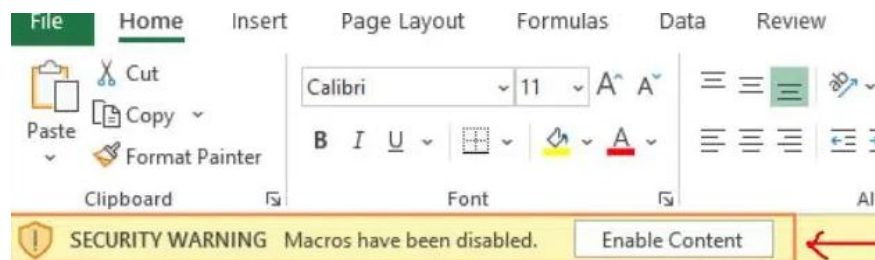
## Details on how to effectively fix the error macros have been disabled in Excel

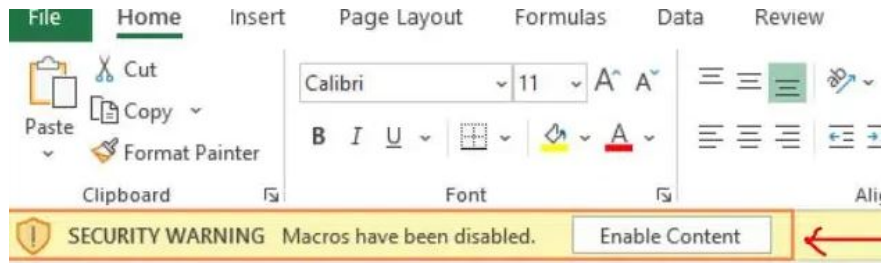
Macro have been disabled means that Macro has been disabled. Don't worry too much because this is not an error. In fact, because Macro is related to executing commands, Excel will disable it by default to secure the document. Below are some tricks you should do to handle this problem.

### Instructions for enabling Macros for a Workbook

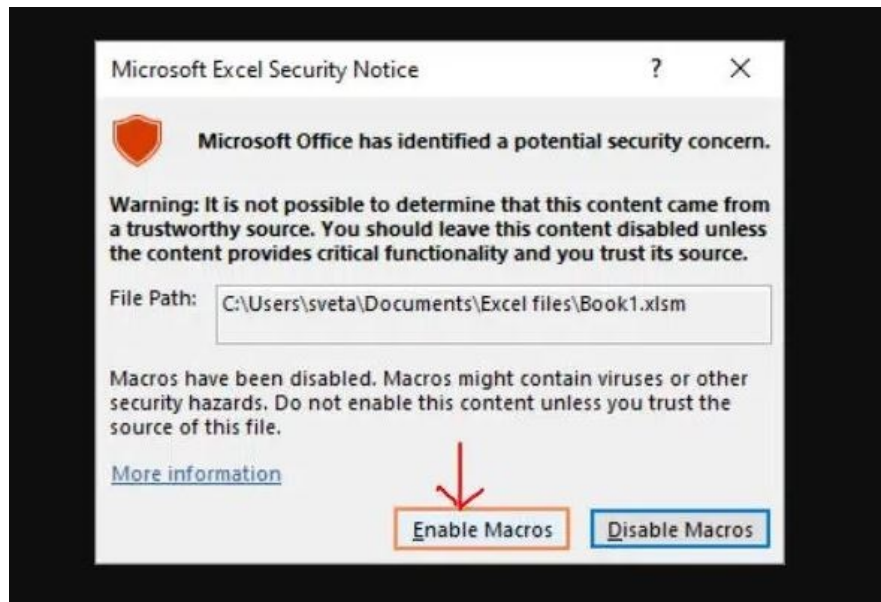
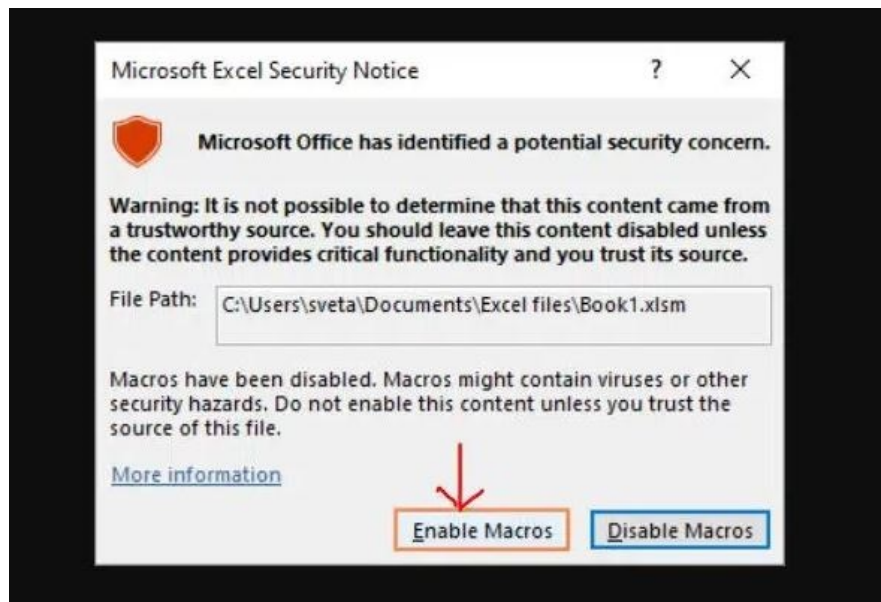
When you open a workbook that contains Macros, a yellow security warning will appear indicating that macros are disabled by default. If you only want to enable macros for a single workbook in Excel, do the following:

1. **Step 1** : In the open Excel page, you will see a yellow security warning appear at the top if that page has macros that are disabled. This warning will usually have the content '**Macros have been disabled**' or '**Some content has been disabled**'.
2. **Step 2** : To enable macros, click the 'Enable Content' button **on** the yellow security warning bar.



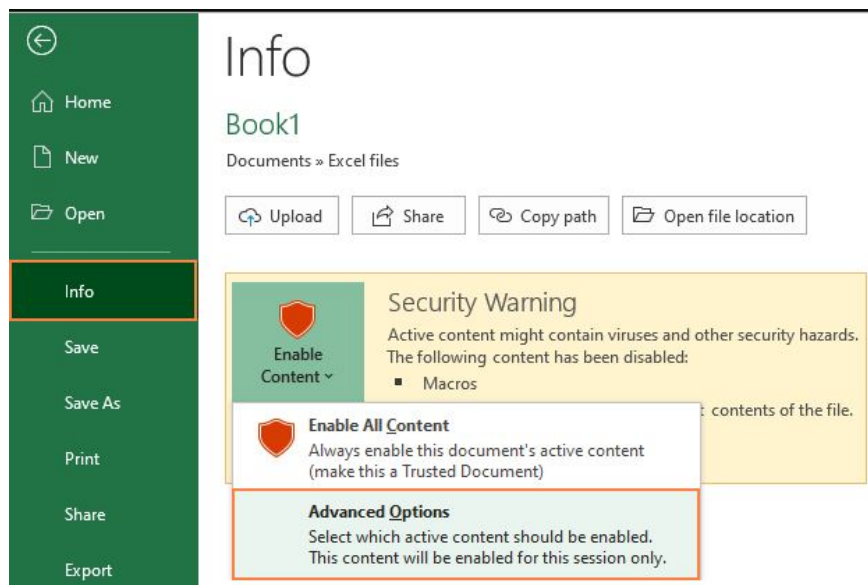
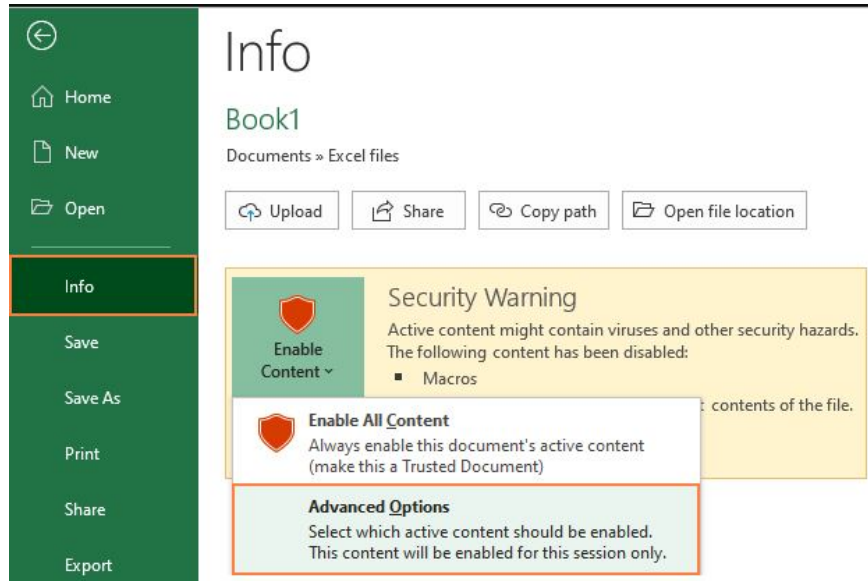


**NOTE:** In case the working file contains advanced features such as VBA code in Visual Basic Editor (VBE), Microsoft Excel Security Notice dialog box may appear. At this point, you need to confirm the trust again. If you trust the source and are sure that the Macro is safe, click **Enable Macros** to enable it. If you are not sure, you can click **Disable Macros**.



## 2/ Enable macros in Excel Backstage view

Another way to enable macros for a specific Excel file is to do it with Office Backstage view. In the open Excel file > Click the **File** tab on the toolbar > Select **Info** in the left menu > In the **Security Warning** section in the right frame > Click the arrow of the **Enable Content** button > Select **Enable All Content** . This action will also confirm that the Excel file is a trusted document.



**IMPORTANT:** In case you want to enable macros for a period of time and do not want to make this file a trusted document. You also go to **File > Info >** In the Security Warning box on the right, click **Enable Content** > **Advanced Options** > When the dialog box appears, tick **Enable content for this session** and click **OK** .

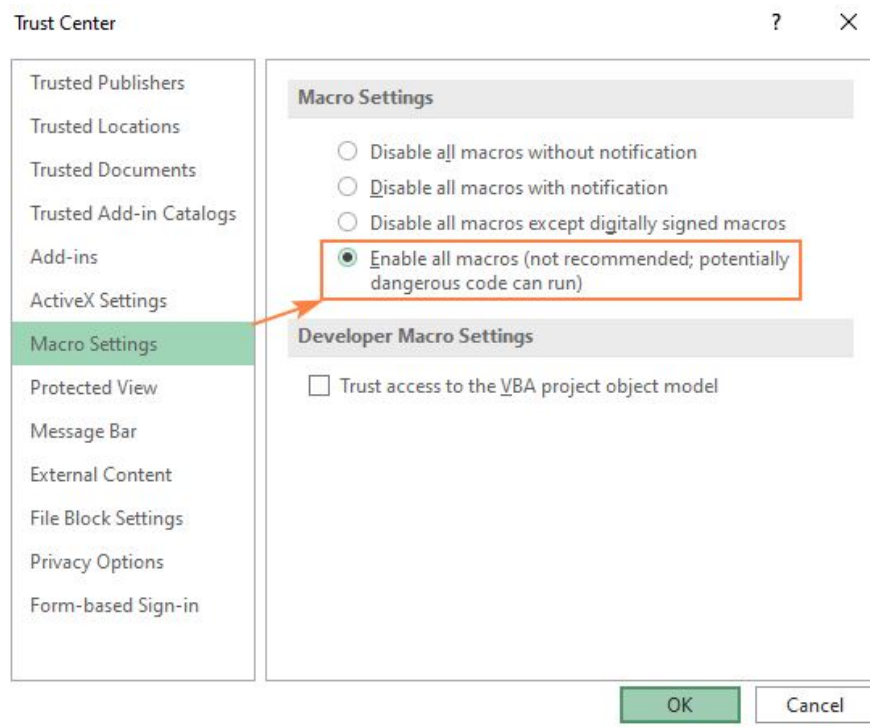
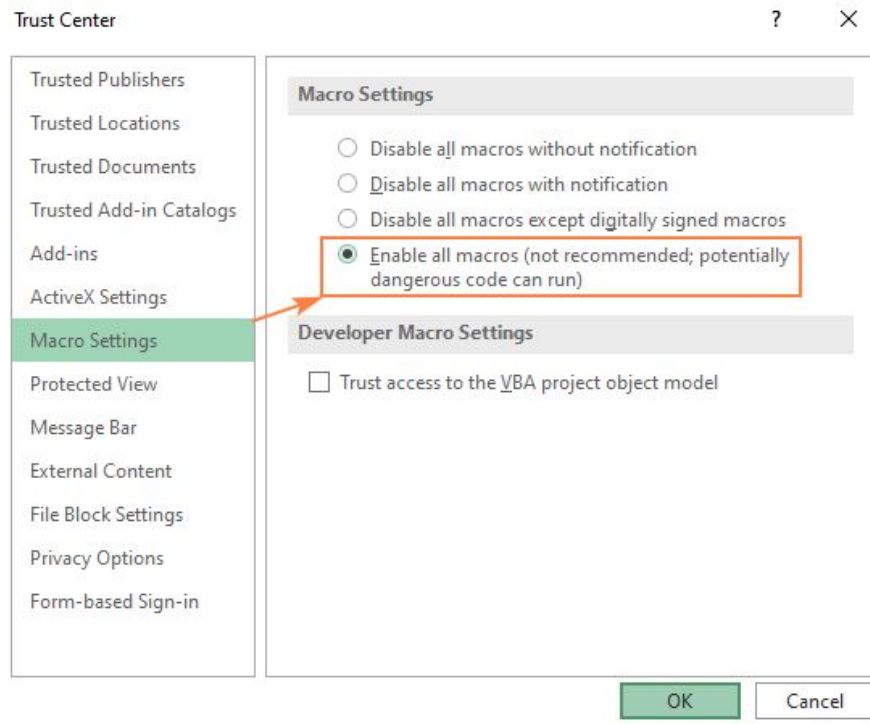


### 3/ Share how to enable macros for all Excel files via Trust Center

If you want to enable macros for all Excel files by default, follow these steps:

1. **Step 1** : In the Excel file you are accessing, click the **File** tab > Select **Options** .

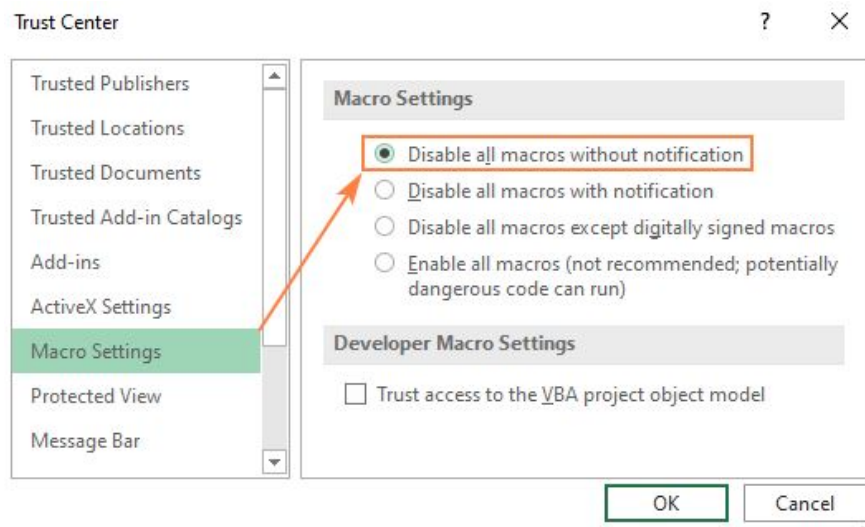
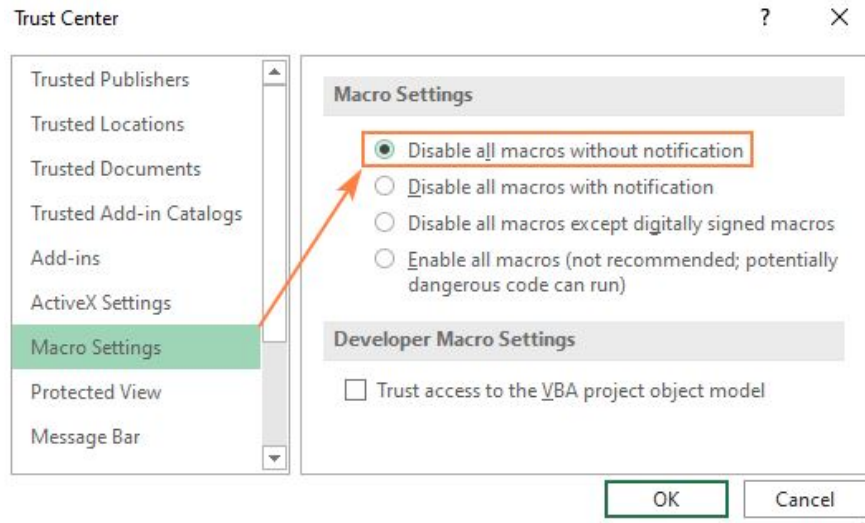
2. **B2** : When the options window appears, click on **Trust Center** > Then click the **Trust Center Settings...** button in the right frame.
3. **B3** : In the next window, click on **Macro Settings** on the left > Tick the **Enable all macros** option and click **OK** to save. Thus, all files from now on are considered trusted documents. However, you should consider when doing this because not all files received are trusted documents!



# How to disable macros in Excel if needed

After instructing how to activate, the admin also shares how to disable all macros without receiving the usual warning. You also continue to access **Trust Center Settings...** (instructions B1 and B2 above).

Then, select **Macro Settings** in the list of options on the left > Tick the option **Disable all macros without notification** and click **OK** to save the changes to complete this process.
