With the Android Messages web app, users can perform receiving and messaging operations directly from the web browser (messages.android.com) without using an Android device. of yourself from another device.

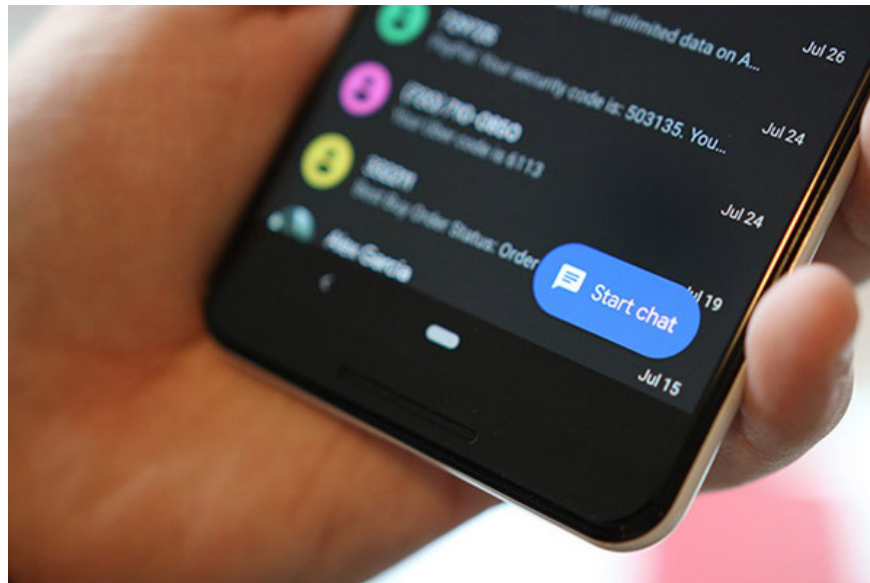
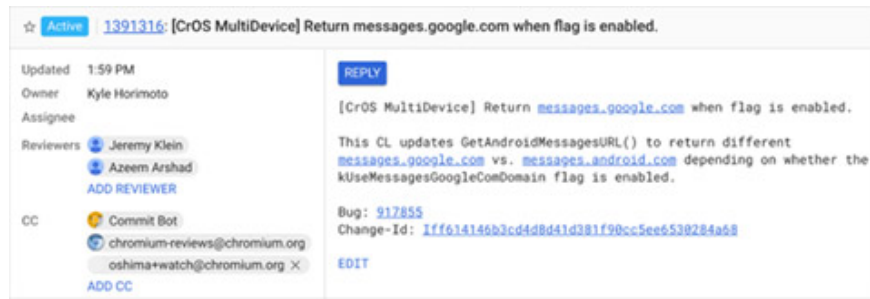

Currently the messages.google.com URL does not exist yet, but it will appear soon. The report said the new change could start with Chrome OS 72 or 73. Initially, Google could retain both active URLs for a short period of time to avoid potential unexpected situations. .
