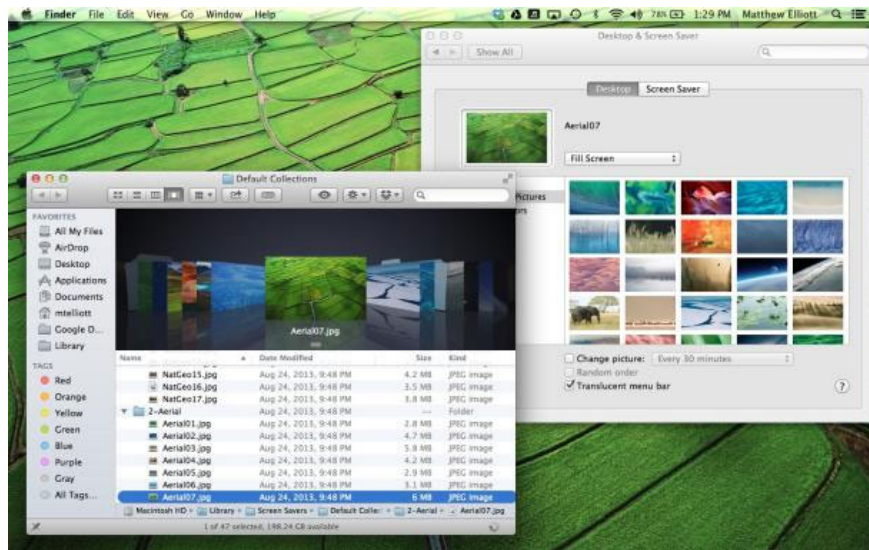


# How to access more than 40 'secret' background images on OS X Mavericks

On the previous OS X Mountain Lion, Apple once hid a lot of background pictures deep inside the system and only used them as screen savers.

And this time they did the same thing with the **OS X Mavericks** , even the pictures above were hidden in a different folder than the Mountain Lion. Here's how to access this collection of 43 hidden background images on Mavericks and set them up as desktop wallpapers.



After pressing **Command + Shift + G** to access the "Go to Folder" menu , enter the following path to be directed to the folder containing the background image:

/ Library / Screen Savers / Default Collections /



You can copy the image to another location, or drag the image to the **Desktop** window in **System Preferences** to use it as a desktop wallpaper for your Mac.
