When using public wifi at the airport, users should not perform banking transactions, use email or click on strange pop ups.



### **3. Limit the use of credit cards or transactions involving personal information at the airport**

Traces of your personal information will be saved when you use credit cards, bank cards, even write checks or scan QR codes. Criminals will take advantage of the victim's loophole to steal personal information. Therefore, to ensure safety, you should use cash at airports and public places.

### **4. Check whether the computer, the phone has Bluetooth turned on automatically**

Hackers can also take advantage of Bluetooth to steal your personal information. Now there are many sophisticated devices that can control your personal device to automatically turn on Bluetooth and transfer data to other devices easily.

Therefore, you should check whether Bluetooth is turned off and restrict its use in public areas such as airports.



Air ticket stubs or luggage information paper . contain a lot of your information, so be careful.

### **5. Consider carefully before disclosing personal information to any party, including information on luggage**

At the gate or airport, the information declaration is unavoidable. However, you also need to pay attention to only disclose personal information when absolutely necessary and when requested by employees.
