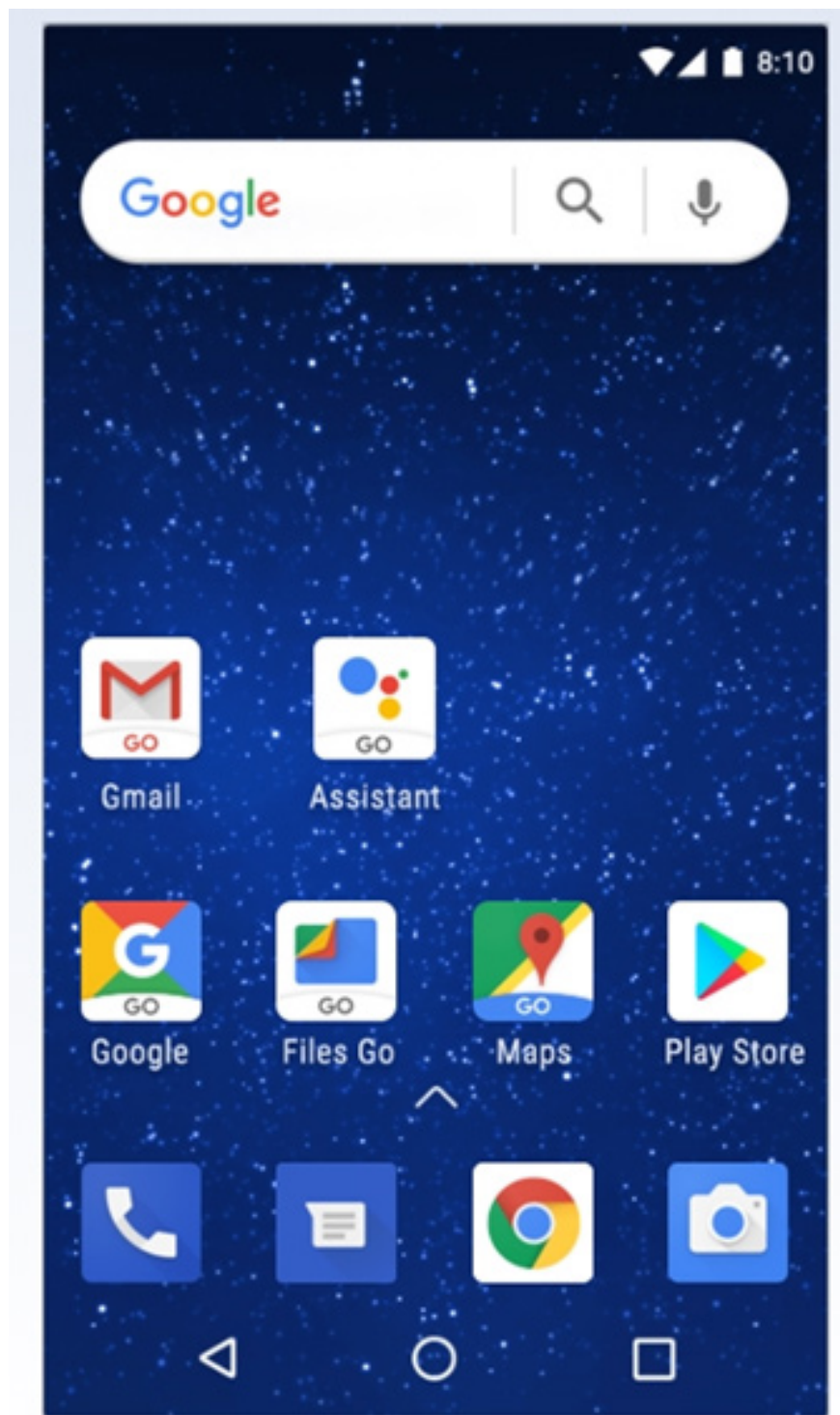


# Google is about to launch Android 9 Pie (Go Edition) for low-end smartphones
