

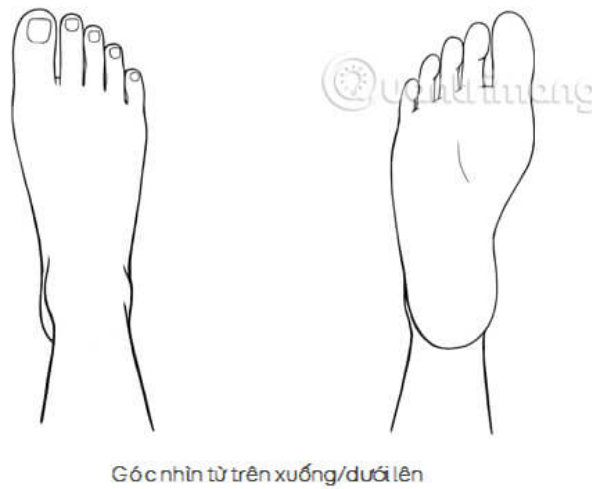
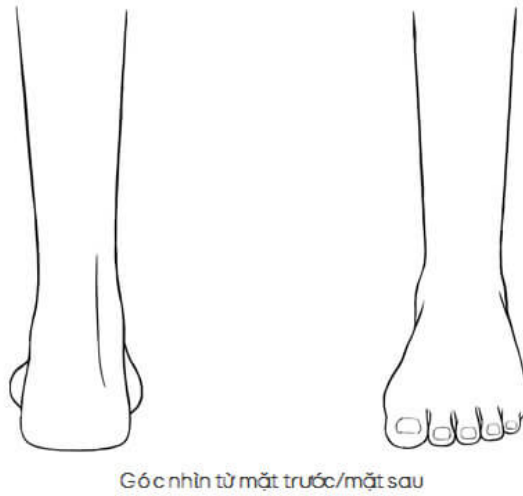
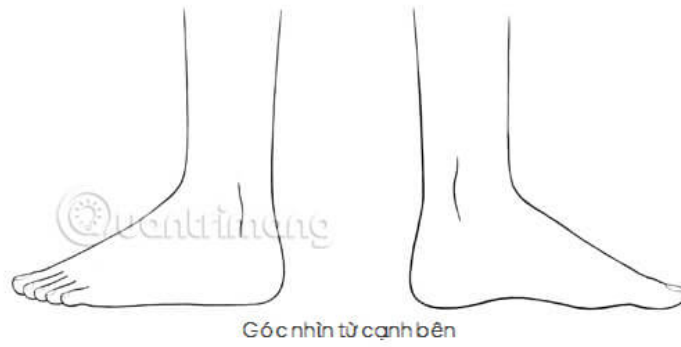
Guide to drawing Anime and Manga characters' feet from different perspectives

Feet are also an extremely difficult part of the body. However in the anime style, the feet will be much simplified, being the minimalist version of the true feet.

Like hand drawing, the foot is also an extremely difficult body part because it is made up of many different shapes and details. However in the anime style, the feet will be much simplified, being the minimalist version of the true feet.

In this article, TipsMake.com will tell you **some useful tips and examples to help you learn how to draw feet for anime and manga from different perspectives.**

Draw feet from different angles



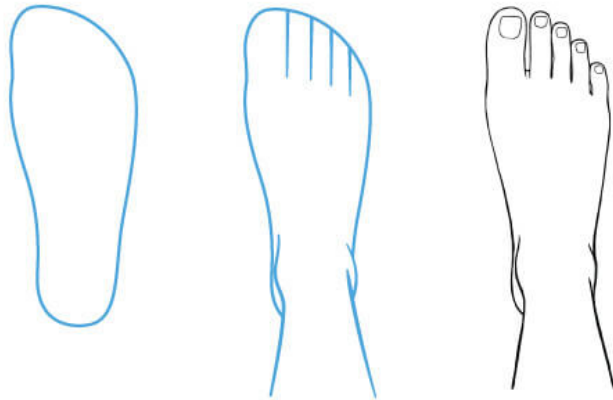
Anime and Manga character feet from different perspectives

Anime legs tend to be less stylized, looking closer to being true than other body parts.

The size and shape of the feet may vary based on many factors, but the following general principles can be applied when drawing all feet. For this article, we will take the example of a young man's foot.

To draw the foot from any angle, we will start by drawing the general shape of the foot, smaller details such as toes, toenails . will be drawn later. This will help you reduce errors when drawing details. Sketching the general shape of the first object is always a general rule when starting to draw.

Draw feet from top to bottom



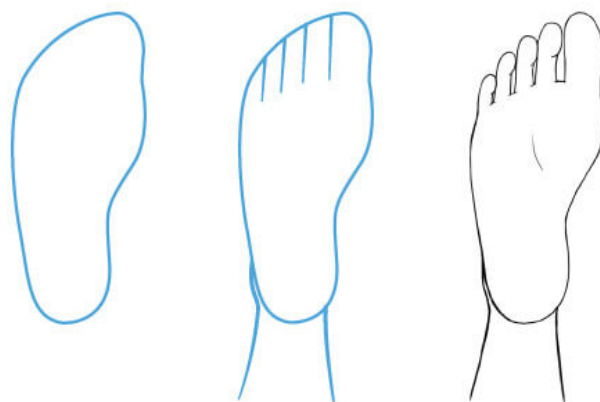
Anime character's feet, Manga from top view

If you are new to drawing, practice with drawing a top-down view because you can see almost the whole foot.

As mentioned above, start by sketching the general shape of the foot. The legs will get bigger towards the toes, the heel will be smaller. Bigger toes at the head, getting smaller and lower.

Pay attention to the scale to make sure the toes are drawn to the right size. The big toe will be the largest, almost doubling the remaining toes.

Draw perspective feet from bottom to top

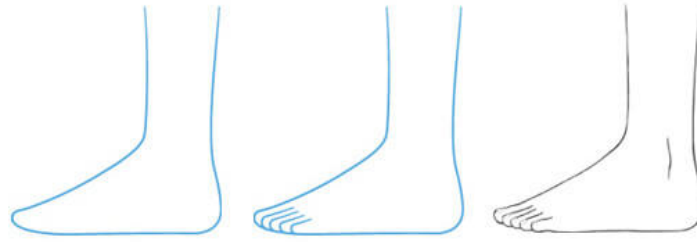


Anime character's feet, Manga from the bottom up

Drawing feet from the bottom up anime character is similar to drawing from the top down, you follow and do like the above case.

Note that in this perspective, the feet are usually standing on a certain surface, so the toes (except for the thumb) will look slightly curved and shorter.

Draw an angle view from the side

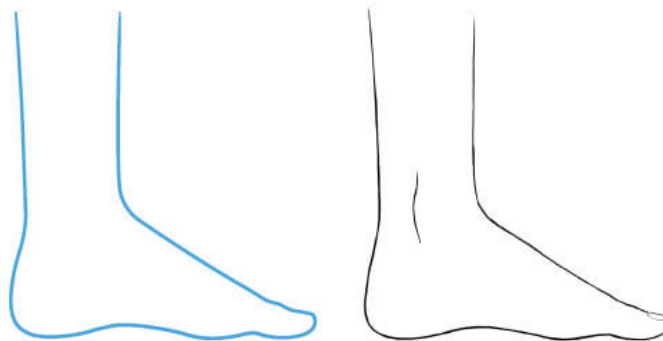


Anime and Manga character's feet from the side

When you draw the foot of the side-view anime character from the youngest toe, you can see all the remaining toes from any angle.

Since looking from one side, you should draw your feet slightly round up towards the heel, and lower toward your toes.

Draw the angle of view from the other side

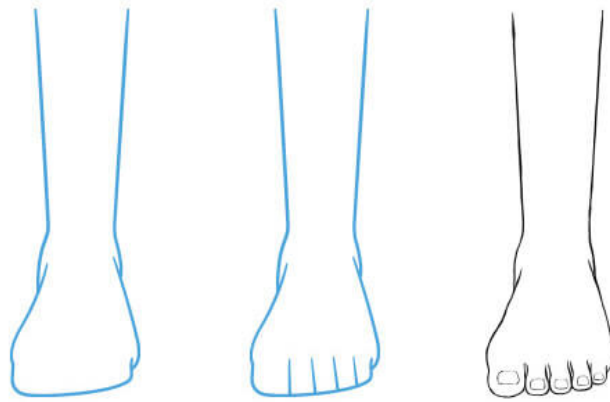


Anime and Manga character's feet from the side

If you draw the character's foot from an eye level as shown in the illustration, the big toe of the foot will cover the remaining fingers.

Note, from this angle, you remember to draw a curve from toe to heel.

Draw feet from the front

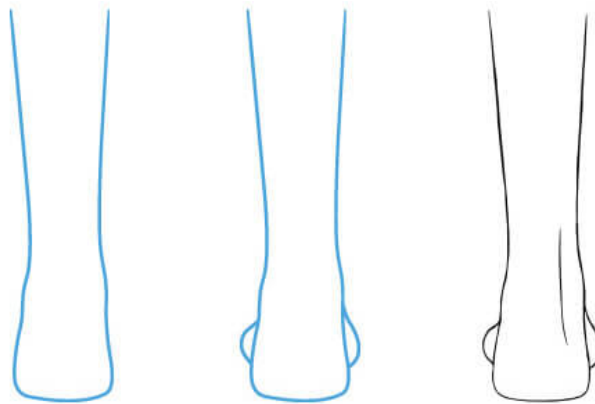


Anime character's feet, Manga from the front

Note that when drawing angle feet from the front, pinched toes will not be as big as the width of the foot. This is a very common mistake when drawing feet from this perspective.

To draw the scale, you can sketch each toes first to determine the size, then draw to the details.

Draw the angle view from the back

When viewed from behind, the heel part will be wider below and smaller towards the ankle. Remember this to sketch the correct foot shape.

Draw two curves on either side to show the ankle. Draw the bottom part of the heel slightly. The front part of the foot will most likely be obscured by the heel. You will not see your toes if your feet are on the ground or at eye level as shown.

Finally, you can draw a stroke that shows the heel tendon.
