

Eyes round eyes were flat because of the sculptural art of living gods

American painter Cathy Sheeter has elevated the art of painting to a new level without the need for pen and paper. Invite you to admire the sculpture of life as lifelike!

Many people after viewing the pictures below affirm that it is a picture taken with a modern camera. However, they are the hand-drawn drawings of a female painter painting artist from Colorado, USA - Ms. Cathy Sheeter.

American painter **Cathy Sheeter** works in an amazing Scratchboard environment, which brings pets and wildlife into surrealistic ways that no other means can do.

Scratchboard is a new technique that artists use knives or other tools to engrave on a white Chinese clay sheet. This clay sheet is thin and covered with Indian black ink. In addition, Scratchboard can do with many different colored clay, but this requires artists to put more pressure on the tools and have higher techniques.

Each of the smallest lines is portrayed by female artist Cathy Sheeter. After she completed the black and white version, she began to color. Cathy Sheeter uses a number of engraving tools including pruning knives, sandpaper, glass fiber brushes, and even tattoo needles. These tools are very neat to sharpen, especially when drawing small details like feathers.

The more you brush, the brighter the spot. That is how Cathy creates the dark light for her drawings. After more than 20 years of pursuit, but the painter Cathy Sheeter has always devoted her love to the carving art and her spiritual children. Small works often take hours to refine, while large works sometimes take months to complete.

Cathy Sheeter said, with this material, she can sketch every little detail, thereby making the character's charisma. **Invite you to admire the art of sculpture of the goddess living like this in this article!**

"Loyalty" - Art of Scratchboard. The eyes are filled with colored ink.



Cathy Sheeter used the back corner of the X-acto craft to slowly scratch the black ink to reveal the white clay underneath.



The more the artist scratched, the brighter the painting became. Cathy has to use 4 to 10 blades for each work, only sharp blades can work well.

Step by step complete the "The Interrupted Drink"



The first step Cathy created a layout in photoshop, then sketched on white paper the same size as the scratchboard. Next, Cathy moved the sketch drawing down to the board with white transfer paper, giving a "line

copy " to scratch.

In this work, Cathy scratches her way, sometimes looking through the drawing board. After scratching completely with black and white colors covered with transparent ink with a palm tree. Scratched inks do not affect the black in the back.

When the color is applied to Cathy, it may scratch again and it may become white again. This allows multiple layers of scratching and color. After the work is completed, they are smoothed with a storage layer to avoid scratches and even store all tones.
