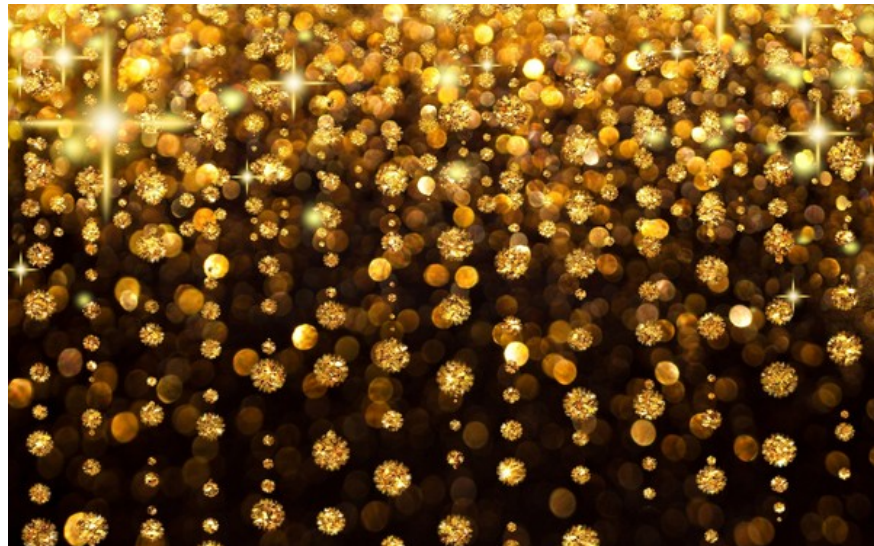


Gold and interesting facts that not everyone knows

80% of the gold on Earth has not been found yet. According to experts, the amount of gold can be very deep underground so in the near future people cannot exploit.



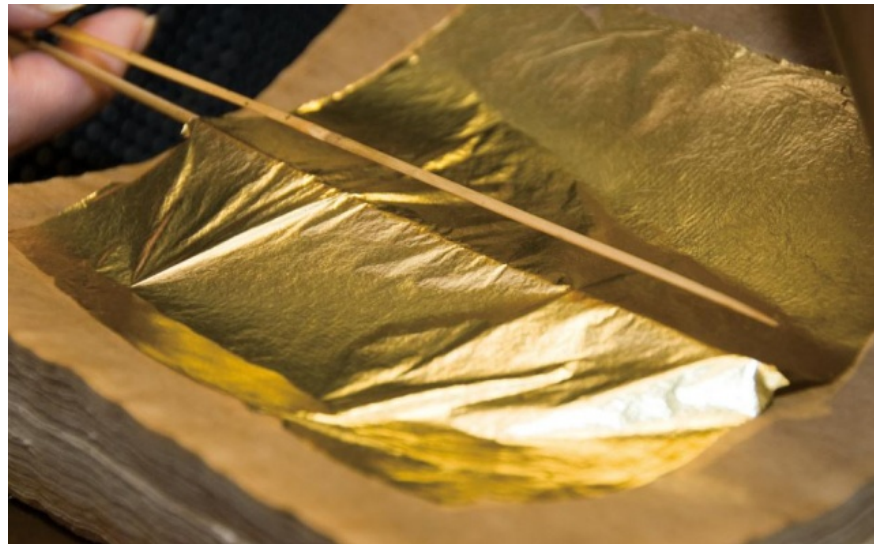
The amount of gold that all mankind digs throughout history is equivalent to the amount of steel mined in an hour.

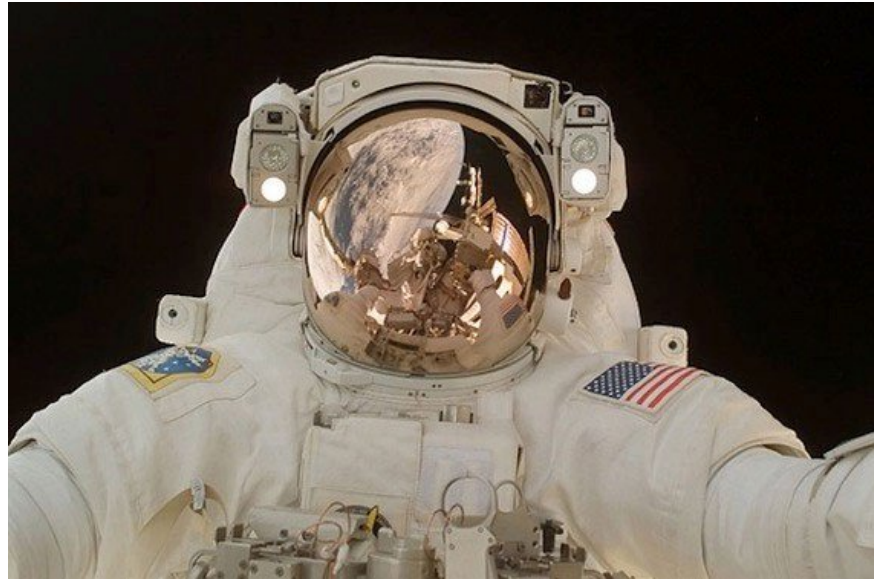
With an ounce of pure gold, through many meticulous steps one can laminate it into an 80km long string.



Gold has excellent electrical conductivity so it is used in many industrial applications. Historically, gold has been laminated to make only the Chinese kings' garments or embroidered luxurious carpets.



Before 1912, the Olympic gold medal was awarded to champion athletes made from real gold. But after that, the Olympic Committee stopped using 24K gold as a medal. Currently, gold medals are only plated with 6g of gold.



Gold is used to make astronauts' helmets and suits to help them avoid infrared radiation from the sun, helping the temperature in the adventurous suit not increase.



Indians regard gold as a symbol of wealth and status, so of course the country is the most used place in the world. Unlike other countries, Indian gold has a purity of 22K.



Melting gold was used to execute prisoners in Ecuador in the sixteenth century. The Romans also used this method to execute prisoners.
