

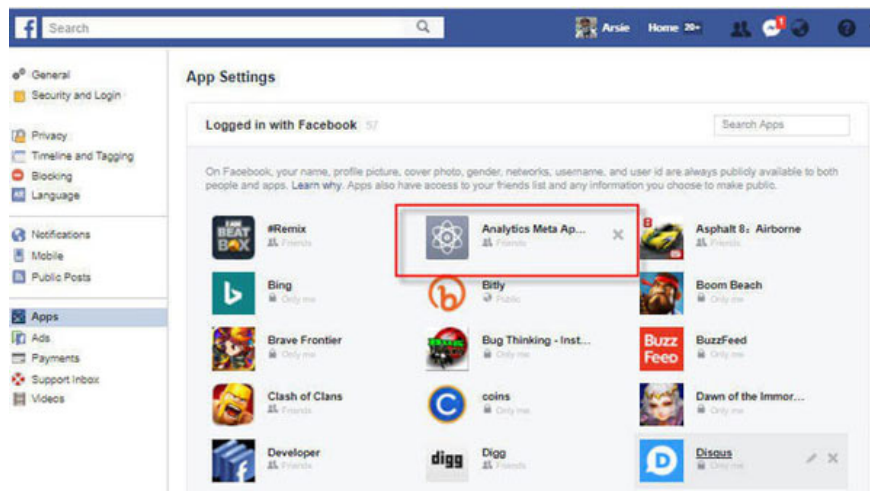
Facebook has a serious bug again, causing personal photos of 6.8 million users to be shared for 1,500 applications

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Currently, there are many applications that require users to register for an account or log in via Facebook to access. This means, if you agree that the user has allowed the application to access your public image.

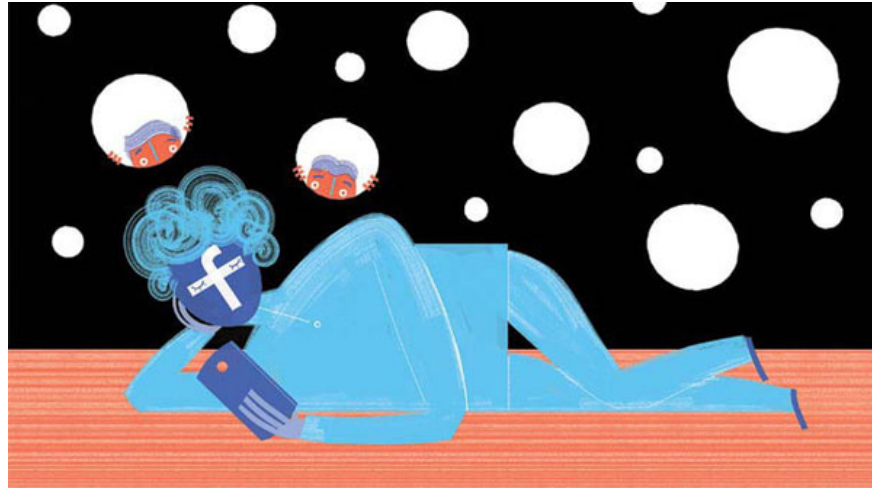
But with the new system hole on Facebook, these apps can access the photos that users have to use in private mode, the photos have been posted but not shared with friends, even the photos posted on Stories.

According to Facebook, at least 6.8 million users are affected by the new vulnerability, 1500 applications from 876 different developers have access to their private images.

This error exists on Facebook's system from September 13 to September 25, 2018. That means more than 3 months ago, Facebook has discovered and patched this but did not give any immediate notice.

When publicly announcing the error on December 14, Facebook apologized "for letting this happen" and said it would work with developers to delete photos of affected users. .
