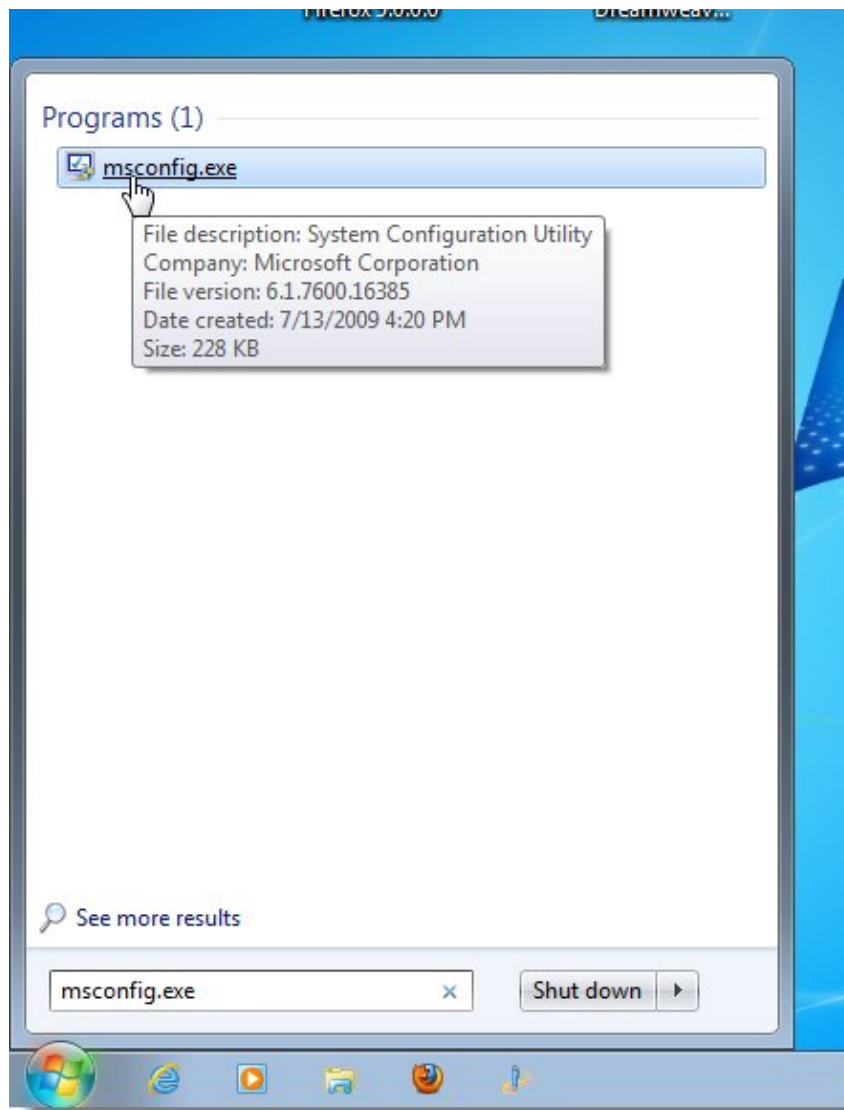
Turn off the system startup program on Windows 7, Vista, XP

Besides a few programs that run with Windows, such as antivirus, firewall software, there are some programs that start with the system, wasting resources and time consuming to start up the computer. A Windows-installed tool called **MSConfig** allows you to quickly and easily see the programs that start up with the system and disable the programs you want to run after booting if needed. This tool is available and available in Windows 7, Vista, and XP.

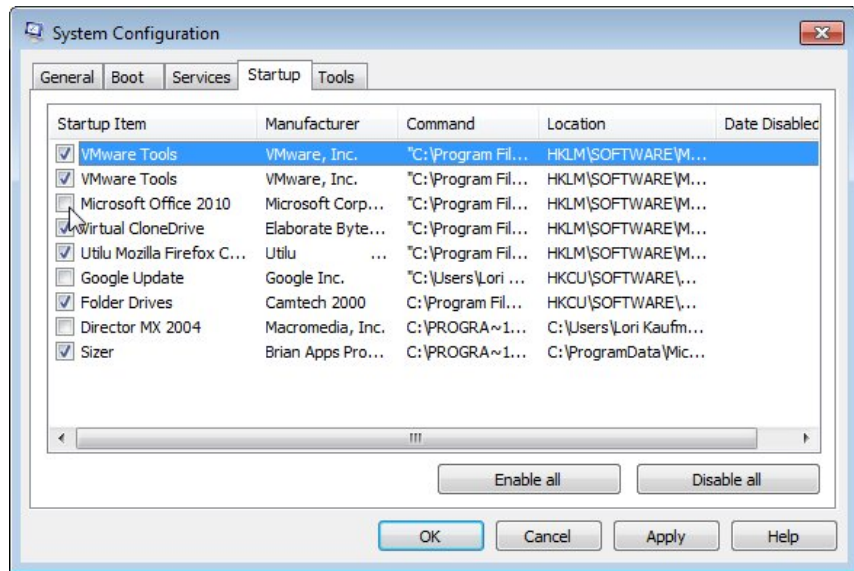
MSConfig has many other functions so be cautious when doing it. If you're not sure how to use it, follow these steps.

To run MSConfig, open the **Start** menu and type **msconfig.exe** in the search bar. When you see msconfig.exe appear, click on it.

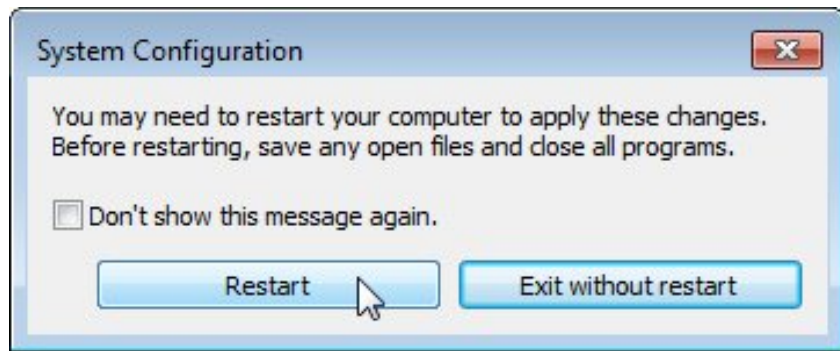
If you use Windows XP, open the **Run** box from the **Start** menu and type *msconfig.exe* in the **Open edit** box and then click **OK**.



Click the **Startup** tab in the **System Configuration** main window . The list of all startup programs is displayed along with the same checkboxes for each program. Uncheck the **checkbox** in front of each program you want to stop starting with the system. Click **OK** when done.

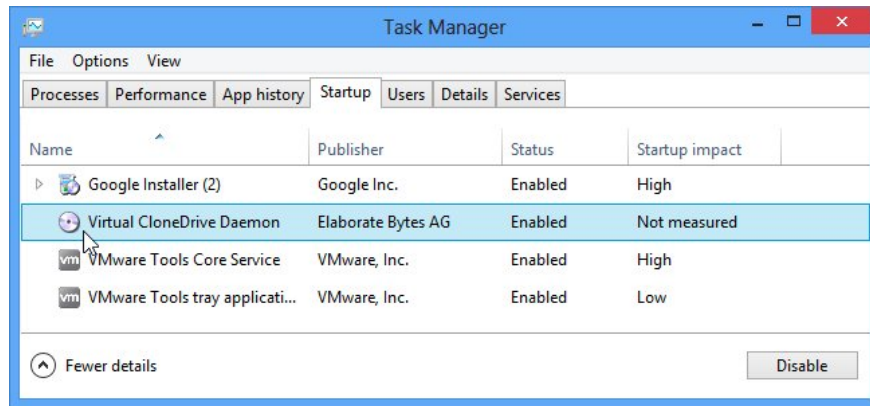


Then, a dialog box appears asking you to restart the computer to apply the change. Click **Restart** to restart the computer immediately. If you are not ready to restart, click **Exit without restart**.



Turn off the program that boots with the system on Windows 8 / 8.1

It's easy to disable startup applications on Windows 8 / 8.1. All you have to do is open **Task Manager** by right-clicking on **Taskbar** or using **Ctrl + Shift + Esc**, click **More Details** and select the **Startup** tab , then use the **Disable** button with the programs that want to disable the startup. same system.



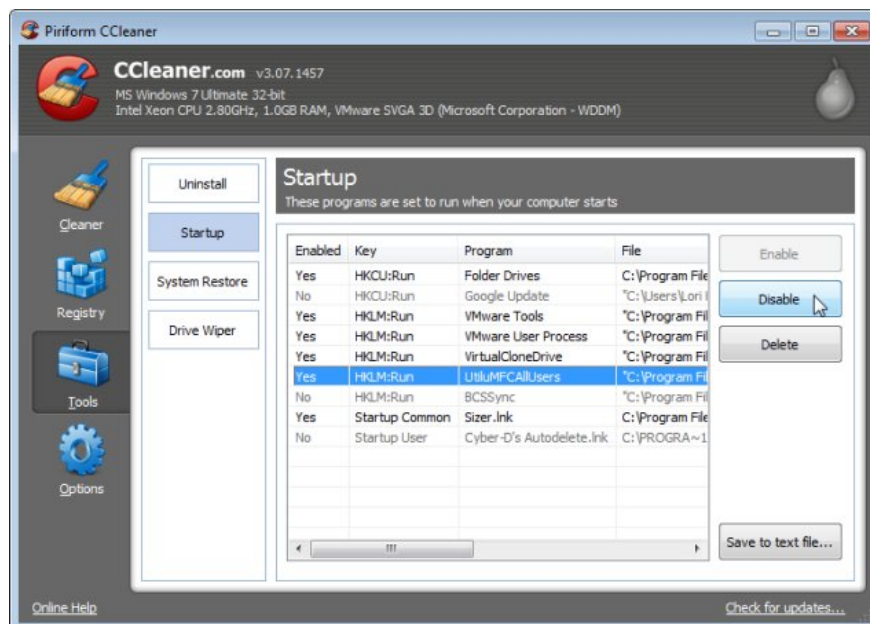
If you don't see the options above, make sure you have selected *More Details* or *Fewer Details* on the screenshot.

Disable programs that start with Windows with CCleaner

If you are lazy to open the settings, you can use CCleaner - the free PC cleaning tool to do this. In CCleaner, click the **Tools** button on the left and click **Startup** to see a list of these programs. In the **Enabled** column, programs that start with the system will have Yes. Just select the program in the list and click **Disable** to disable the program. You can also select a number of other programs that allow booting the system. Please restart the computer even though CCleaner does not prompt you.



Note : that some applications need to be configured to stop automatically starting when the computer starts, or manually add them to the list of startup programs. In this case, there is usually a setting in the program's option to prevent it from starting with Windows.
