Launched in 2004, Gmail offers 1GB of free storage for users. Then this limit is gradually increased, and most recently it is 7GB.

However, on April 24, Google has unexpectedly 'added' the limit for Gmail to 10GB of free storage.

The information on the site was first revealed by *Engadget* and until now, many Gmail accounts have not yet seen their mailboxes received new storage levels. But some Gmail users have reported that they have found that the free storage limit is raised to 10GB.
