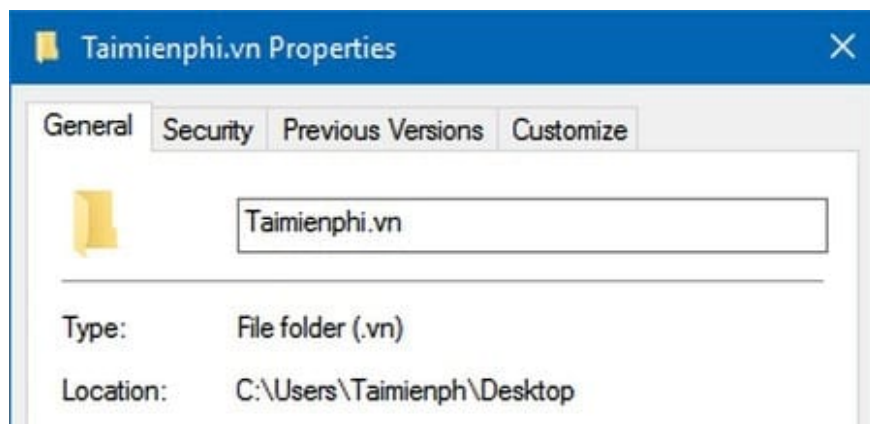


# Fixing the missing Sharing tab in Windows 10 Folder Properties

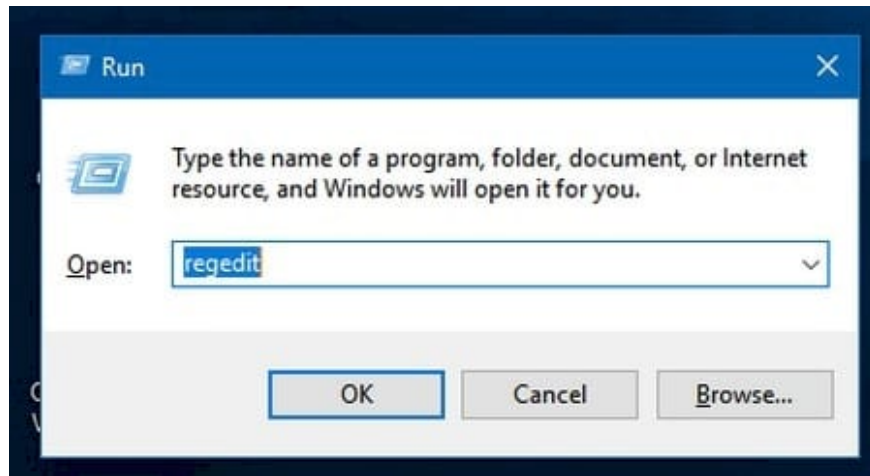
The Sharing tab allows you to choose how to share folders and files with other computers on the same network. However, there are times when this Sharing tab is lost, preventing you from sharing folders with those who need them. Therefore, this article will help you restore and fix the missing Sharing tab error in Windows 10 Folder Properties.

Many people typically choose to share folders and files through the built-in Sharing feature in Windows instead of using a USB drive or uploading to another storage service. Fixing the missing Sharing tab in Windows 10 Folder Properties is simple and allows you to quickly restore the Sharing tab for sharing folders and files.

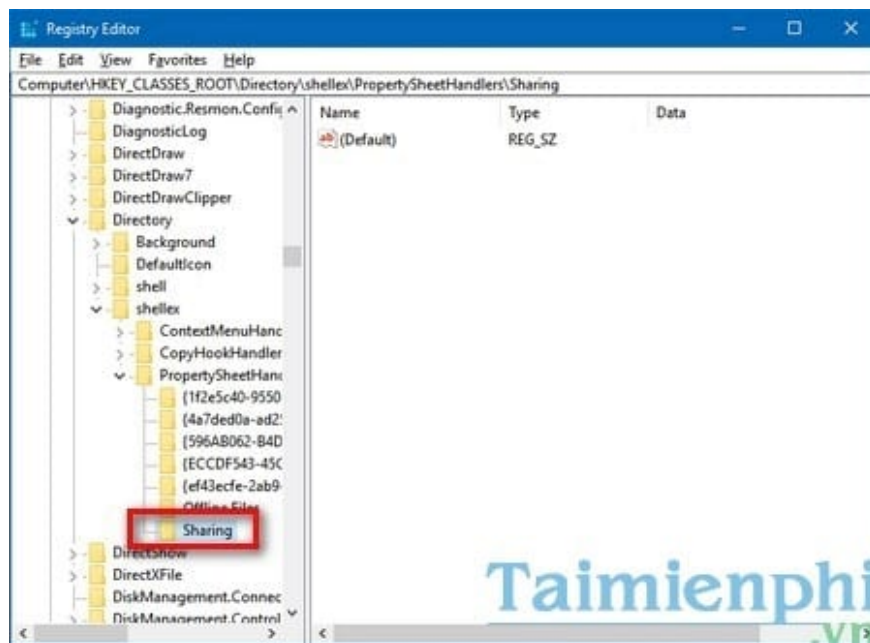


## How to fix the missing Sharing tab in Windows 10 Folder Properties

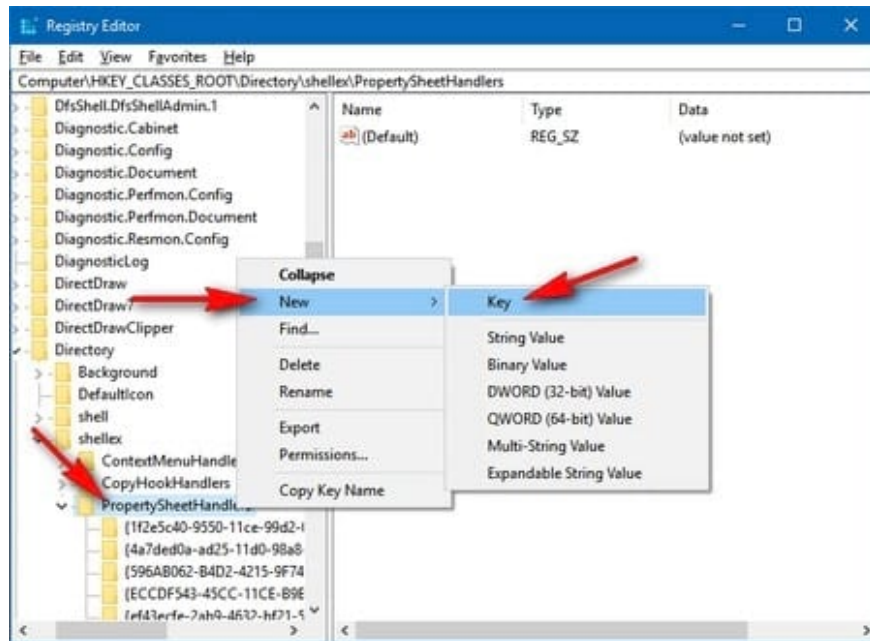
*Step 1:* Press the **Windows + R** key combination and type **regedit** in the Run window, then press Enter to open the Registry Editor.



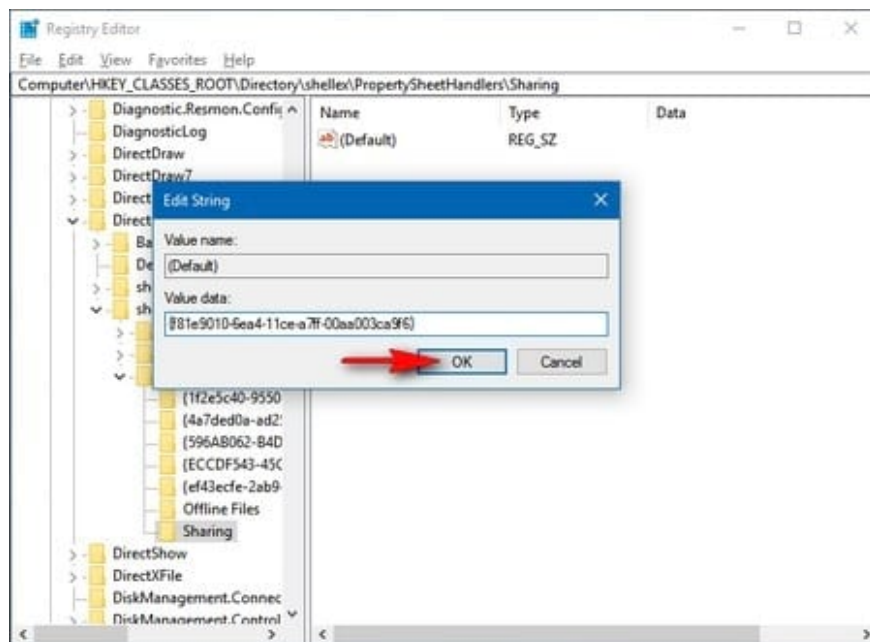
Step 2: In the Registry Editor window, locate the **Sharing** key with the following path:  
**HKEY\_CLASSES\_ROOT\Directory\shell\PropertySheetHandlers\Sharing** .



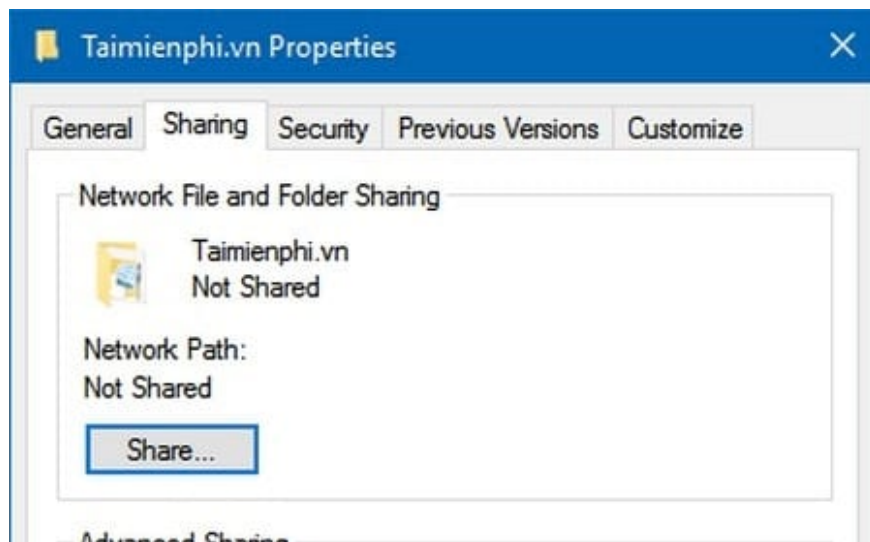
Step 3: If the Sharing folder does not exist, you can right-click on the parent folder **PropertySheetHandlers** and select **New -> Key** and create the Sharing folder.



*Step 4:* In the Sharing key, double-click on the (Default) value in the right-hand pane and paste the following value into the Value data field: `{f81e9010-6ea4-11ce-a7ff-00aa003ca9f6}`, then click **OK**.



*Step 5:* After completing the above steps, you can close Registry Editor and return to the folder you want to share. You will see that the Sharing tab in Folder Properties of that folder has been restored.



As you can see, fixing the Sharing tab error in Windows 10 Folder Properties is incredibly simple, right? You can apply the same method if you need to restore the Sharing tab on other Windows operating systems. Usually, the missing Sharing tab error is due to incorrect editing leading to errors in the Registry, so before making any important changes, you should create a Restore Point in Windows to restore the system settings before making any modifications.
