

Google officially introduces the virtual desktop feature on Chrome OS

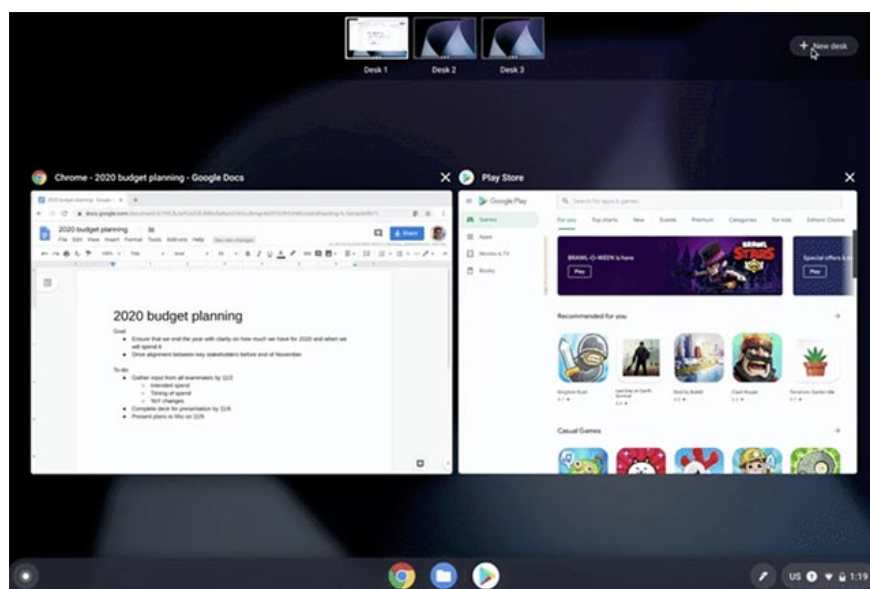
Virtual desktop (virtual desktops) is expected to be released in the latest update of the operating system platform.

You can also access and manage all your virtual desktop environments through the 'Overview' task easily and quickly.



Besides virtual desktops, a few other new features that will appear on the new version of Chrome OS include:

1. **Click-to-Call:** If you're using and connecting your Chromebook to an Android phone, you can make phone calls by clicking directly on the phone number in Chrome browser. This feature is especially useful when you are browsing the web and want to make quick voice calls with the phone number displayed on the computer screen.
2. **Improve printing features:** You can press Ctrl + P to view all compatible printers.
3. **Faster Feedback:** Google really wants you to share your thoughts about Chrome OS, and has added a new dedicated feedback button. This button will appear next to the Power options when you hold the power button.

All of these changes will appear in Chrome OS 78, which will be rolled out to users this week.
