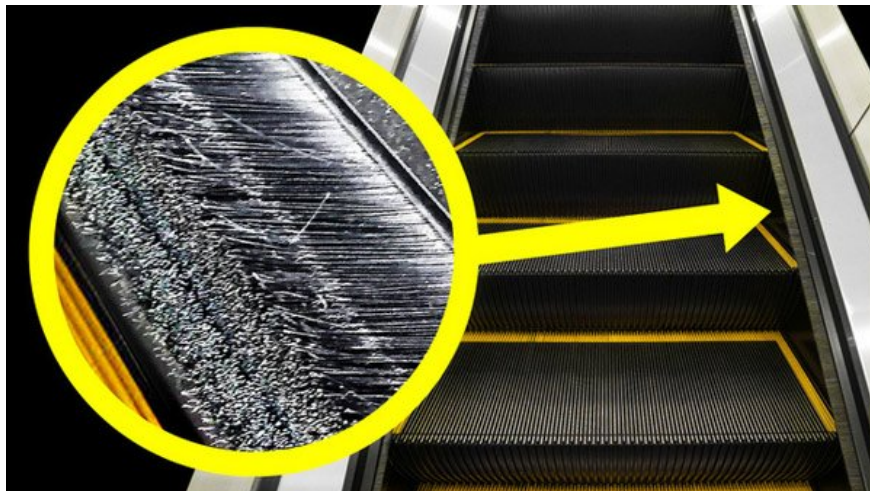


2. Nintendo game box has a bitter taste

3. Brush on the escalator



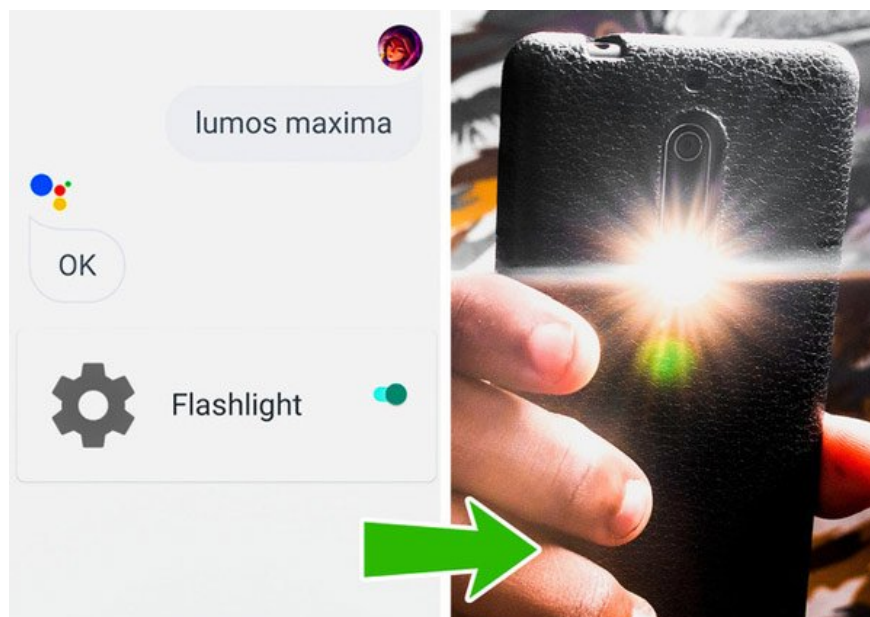

5. Google Assistant can be controlled with spells



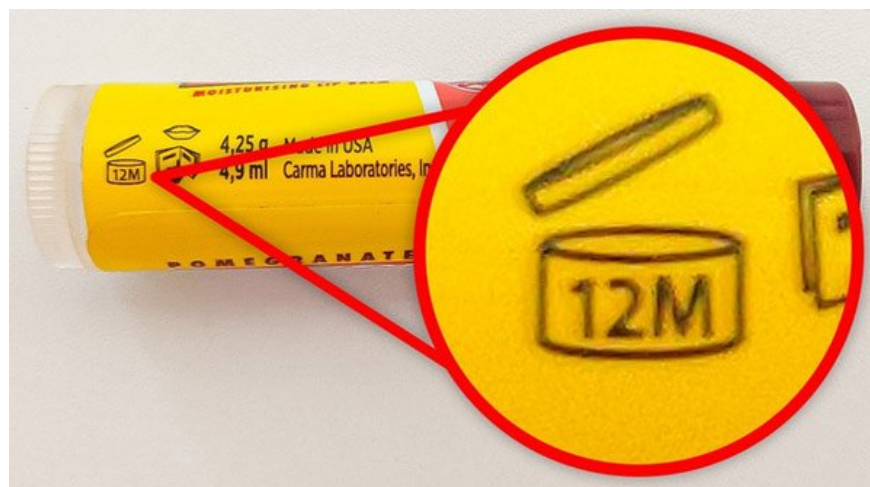

6. The colorful circles on the bottom of the chip bag



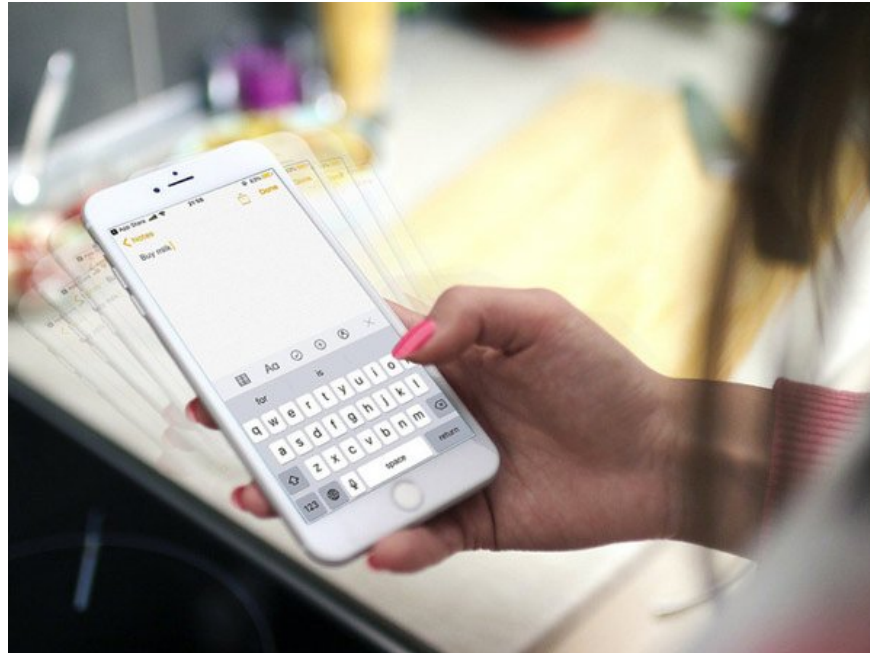
These mysterious circles, called printer blocks, help the product packaging cutter know the exact location to cut. Manufacturers also rely on them to know if everything is printed correctly.

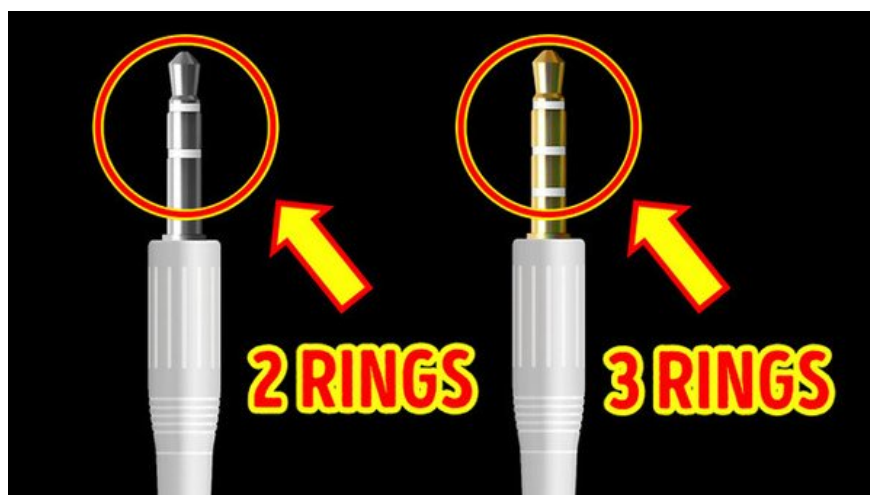
8. Shake to undo the action on iPhone
