## 1. How many countries in the world?

According to the 1933 Montevideo Convention, to be recognized as an independent country, all criteria must be met: permanent residents, defined territory, government and ability to enter into relations with other countries. In the world today, there are some countries that claim to be independent but one is recognized but the government does not have enough powers or is not internationally recognized as a political entity.

As of 2019, there are 195 countries in the world, including:

193 countries are members of the United Nations

The two countries that are UN observers are Vatica City and Palestine. Palestine State is not recognized by many countries in the world.

2 countries are recognized by many countries in the world and are independent in fact.

1. Taiwan (Taiwan) - declared by China as part of the territory, has 19 member states of the United Nations and the Vatica City still maintains official relations.

2. Kosovo - declared as a territory by Serbia but is still 111/193 UN members, 23/28 European Union members, 24/28 NATO members, 35/61 members Islamic Cooperation Catholic recognition.

A country that is recognized by many countries but is not independent is in fact the Western Sahara. This is a country that is considered by the African Union and 41 countries to be sovereign but occupied territories.

6 countries declared independence but not recognized:

1. Abkhazia - Only Russia, Nicaragua, Nauru, Vanuatu, Venezuela recognize.
2. Northern Cyprus - Only Turkey recognized.
3. South Ossetia - Has Russia, Nauru, Nicaragua, Venezuela recognized.
4. Somaliland, Transnistria and Nagorno - Karabakh: all three countries have not been recognized by any country or world organization.

## 2. Division of countries by continent



### Asia region

Asia consists of 50 countries, divided into 5 regions: East Asia (6 countries), Southeast Asia (11 countries), South Asia (9 countries), Central Asia (5 countries) and West Asia (18 countries). nation).

Autonomous regions, special zones, non-autonomous territories, disputes: Hong Kong (China), Macao (China), Taiwan (China).

### Europe area

Europe includes 44 countries. Is divided into 4 regions: Northern Europe (10 countries), Eastern Europe (10 countries), Southern Europe (15 countries) and Western Europe (9 countries).

Autonomous regions, non-autonomous territories, disputes: Channel Islands (UK), Isle of Man (UK), Faeroe Islands (Denmark), Gibraltar (UK)

## Americas region

The Americas include 35 countries. Including 4 regions: North America (2 countries), Caribbean (13 countries), South America (12 countries) and Central America (8 countries).

Autonomous regions, non-autonomous territories, disputes: Anguilla (UK), Aruba (Netherlands), Bermuda (UK), British Virgin Islands (UK), Caribbean Netherlands (Netherlands), Cayman Islands (UK), Curacao (Netherlands), Falkland Islands (UK), French Guiana (France), Greenland (Denmark), Guadeloupe (France), Martinique (France), Montserrat (UK), Puerto Rico (USA), Saint Pierre & Miquelon (France), Sint Maarten (Netherlands), Turks and Caicos (UK), US Virgin Islands (USA).

## Africa region

Africa includes 54 countries. Divided into 5 regions: North Africa (6 countries), East Africa (18 countries), South Africa (5 countries), Central Africa (9 countries) and West Africa (16 countries).

Autonomous regions, non-autonomous territories, disputes: Réunion (France), Western Sahara (disputed), Mayotte (France), Saint Helena (UK).

## Australia region

Australia consists of 14 countries. Divided into 4 regions: Australia and New Zealand (2 countries), Melanesia (4 countries), Micronesia (5 countries) and Polynesia (3 countries).

Autonomous regions, non-autonomous territories, disputes: American Samoa (USA), Cook Island (partly New Zealand), French Polynesia (France), Guam (USA), New Caledonia (France), Niue (Partly New Zealand), Northern Mariana Islands (USA), Tokelau (New Zealand), Wallis & Futuna (France).
