small candle wax on the table or dishes

Use glycerin to wipe small candle wax on the table or dishes. First, you should pry off the wax layer, then use a soft cloth soaked in Glycerin to wipe the remaining wax until it is clean.
