Step 1: Open the security warning

When someone signs in to your account from any device, you will receive notifications about the time, place and device that your Facebook account has just logged in. To open this feature, go to **Settings > Security > Login Alerts** . Here, you will have 2 options, **Notifications** and **Email** .

Step 2: Turn on login review

This feature will ask you to enter an authentication code every time you log in to your Facebook account from another browser. To enable this feature, go to **Settings > Security > Login Approvals** and check the **Require a security code to access my account from unknown browsers**.

Code Generator	Use your Facebook app to get security codes when you need them.
App Passwords	Use special passwords to log into your apps instead of using your Facebook pass Approvals codes.

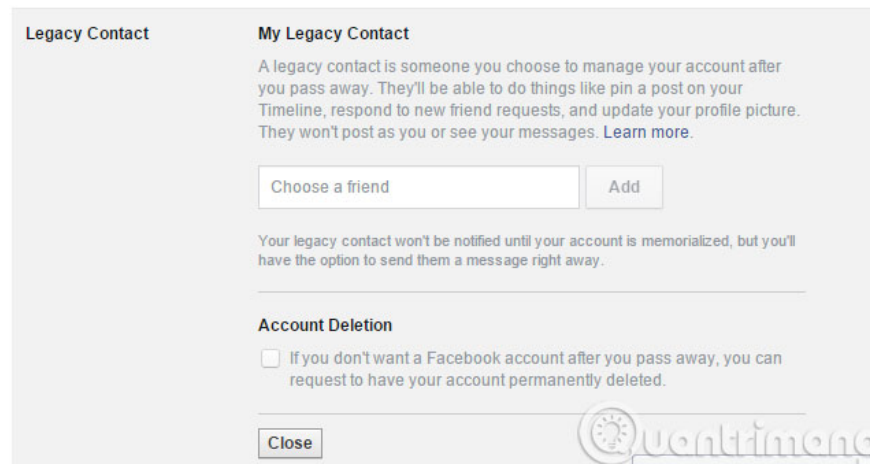
Step 3: Use trusted contacts

This feature will help you restore your Facebook account through confirmation from friends that you have previously trusted in case your account is stolen.

Public Key	Manage an OpenPGP key on your Facebook profile and enable encrypted notifications
Trusted Contacts	Trusted contacts are friends that can securely help you if you ever have trouble accessing your account. You haven't chosen any trusted contacts yet. Choose trusted contacts.
	Close
Your Browsers and Apps	Review which browsers you saved as ones you often use.
Where You're Logged In	Review and manage where you're currently logged into Facebook

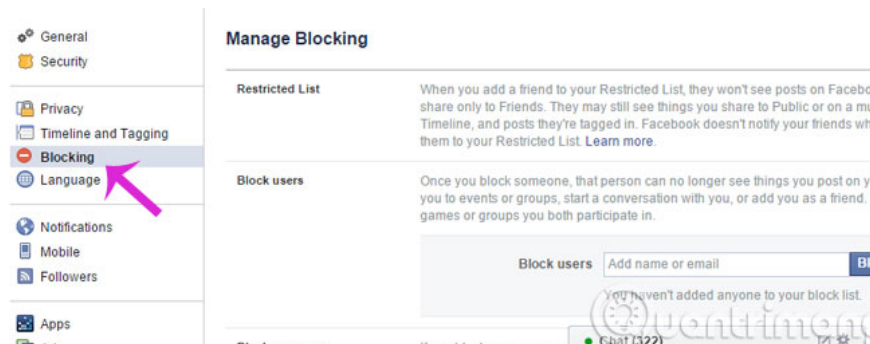
Step 4: Add inheritance contact

This is a far-away feature when you accidentally die . the person who inherits your account will be able to pin the article to your personal page, reply to friend requests and update photos represent you.



Step 5: Manage blocking

For a long time, you have felt very "inhibited" with invitations to use apps and games, go to the **Blocking** menu. Here, you can customize blocking unwanted things.
