Score extra points if you adapt quickly when plans change, someone cancels at the last minute, your flight gets delayed, but you stay calm and find a plan B. Adaptability is more important than your destination.

Productivity Thinking Assessment

Working while traveling requires a high level of concentration. Points if you enjoy creating systems and routines or if a systematic email and travel folder is your thing. Bonus points if you stick to them without anyone looking over your shoulder. Discipline is essential when you're stuck in your gorgeous beachfront apartment.

Bonus points if you work best alone. The most successful nomads are self-motivated. They don't need a boss or manager. They know how to create their perfect goal and then make it happen.

Check out the minimalist potential

Living with minimal belongings can open the door to more adventures. Score one point if you can fit everything you need to survive into a few suitcases. Score another if you never miss the things you leave behind. True digital nomads need almost nothing to feel fulfilled. Plus, you can always take advantage of replacements in your new city.

Get 1 point if you find paying for experiences better than buying new stuff. Or if you prefer a room free of clutter. Great digital nomads know that happiness comes from seeing new places, not from owning new products they don't really need.

See work availability anywhere

All you need is a laptop and a WiFi connection and you have millions of possible offices. Score points if you find this idea appealing. You'll see potential workspaces everywhere you go. A hotel lobby, a coffee shop, a random restaurant. Bonus points if you've experimented with different setups and figured out which one helps you focus best.

Bonus points if poor WiFi or tech issues never get in the way of your focus. Digital nomads need to have a backup plan for their travels. The best ones can stay productive no matter what, with mobile hotspots and offline options set up.

Check connection style

Strong relationships can overcome any distance. Points if you stay in touch with friends across time zones or if your preferred method of communication is asynchronous. Bonus points if you connect easily in new places (saying hello without thinking first).

Bonus points if you can build genuine friendships quickly. Digital nomads create their own communities wherever they go. The best ones stay close to old friends while making new ones.

View results

Now add up your scores. A score of 0 to 5 means that office life is probably more your thing. You may need more structure, dislike change, or be too conservative to succeed. A score of 6 to 10 suggests that you can handle some travel but need a stable home office.

Between 11 and 15, you're ready to become a true digital nomad. Every digital nomad starts exactly where you are now. They choose freedom over familiarity and never look back.
