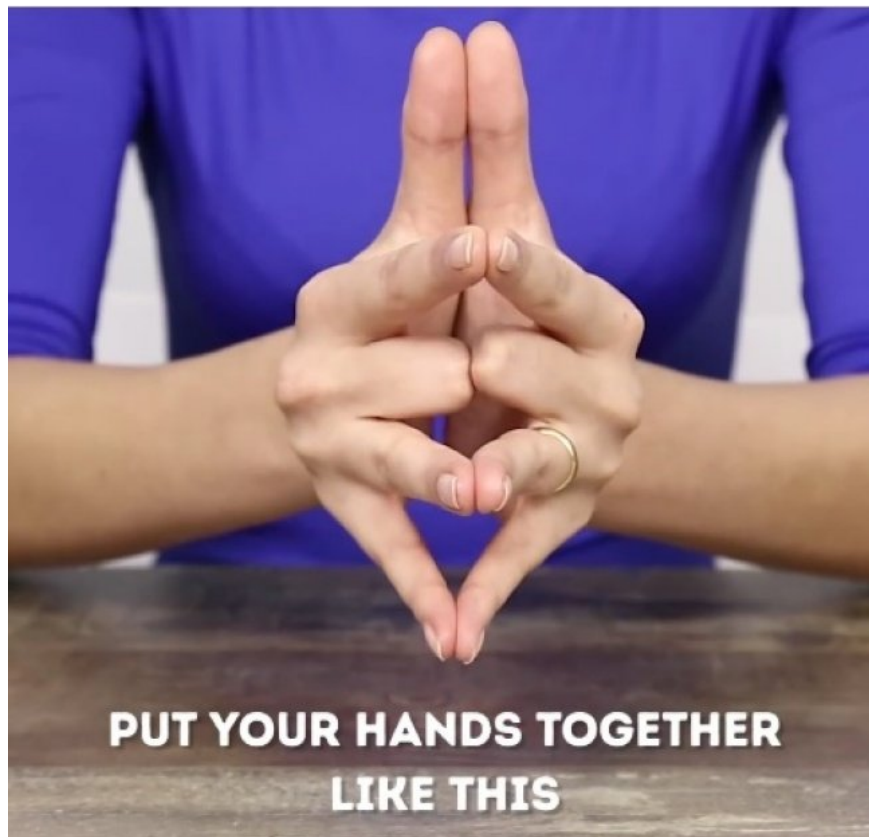


# Do you know why wedding rings are always worn on the ring finger?

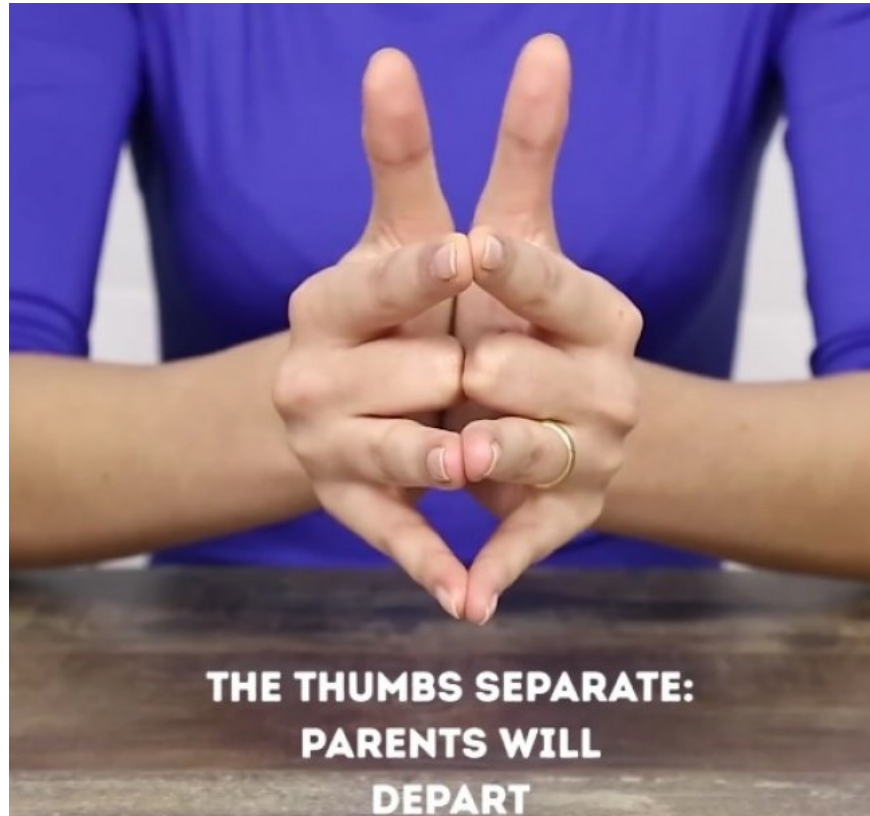


**First, put your hands together like this:**

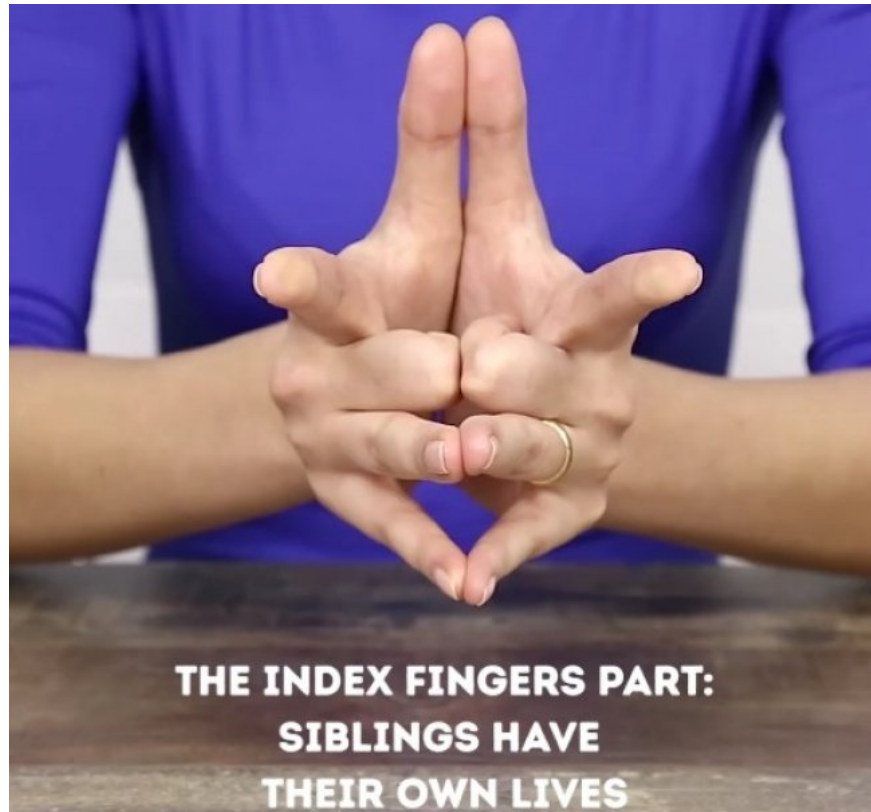
1. Thumb is your parents.

5. The little finger is your children.

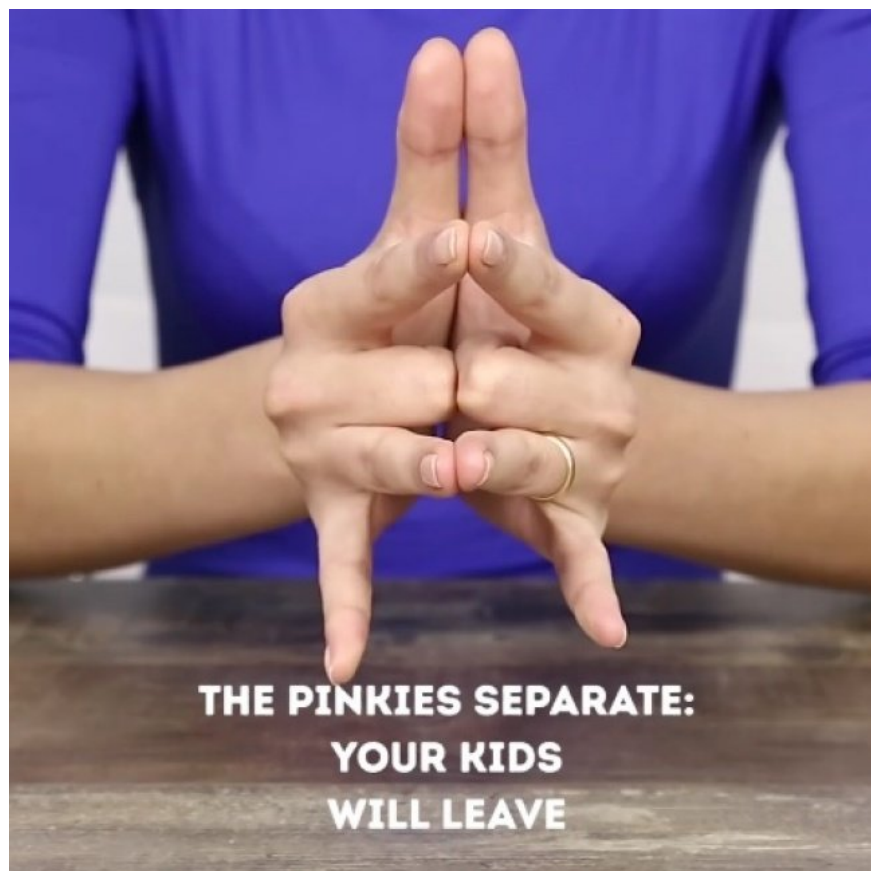
**Let's do it again with us again:**



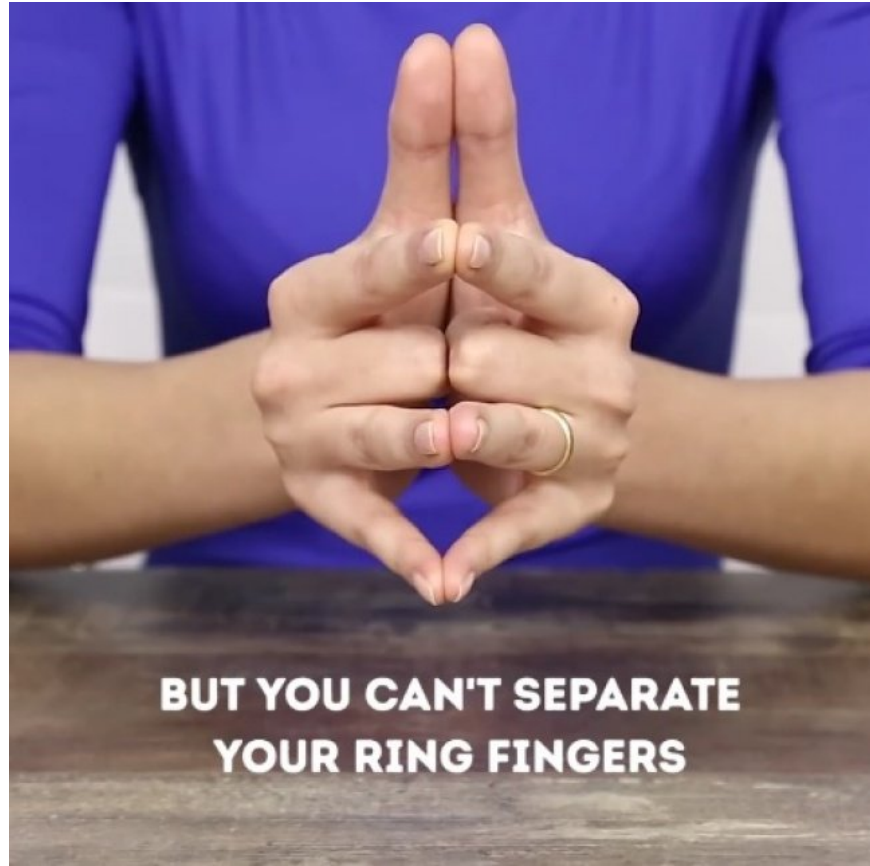
**The thumb is separate:** your parents and you will be able to separate when you grow up.
