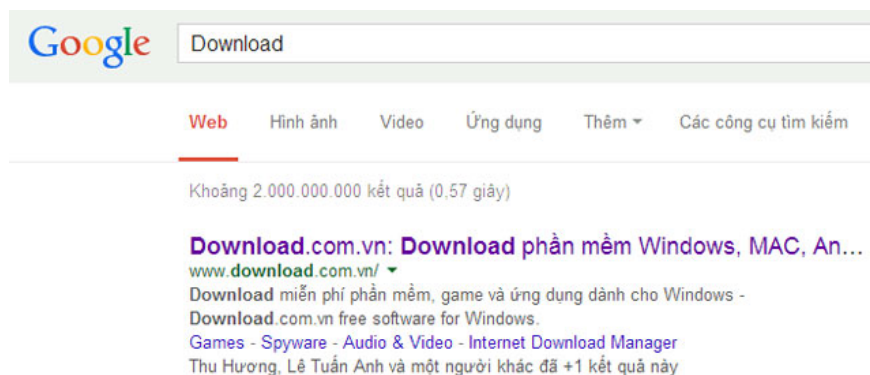


# Google removes underscores of links on its search engine

In fact, the company has started deploying underline links for about two weeks, but has so far officially announced this change. As a result, we have a search site that looks cleaner and cleaner, in line with the style of modern websites. At the same time, Google said it also increased the font size of the title, making them more prominent than the notes below.
