This is an opportunity for art lovers around the world to admire the famous artworks at home without having to set foot in France.



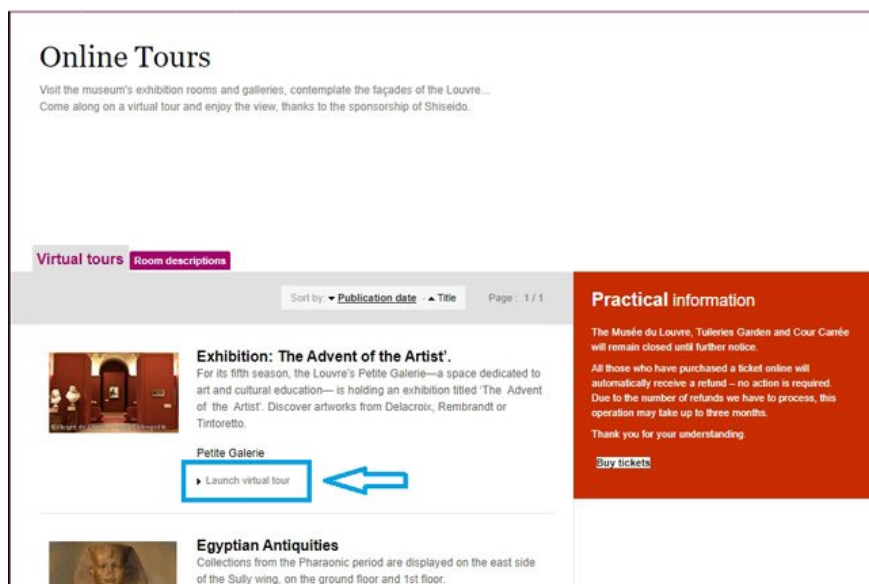

Currently, the Louvre offers free screen visitors with museum areas including The Advent of the Artist, Remains of the Louvre's Moat and Egyptian Antiquities Galerie d'Apollon. 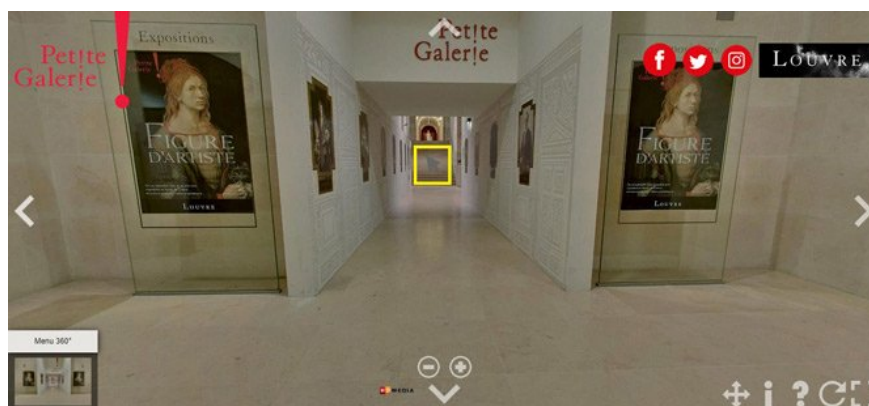
To start the journey to discover the art world of the famous Louvre museum in far-away France, just open the museum's website by following the link below.
