

Fix Android Auto not connecting to car

Android Auto is broken, not connecting to the car, the cause may come from the software, USB cable or phone configuration. This article guides you through a quick fix, helping the application work stably again.

Are you having trouble with Android Auto not working? Not recognizing your phone, freezing, or losing connection? Here's a quick fix.

Fix Android Auto not working

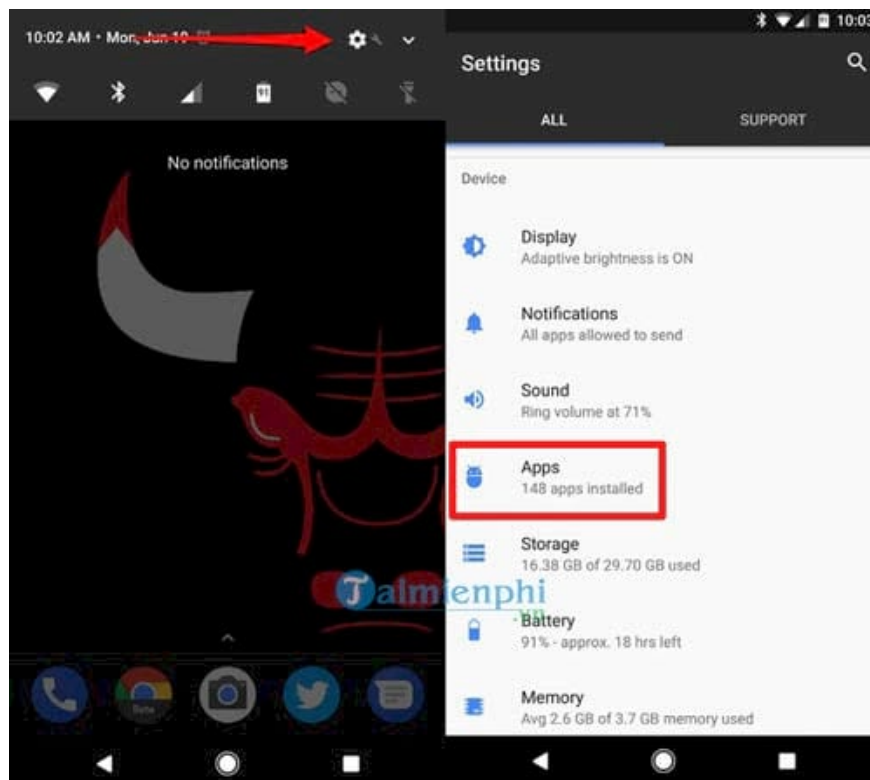
1. Check connection

Please check carefully if the bluetooth connection between your device and the car is turned on or not, besides using bluetooth, there is also the possibility that there is a problem with the connection cable.

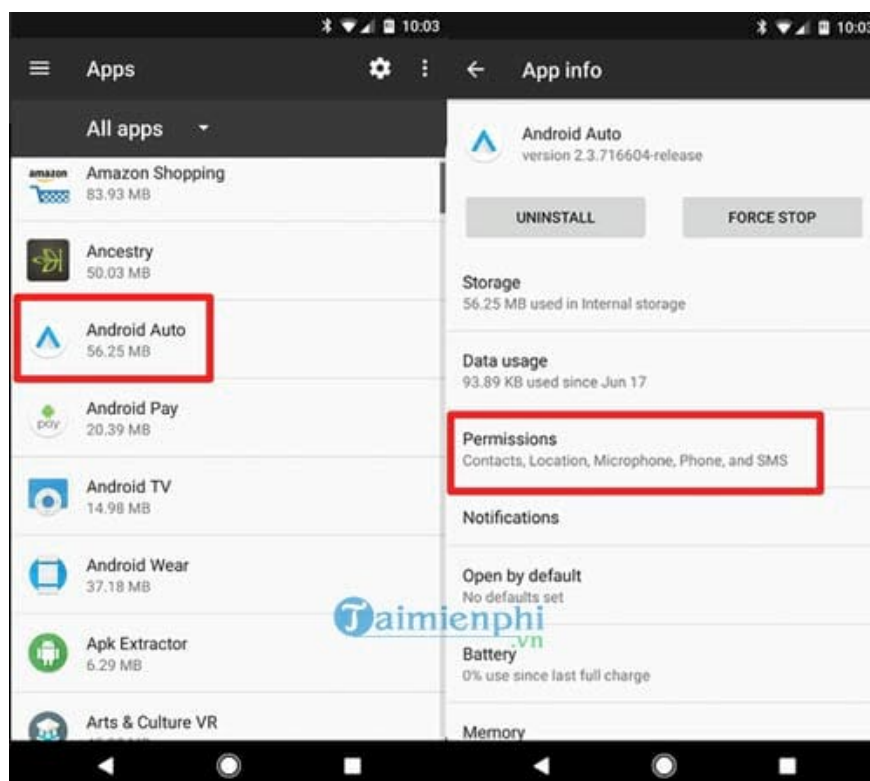
2. Check access rights

On Android versions 5.0.1 and above, users are much more protected, some applications need user consent to run and fully utilize their features. Try checking if Android Auto is blocked from accessing any part, this is also a cause of the error.

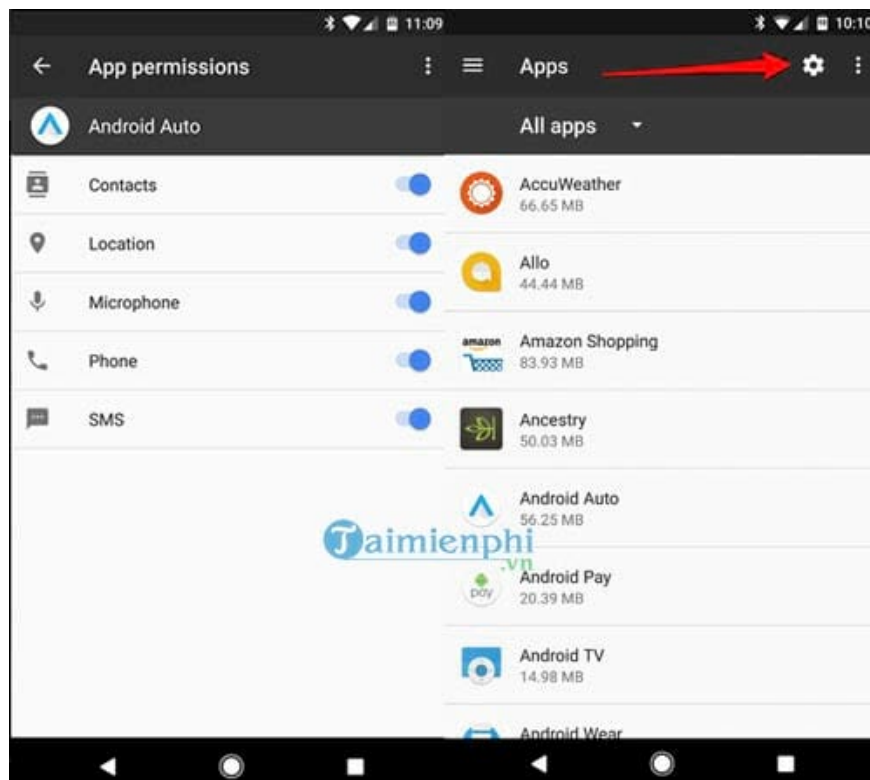
Step 1: First, go to **Settings** > **Apps** to search for Android Auto in the list of applications.



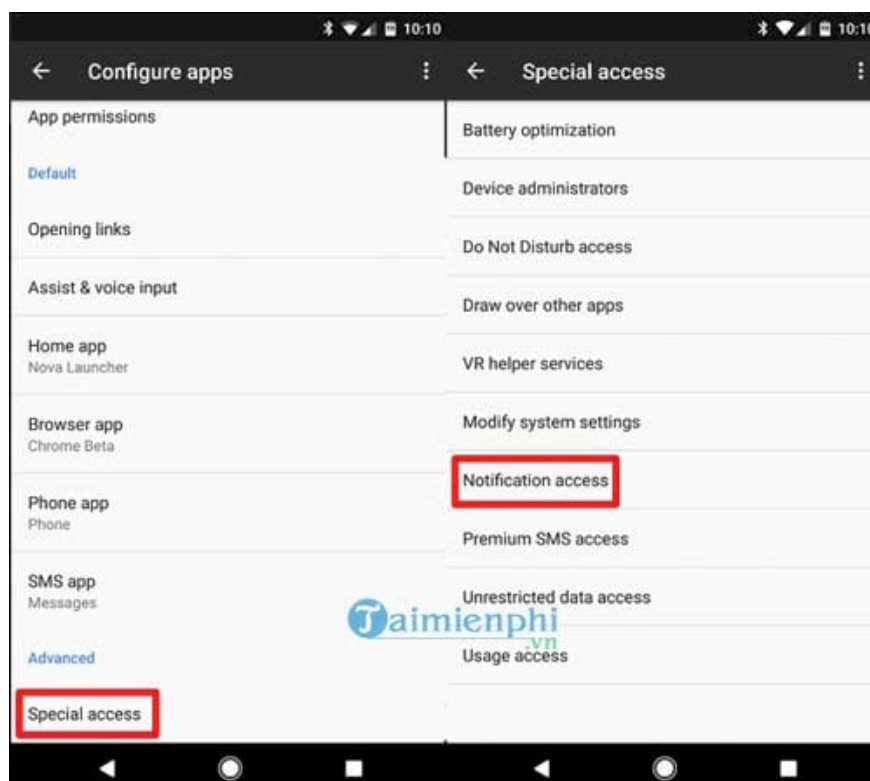
Step 2: Then you find the **Android Auto** application and click on it, then select the **Permissions** section to see if any access rights are lost.



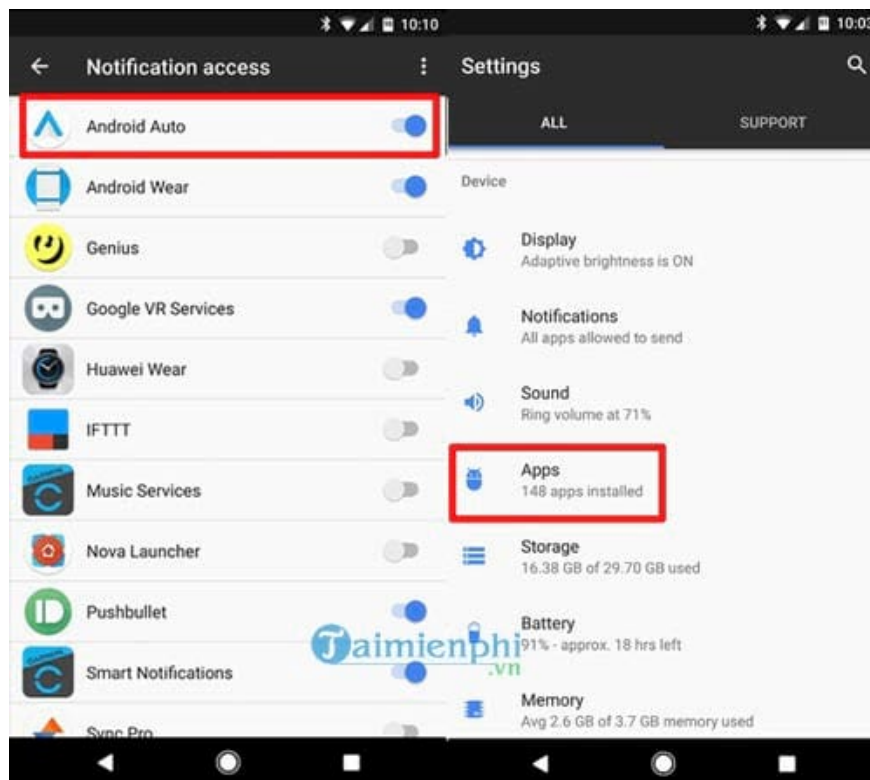
Step 3: Here you enable all the permissions that Android Auto may need, then go to Settings , we need to consider special permissions for Android Auto.



Step 4: In the **Configure apps** section (Other permissions), scroll down to the bottom, select **Special Access** and then select the **Notification Access** connection .

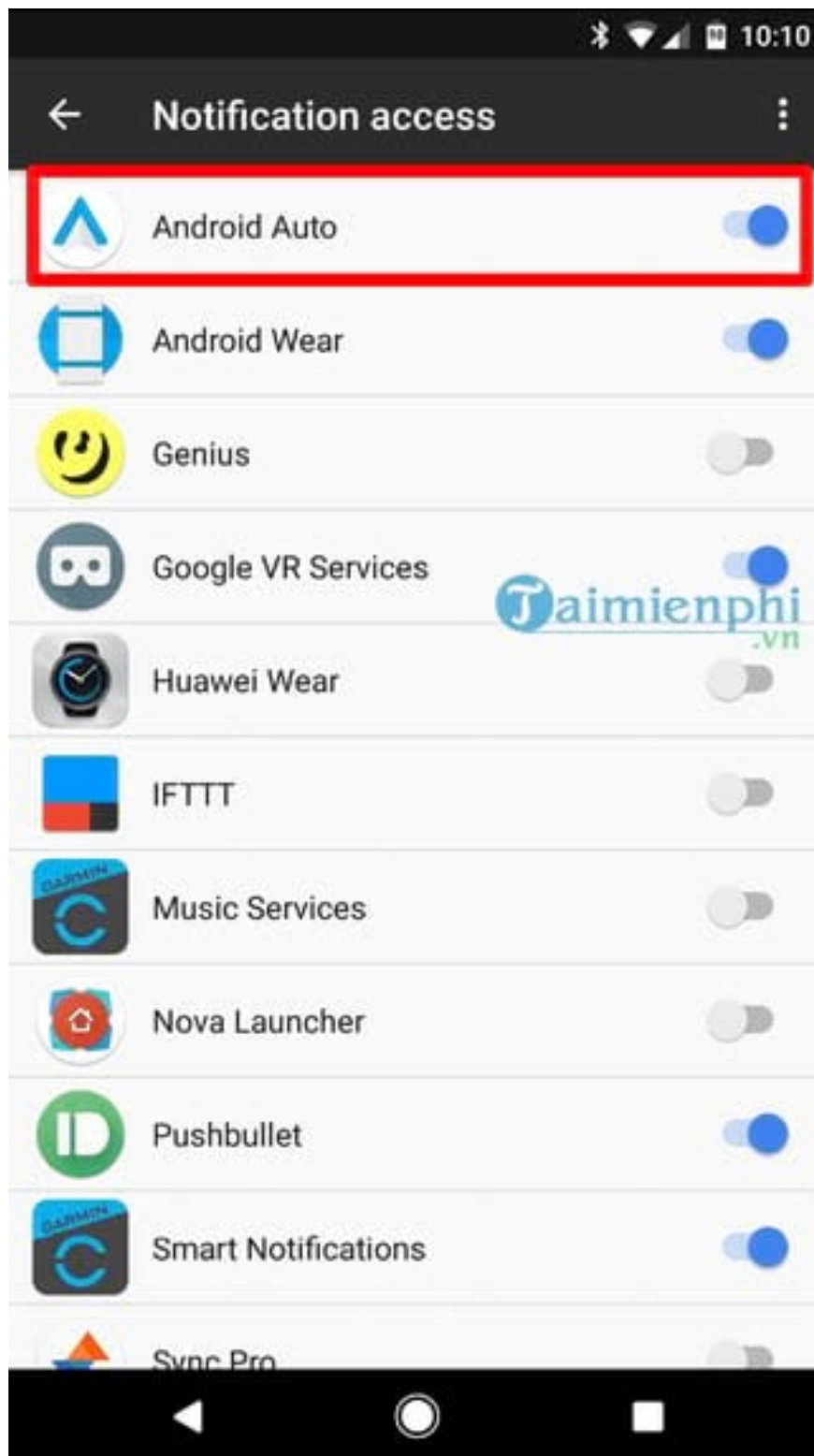


Step 5: Here you turn on notifications from Android Auto.



Then we continue we go to the App section again.

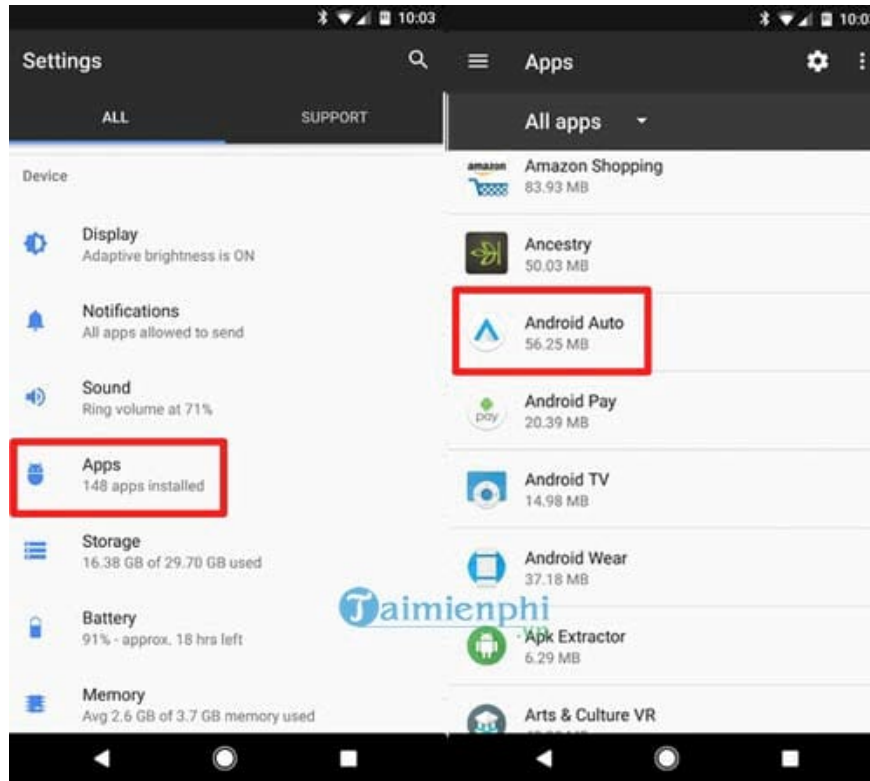
Step 6: Turn notifications back on for the Android Auto app.



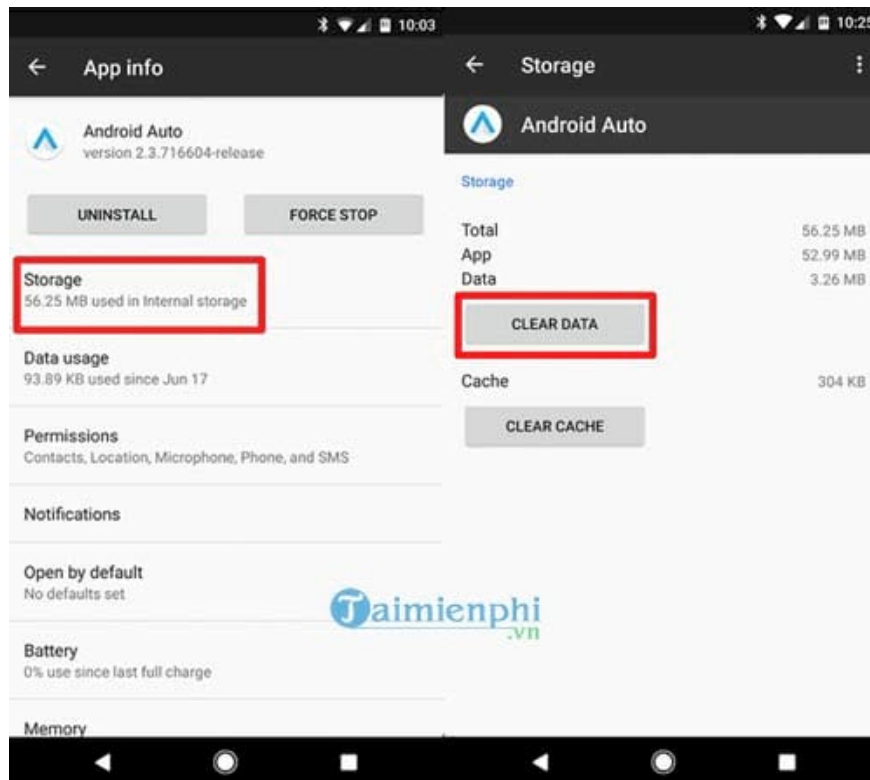
3. Wipe data

Erasing data so that the device can recognize the car from the beginning is also an effective way to help you fix the error. The system will reconnect from the beginning to avoid errors caused by accidental software conflicts with the connected device.

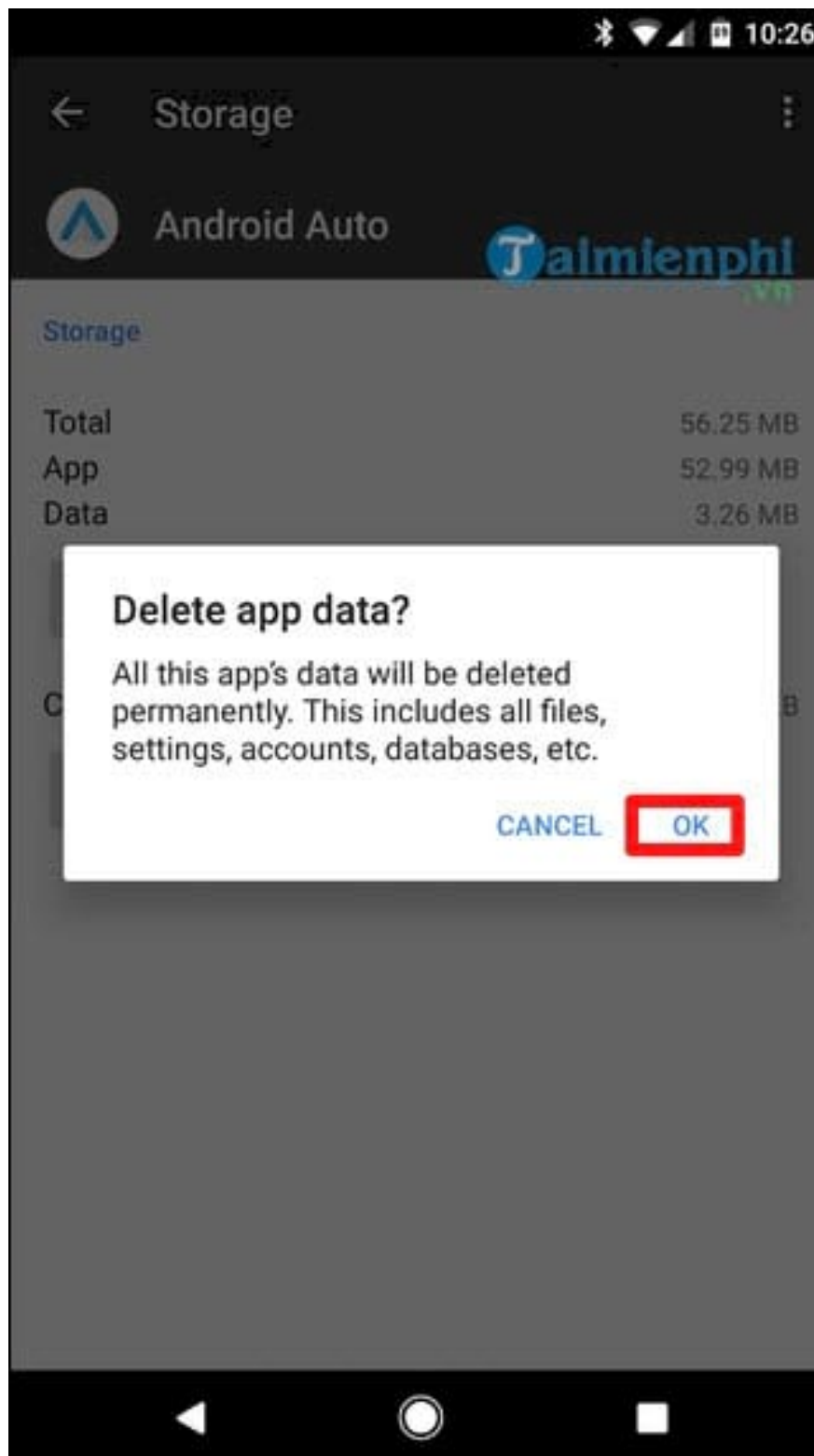
Step 1: Go back to the **Apps** section and select the **Android Auto** application again .



Step 2: Here you go to **Storage** , where **Android Auto** data is stored and select **Clear Data** to delete all data, you can also delete **Cache** if you want.



Step 3: The system will confirm this operation again, you just need to click **OK** to confirm deletion.

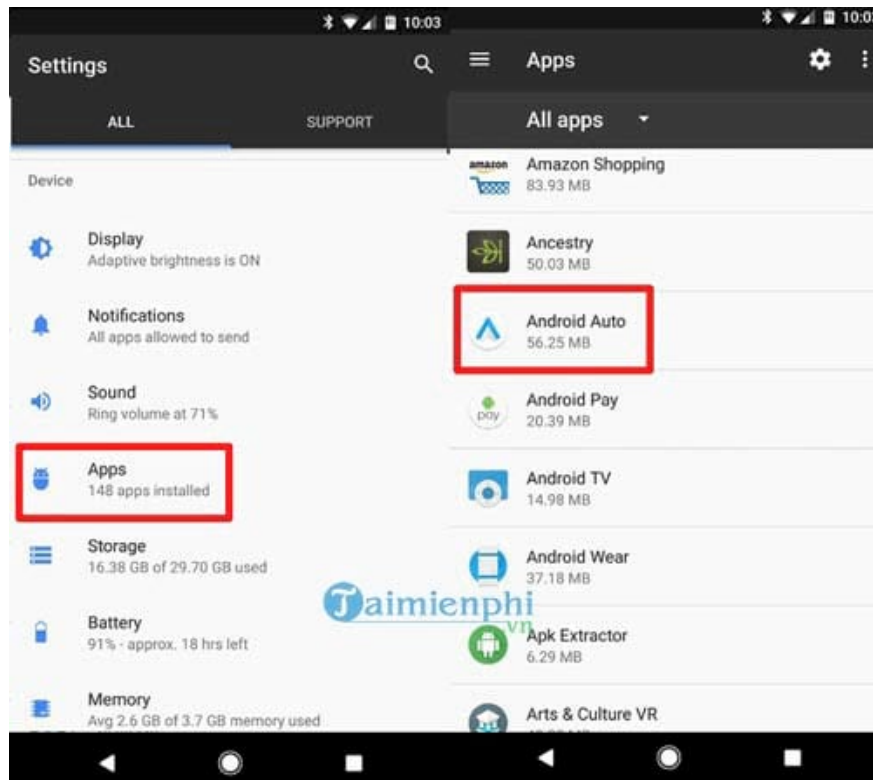


After this step, try reconnecting Android Auto to the car to see if the error has been fixed.

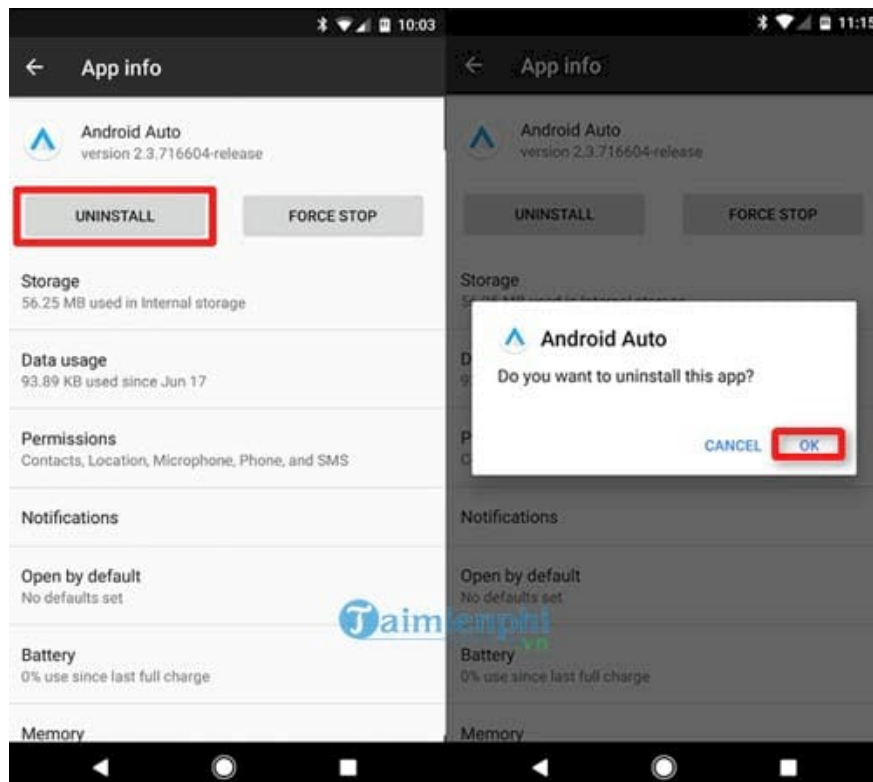
4. Uninstall and reinstall the application

This is the final solution to help you fix the error of Android Auto not working, you just need to completely uninstall the application from your phone and then reinstall it, you can see the details below.

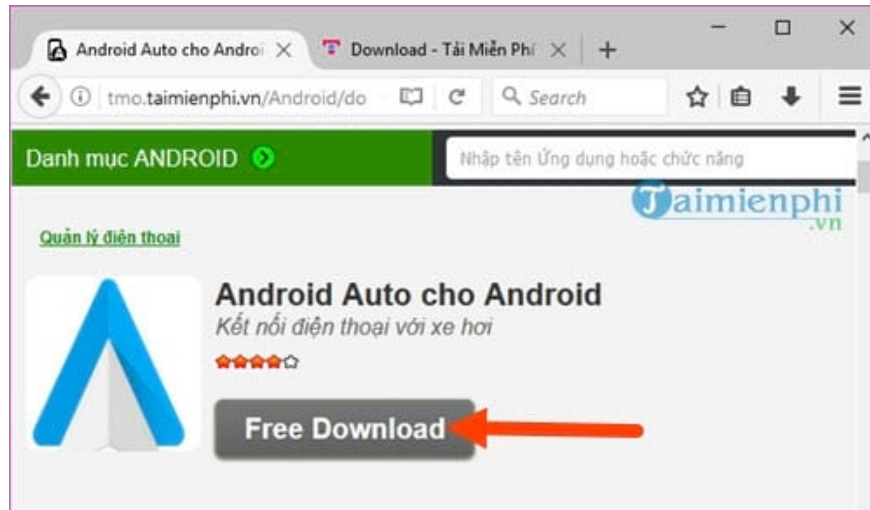
Step 1: Return to the familiar **Apps application** section , go back to Android Auto again.



Step 2: In this step, you just need to click **Uninstall** .



Step 3: And then visit here to download **Android Auto** to your phone.



Android Auto makes connecting your phone to your car more convenient, but when you encounter an error, try updating the app, checking the USB cable, or resetting Android Auto settings to fix it. If it still doesn't work, checking for errors on the car system may be the necessary solution.
