Founder and Co-founder are two familiar concepts in the field of business, or startup. So how are these two concepts different?

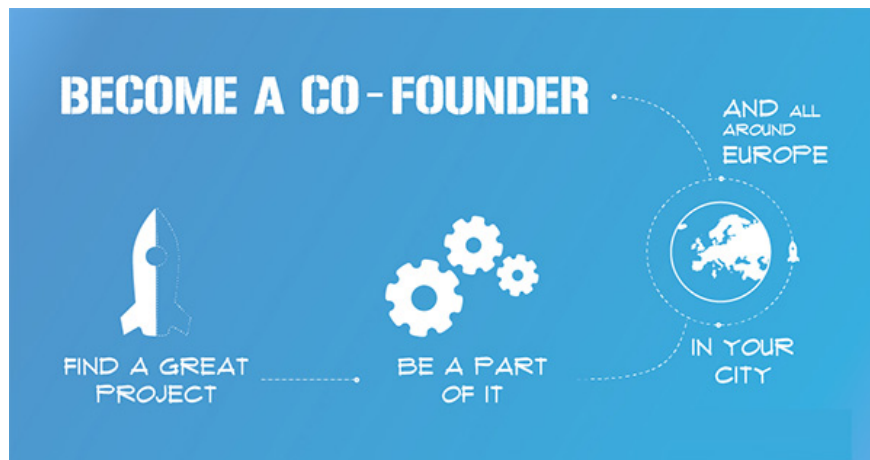
