

How do I record audio on a Windows 11 laptop?

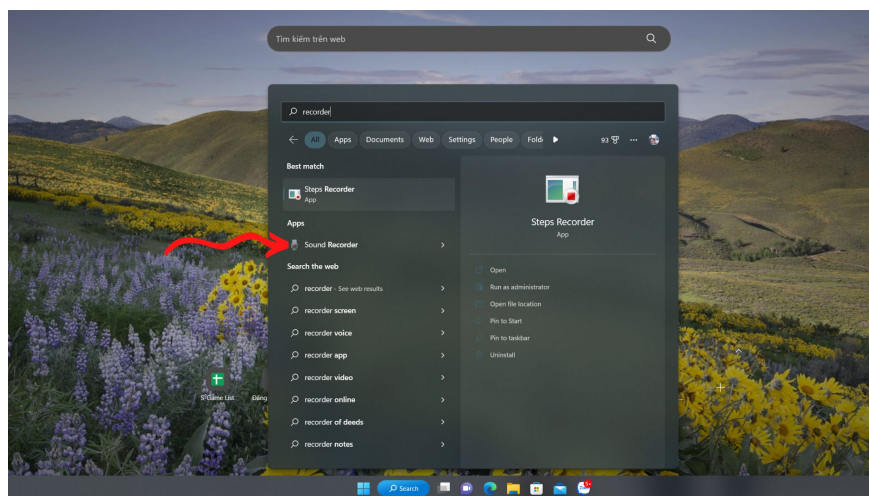
If you're looking for ways to record audio on your Windows 11 laptop, this article is for you. Save it now!

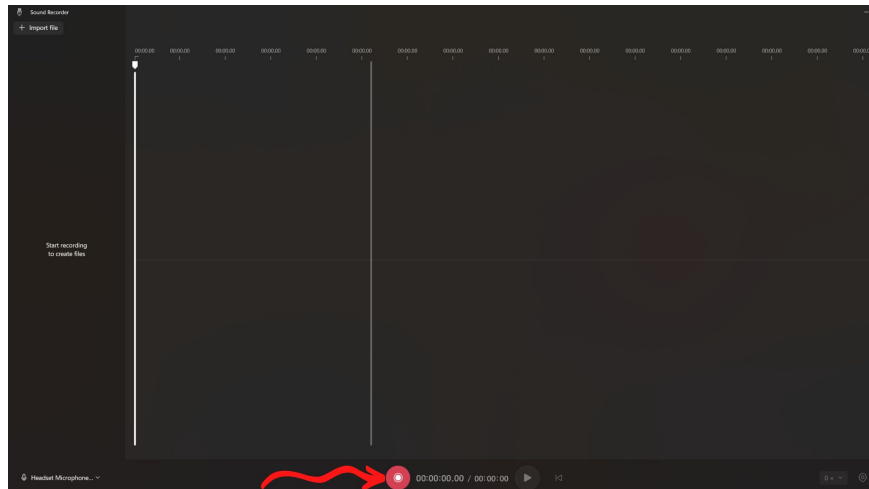
How to record audio on a Windows 11 laptop using the Sound Recorder app.

As mentioned above, the Sound Recorder application has been revamped. In addition to the features of the previous version, it now supports recording in many different formats, including MP3, M4A, WAV, FLAC, WMA, etc. Furthermore, you can choose the sound quality from Auto, Medium, High, and Best. The application also allows you to change recording devices within the app if you have more than one microphone connected to your computer. To use the Sound Recorder application to record on your Windows 11 laptop, follow the instructions below! **Step 1:** First, search for the keyword 'Recorder'. In the list of results returned by Windows 11, click to open the **Sound Recorder application**.

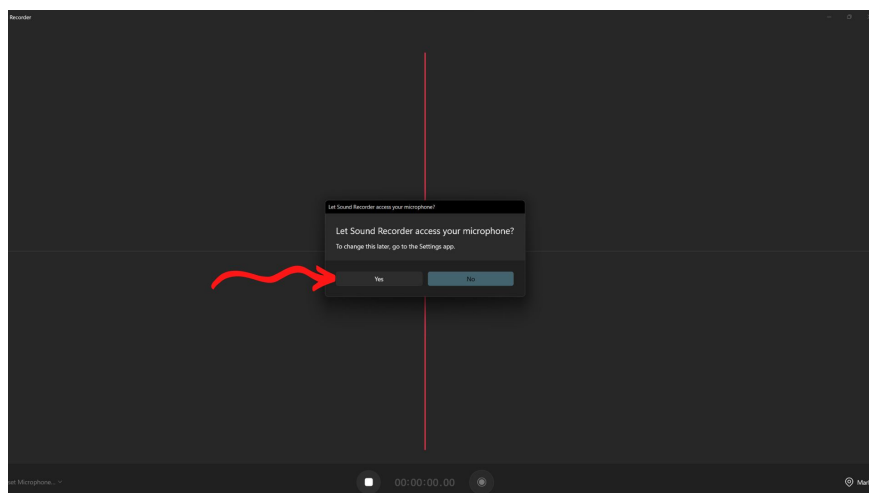


Step 2: On the main interface of the Sound Recorder application, in the bottom left corner, you can freely select the recording device. Make sure to select the correct microphone before starting the recording process if you are

using more than one microphone connected to the device. After selecting the correct microphone, press the Start Recording button (the red circle) or press the shortcut key combination ' **Ctrl + R**' to confirm that the application will start recording on the device.



Note: If this is your first time accessing Sound Recorder, please grant the app permissions before recording. Otherwise, you will not be able to record, and the app screen will display an error message when you press the record button.



Step 3: After the recording process is complete, simply press the **Stop Recording** button (the black square) or the ' **Esc**' key on your keyboard to stop recording. **Step 4:** At this point, a new recording file will appear in the left pane of the Sound Recorder application. You can listen to the file, rename it, view the folder containing it, delete it, and easily **share it** . **Step 5:** You can also adjust **the recording speed** to suit your needs and purpose. **Step 6:** Not only that, you can also customize the format and quality of the recording file (adjust before recording). Tap the three horizontal dots icon in the upper right corner of the application window, then access **Settings** . In the Recording section, you will see that the Sound Recorder application provides settings for the recording format in the **Recording format** option and the audio quality in the **Audio quality** option .
