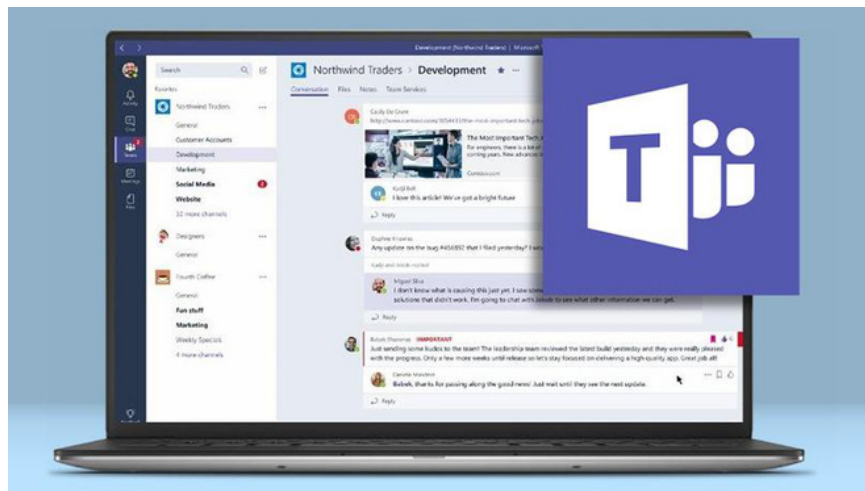

"



Therefore, security company Kaspersky also offers some advice for businesses and individual users to protect themselves during work and online learning, including:

- Use VPN (own virtual code) to connect between employees and the company. Currently, there are many different VPN services such as Nord VPN, PIA (Private Internet Access), Express VPN, all with free trial option before users decide to use the session. full version.

- The devices used (smartphones, tablets, laptops) must have certain security methods, can wipe data remotely in the event of an attack or theft. Limit the installation of many non-work-related applications.



- Upgrade the latest version of the meeting software as well as the operating system, there are usually patches to limit being attacked. Restrict access to online meetings, including only necessary personnel (such as setting a meeting room password).

- When using a new online meeting software, you should carefully read the terms of privacy, especially about the recording and recording of the meeting whether it is encrypted or not. Use a one-time authentication (SSO) mechanism to let the company's executive team know the login information.
