

Disney Twisted-Wonderland Tips

Disney Twisted-Wonderland is the mobile otome game that has made waves in Japan, now available in English.

Imagine if Hogwarts was founded by classic Disney villains and perfect, self-centered anime boys, this game is just that. New players will begin their journey at Night Raven University.

Most of the gameplay revolves around leveling up students to make them stronger in magic combat. There is also a rhythm minigame with some cool music. This article will provide gamers with useful tips when playing the main part and mini game Disney Twisted-Wonderland.

Tips to know when playing Disney Twisted-Wonderland

Don't worry too much about the opening

When playing Disney Twisted-Wonderland for the first time, players will be prompted to choose one of the 7 Great Seven - the classic Disney villains who embody the Night Raven College. This choice is not really important, and is only intended to direct players to characters of particular interest.



Even so, everyone should still take the time to read the descriptions of each villain and their home, but when it comes to choosing a student to befriend, the player is free to choose, regardless of their prior decisions.

Choose the student you like best and get them in the free starter party, after using Dark Mirror for the first time. Even if they change their mind later, people can always buy the regular version of a character they want using Thaumarks, the game's free currency.

Using Cosmic magic

If you've played mobile RPGs before, you're probably familiar with elemental weaknesses; Fire (red) defeats Grass (green), Grass defeats Water (blue) and Water beats Fire again.

The same principle holds true in Disney Twisted-Wonderland, so defeating enemies is easiest if the player has access to spells to exploit their weaknesses.



Most Japanese mobile RPGs also have a Light/Dark duality - light enemies are weak to Shadow damage and vice versa. Disney Twisted-Wonderland does not have this element; instead, non-elemental or Cosmic damage doesn't have any weaknesses or resistances.

While it's always better to take advantage of elemental weaknesses where possible, Cosmic spells deal a lot of damage on their own without risking a bad match. If the enemy has access to multiple elements, use Cosmic magic to ensure a worst-case scenario.

Pay attention to Buddy Bonus

Characters that get along will give each other a Buddy Bonus when deployed together in battle. If two characters are selected for a round with a Buddy Bonus, one or both will gain a stat boost. The increase itself depends on each character and their shared friend level. Find out which team members can motivate each other, and try to deploy them together whenever possible.



Characters can increase Buddy Level by participating in the Alchemy Class together, but the students available to Alchemy will change every day in the real world. Remember to check if any teammates use Alchemy every

day when logging in. Then consider spending time strengthening their relationship with their allies.

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
