## Does condom have shelf life?

Today's condoms are usually made from latex, polyurethane, or lambskin leather. Each material has different properties, but generally they are materials that do not exist forever.

That is also the reason for you to understand that condoms, as well as many other things, they have the same shelf life as normal.

## How long is a condom?

The current shelf life of condoms is about 4-5 years, some premium lines can last up to 6 years (from the date of manufacture and packaging of products).

Some examples of shelf life of condoms are as follows:

1. Shelf life of Sagami condoms is usually about 4 years, high-end types such as Sagami Original 0.02 or 0.01 are about 5 years.
2. Durex condoms usually have a shelf life of about 5 years.
3. Sumo condoms have a shelf life of 5 years
4. The shelf life of Longsock seahorse condoms is about 5 years
5. Condom Feel has a shelf life of about 4 years
6. Shelf life of PowerMen condom is 5 years
7. Shelf life of Japanese Strong Men's bag is 5 years .

## Instructions on how to view the shelf life of a condom

Normally, the shelf life of a condom will be recorded outside the box to help consumers easily observe before deciding to buy and use. You can view it at the back, or the bottom of each bag so you can know exactly when it will last.

In addition, some firms also write the expiry date on each package. Even if you lose the case, you can still observe the expiry date easily and accurately.



Depending on the manufacturer, the expiry date is filled with all information such as: Production date (MFG), expiry date (Exp) and Lot number. Or there are companies that only have the expiry date (Exp) and Lot number. The Lot number here is understood as how much product it is and which year it was produced.

**Eg:**

1. On the packaging with the words: Lot132817 means this is the 1328th product and was produced in 2017.
2. On Durex condom packaging, there is EXP2019-05, which means the expiry date until May 2019.

## **Is using a expired condom dangerous?**

It is no coincidence that condoms have shelf-life because it is the ideal time, the most reasonable for the product to be able to keep the original quality.

No matter how well-preserved and carefully packed, the material of condoms will decrease significantly over time due to environmental impacts. The bags will gradually lose their elasticity, elasticity and pressure resistance. Lubricating gels in condoms will also be dry or diminish the smooth smoothness inherent, while other ingredients are also at risk of change.

If using a condom expires, you may face some of the following situations:

1. The tear rate will be many times higher. Because the texture of the material is no longer good, the bag will be able to appear many tiny dots that cannot be observed with the naked eye. This will lead to the ability of sperm to leak out to cause unwanted pregnancy or accidental infection with some other sexual diseases.
2. The elasticity and elasticity of the bag will certainly be affected, so it will severely reduce orgasm and the stimulating ability of both.
3. Modification of the components of condoms may increase the risk of allergies, rashes .

## **Note that some cases of condoms are still valid but should not be used**

You may be quite surprised, but in some situations, even if the condom you buy is still very long shelf life, do not regret what they do. That is when:

1. Improper condom storage. For example, condoms have a shelf life of 5 years, however, due to many environmental factors, the way of preserving substandard containers is likely to be metamorphosed. In this case, the best advice for you is to throw them right in the trash.
2. Regularly put condoms in high temperature, in trunk or purse . Do you know, just contact with the environment with high temperature for about 30 minutes, the condom is considered to be gone. ?
3. The shell is collapsed, there is lubricant flowing out, of course, even if you still have a limited use, you should not be hungry to use them.
4. Colors change, there are scratches . in this case you should not continue to use that bag anymore.
