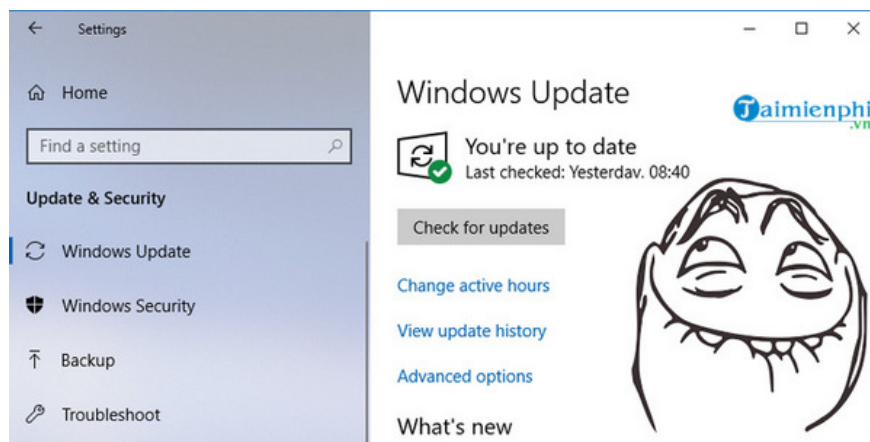


Errors encountered when updating Windows 10 May 2019

Microsoft has just released the Windows 10 May 2019 update (v1903) for all users, including a host of new features and changes. However, like other updates, users may encounter some errors during the Windows 10 May 2019 update process. This article from TipsMake will guide you on how to fix these errors when updating Windows 10 May 2019.

In addition to releasing **Windows 10 May 2019** to all users, Microsoft also announced a list of bugs and issues encountered during the Windows 10 May 2019 (v1903) and Windows Server 1903 update, including user interface issues and other problems such as driver incompatibility errors.

Errors encountered when updating Windows 10 May 2019

Known issues and bugs in the Windows 10 May 2019 update include: screen brightness adjustment not working, Camera app not working, Wi-Fi not working, audio not working with Dolby Atmos headphones, AMD RAID driver errors, Night Light settings not working, and file copying issues in the user profile folder.

The Windows 10 May 2019 update adds a host of new features and improvements, including an improved Start Menu, Light Theme, and a new, enhanced Edge browser based on Chromium.

In addition to some of the new features that TipsMake just mentioned above, Microsoft also removed some features and applications in the new Windows 10 May 2019 update, including the Print 3D application, which has been replaced by 3D Builder, and Windows To Go is no longer supported.

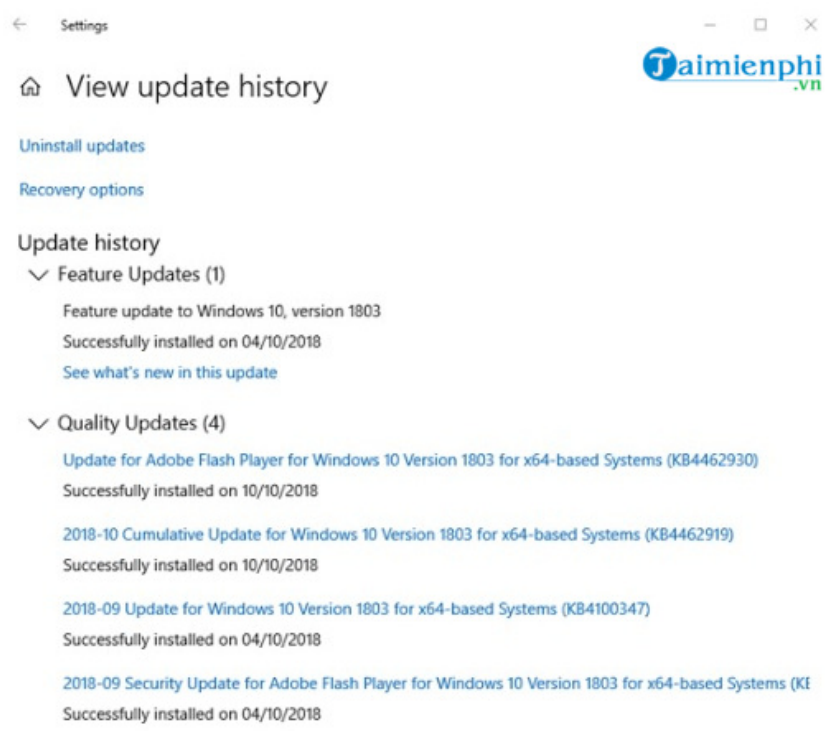

Microsoft has released patch KB4505057, fixing all the issues and bugs in the Windows 10 May 2019 update mentioned above. Users are advised to install the patch as soon as possible.

Fixes for errors during the Windows 10 May 2019 update

Method 1: Check your Windows 10 build.

Before considering downgrading to a previous version of Windows 10 to fix errors during the Windows 10 May 2019 update, the first step is to check which Windows 10 build you are currently using. To do this, go to "**Settings => Update & Security => View update history**".



In the next window that appears on the screen, click the arrow icon next to "Feature Updates" to see the version of Windows you are using, then click "Quality Updates" to see all the small KB updates you have installed.

Method 2: Block and delay Windows 10 updates

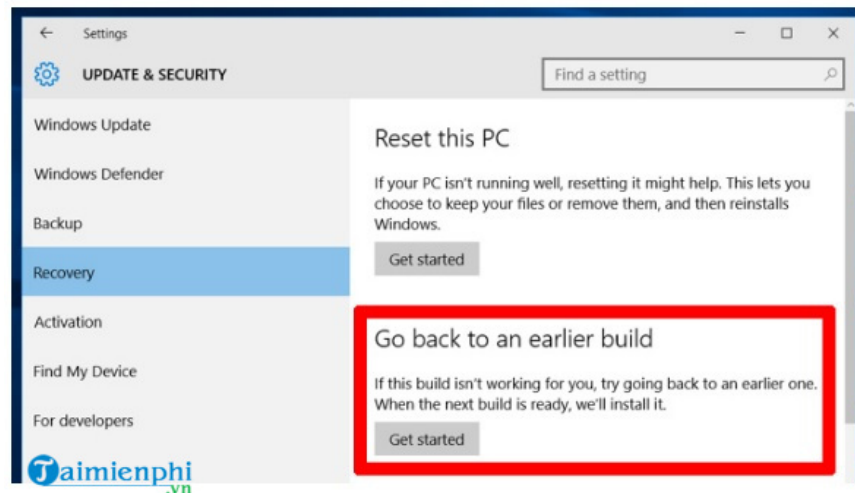
Additionally, to avoid encountering the aforementioned issues and errors when updating Windows 10 May 2019, another solution is to block and delay Windows 10 updates. This way, you won't receive updates immediately upon Microsoft's release, but will wait until the final stable version is available and update manually.

According to some Windows Insider users, the upcoming Windows 10 update will allow all Windows users (including Home users) to defer or pause the latest updates for up to 7 days.

In the meantime, if you're using Windows 10 Pro, Enterprise, Education, or Windows 10 S, you can defer updates by going to **Settings => Update & Security => Windows Update** . Here, select the "Choose when updates are installed" option and choose the number of days you want to defer updates.

Method 3: Downgrade to a previous version of Windows 10.

After each major update, Windows 10 gives users 10 days to downgrade to a previous version. If you don't want to experience the bugs in the Windows 10 May 2019 update, you can downgrade to a more stable previous version of Windows 10.



To do this, go to Windows 10 Settings, then click **Update & security => Recovery** . Under Reset this PC, you will see the option Go back to the previous version of Windows 10. Click Get Started, then follow the on-screen instructions to downgrade to a previous, more stable version of Windows 10.

Note: The option to downgrade to a previous version of Windows 10 is only available for 10 days.
