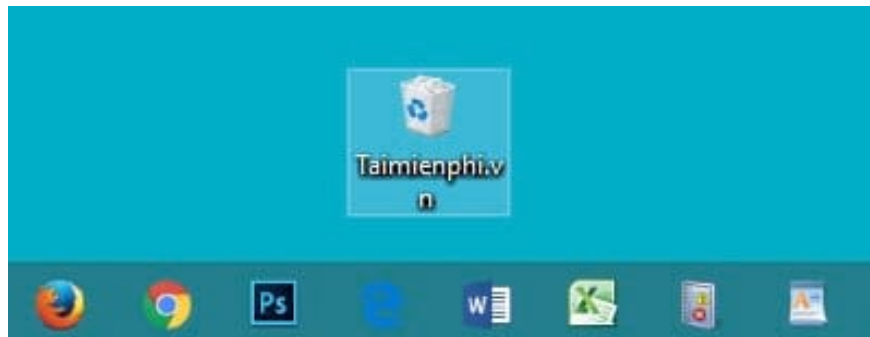


Fixing the Auto-Hide Correctly feature on the Windows 10 Taskbar.

Sometimes you want your screen to be completely free of taskbars and icons, but unfortunately, you encounter the Auto-Hide Correctly error on the Windows 10 taskbar that prevents it from disappearing. So, how do you fix the Auto-Hide Correctly error on the Windows 10 taskbar, and what is the cause?

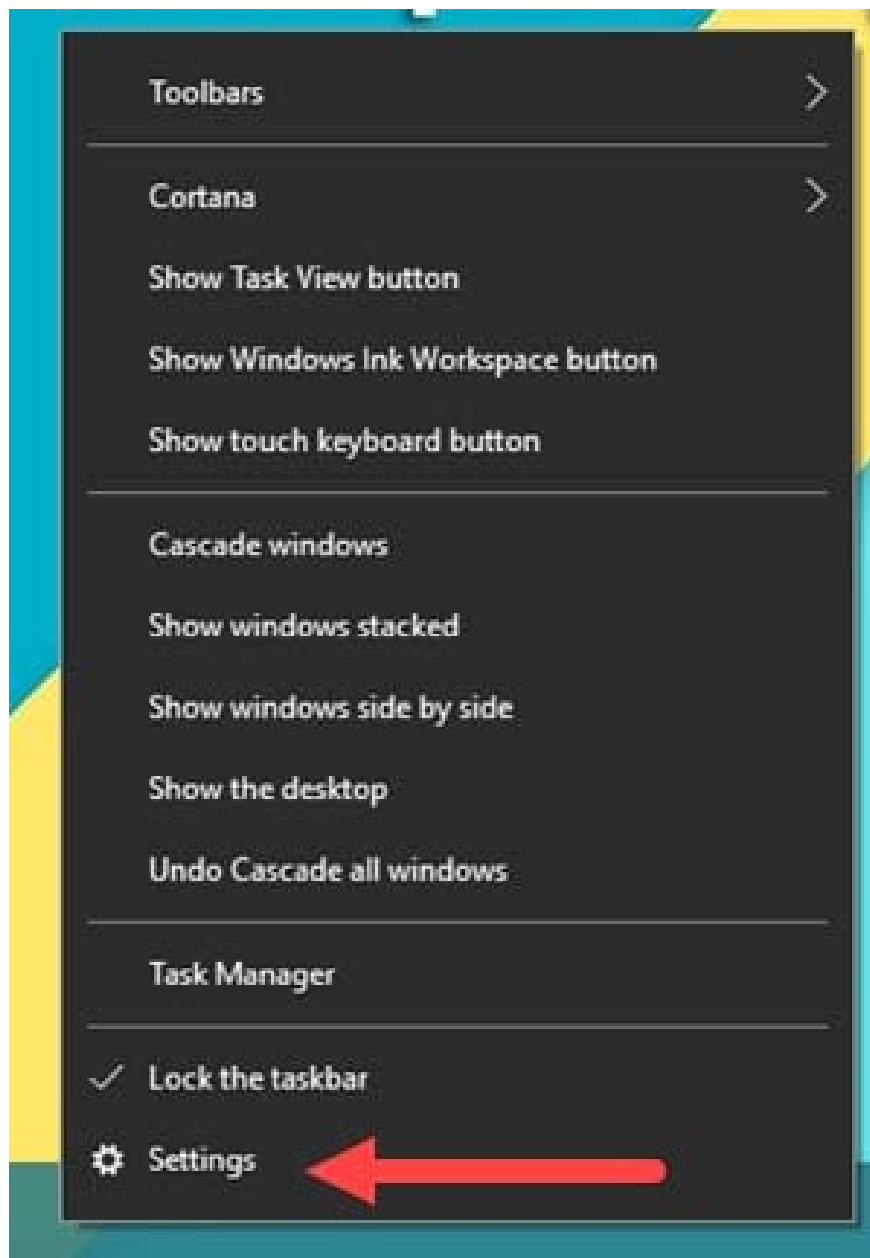
Calling it an "Auto-Hide Correctly" error on the Windows 10 Taskbar isn't entirely accurate, as these "errors" sometimes originate from the Windows system itself or from the user. The "Auto-Hide Correctly" error on the Windows 10 Taskbar occurs when you receive a notification from an application, software, or even a system notification that prevents the Taskbar from being hidden .



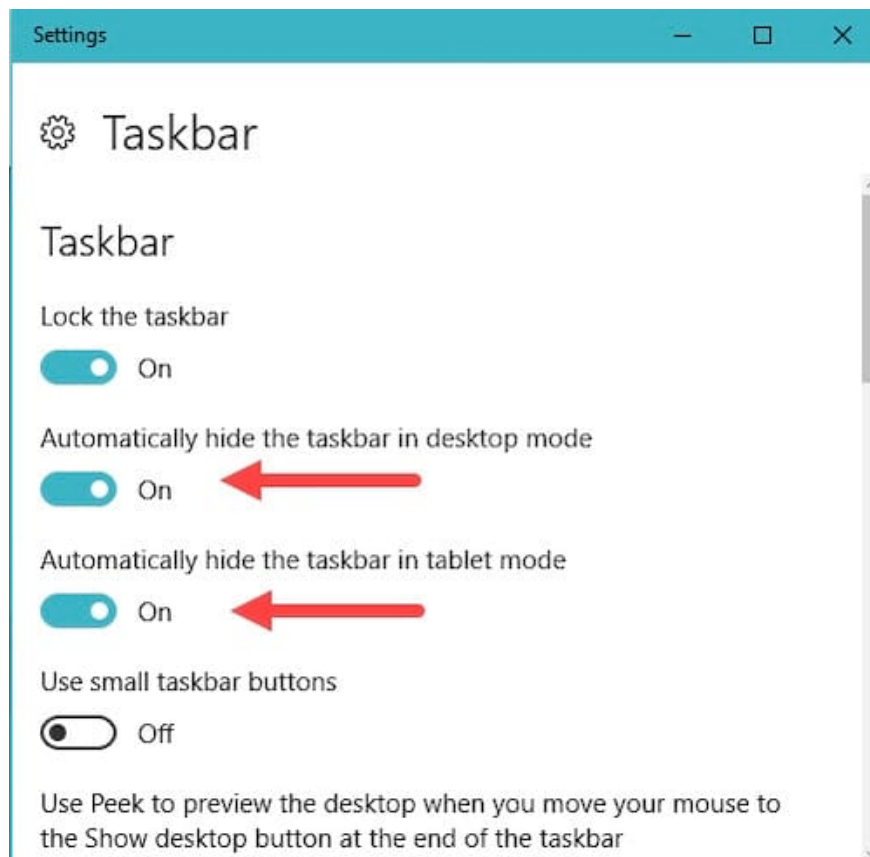
For these reasons, this article from TipsMake will help both new and long-time Windows 10 users to better control whether the taskbar is hidden or visible according to their preferences, as well as how to fix errors that occur on the taskbar, not just the Auto-Hide Correctly error on the Windows 10 taskbar.

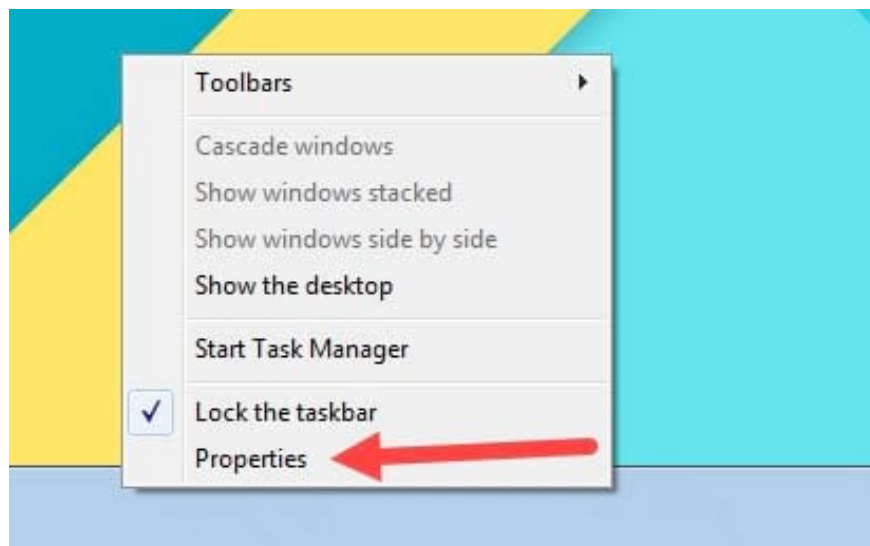
Step 1: First, make sure you have enabled the Taskbar hide function. If not, turn it off and then on again by **right-clicking** on the Taskbar and selecting **Settings** .



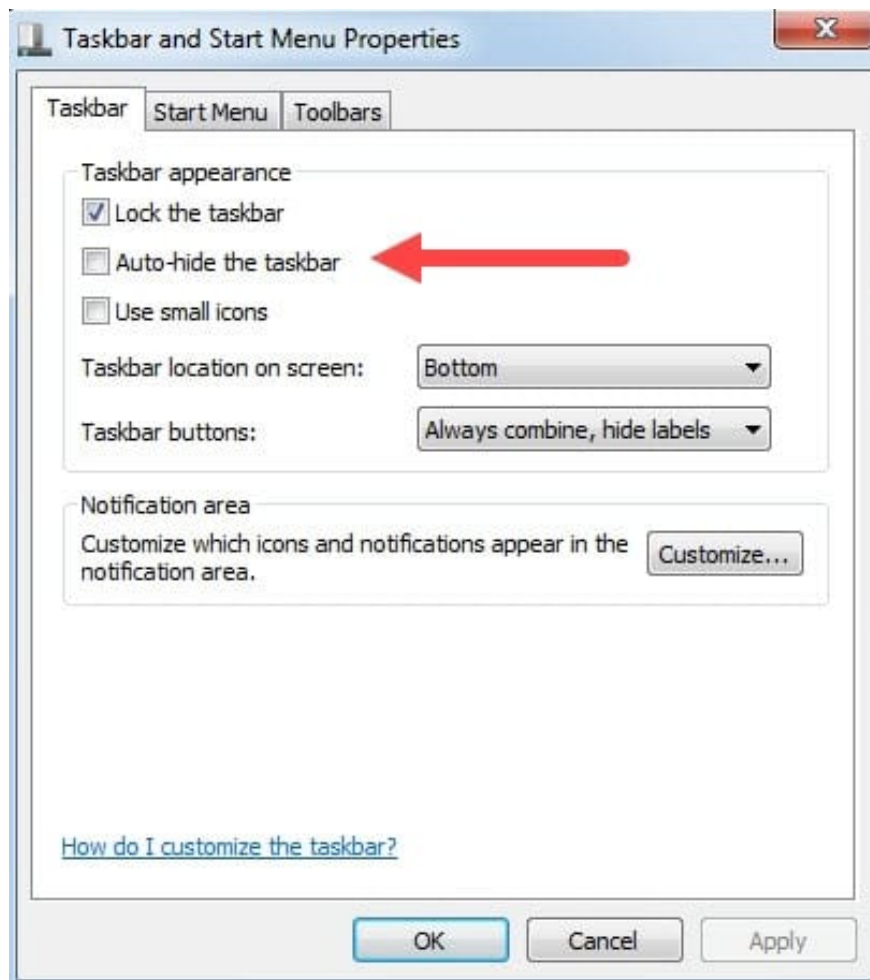
Step 2: In the **Settings** section we just accessed, enable the two features: " **Automatically hide the taskbar in desktop mode,** " which automatically hides the taskbar in regular desktop mode, and " **Automatically hide the taskbar in tablet mode ,**" which is for touchscreen devices or if you have tablet mode enabled.



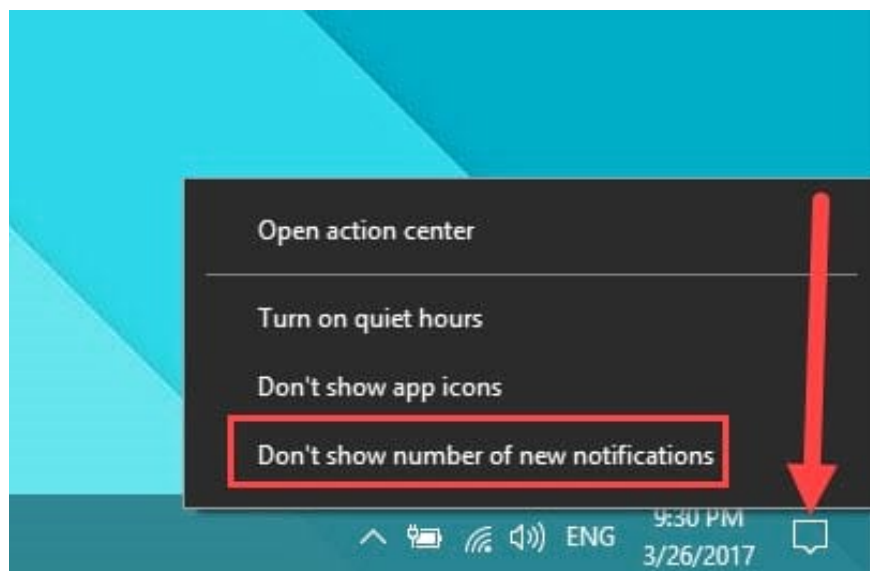
- On other operating systems, you access it by **right-clicking** on the Taskbar and selecting **Properties** .



In the Taskbar and Start Menu Properties section , check the "**Auto hide the taskbar**" option to hide the taskbar.



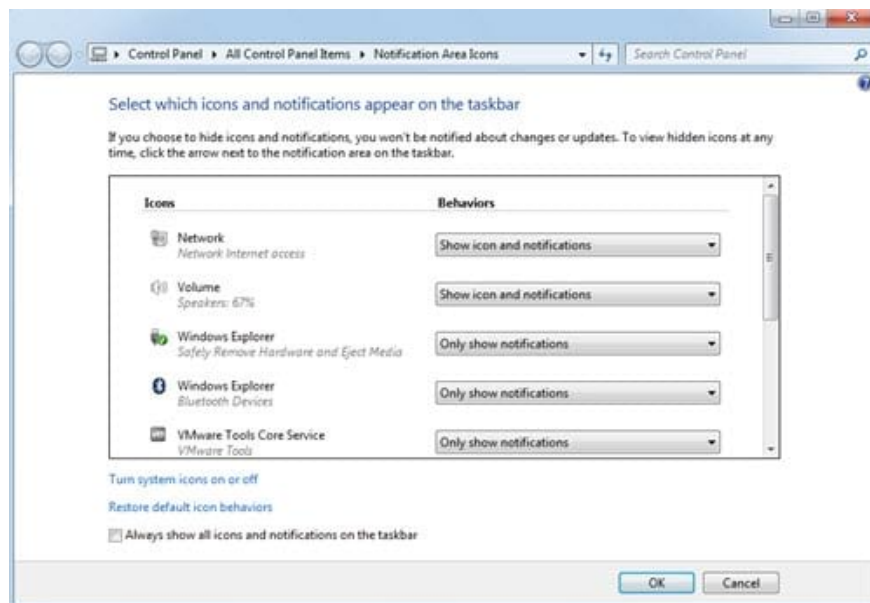
Step 3: As mentioned above, the Auto-Hide Correctly error on the Windows 10 Taskbar is partly due to notifications **from the Action Center** or your applications/software appearing, and sometimes system errors prevent the Taskbar from closing. If you don't have too many necessary notifications, why not turn them off by clicking on the Action Center and selecting "**Don't show number of new notifications**" to prevent notifications from appearing?



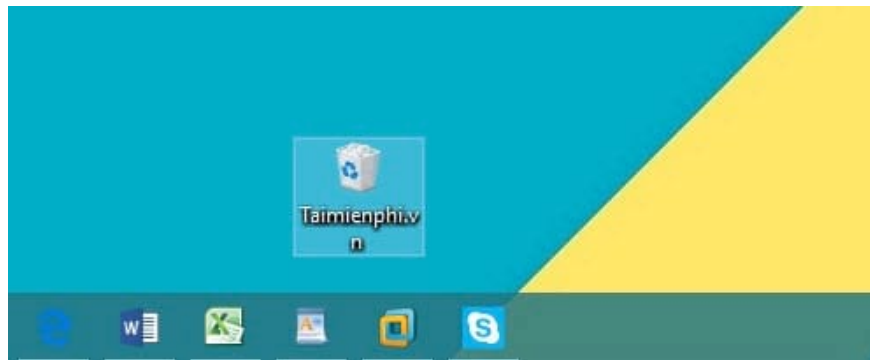
- On other operating systems like Windows 7 or 8, you click **Customize** to customize the notification settings for the icons.



Then you select which icons here indicate which applications are allowed to display, including annoying notifications.



Step 4: Pay attention to social media apps like Skype, because when someone contacts you, the app will light up and the Taskbar will automatically appear. Sometimes, system glitches can cause it to remain visible and not disappear. Unless it's a serious issue, turn off notifications for those apps.



So, TipsMake has just helped you fix the Auto-Hide Correctly error on the Windows 10 Taskbar, an error caused by user error or by the system itself. With the Windows 10 Taskbar, you can do many things, including changing the Taskbar's position or **resizing** . And there are many more Taskbar tricks for you to discover and share with us.
