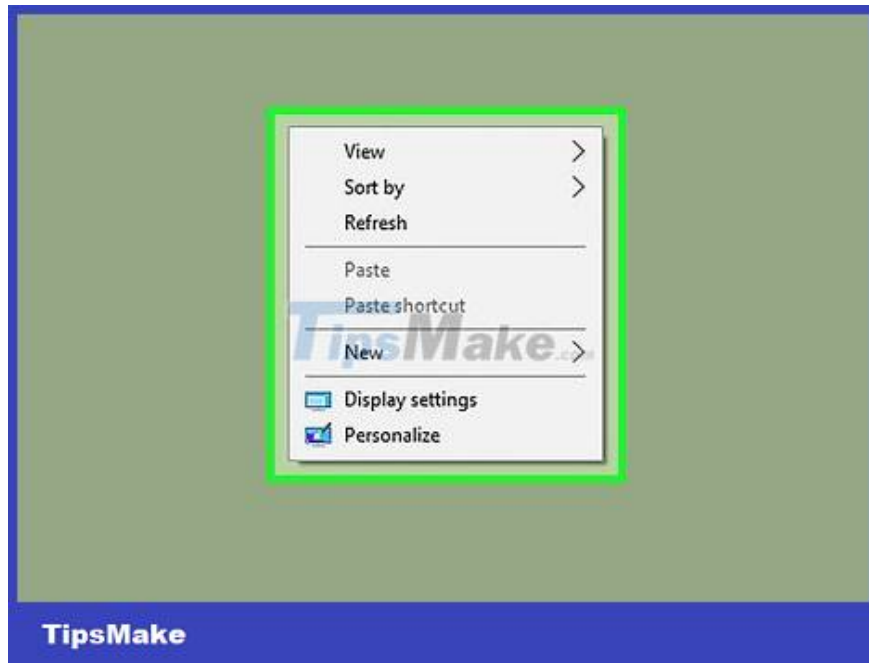


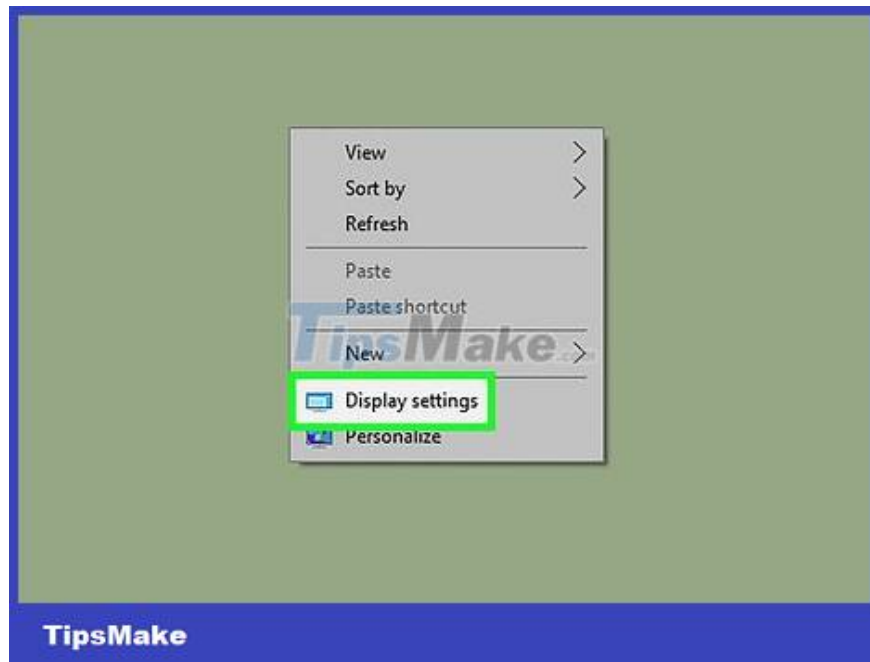
How to Change Computer Screen Resolution

This article shows how to change the size of icons and text on Windows computer screens by increasing or decreasing the resolution.

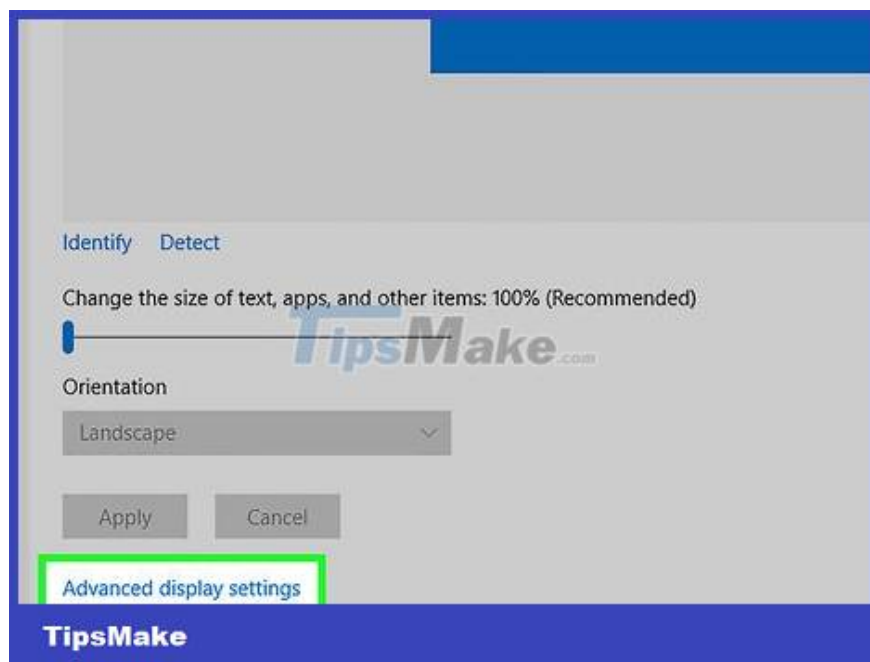
Windows 10



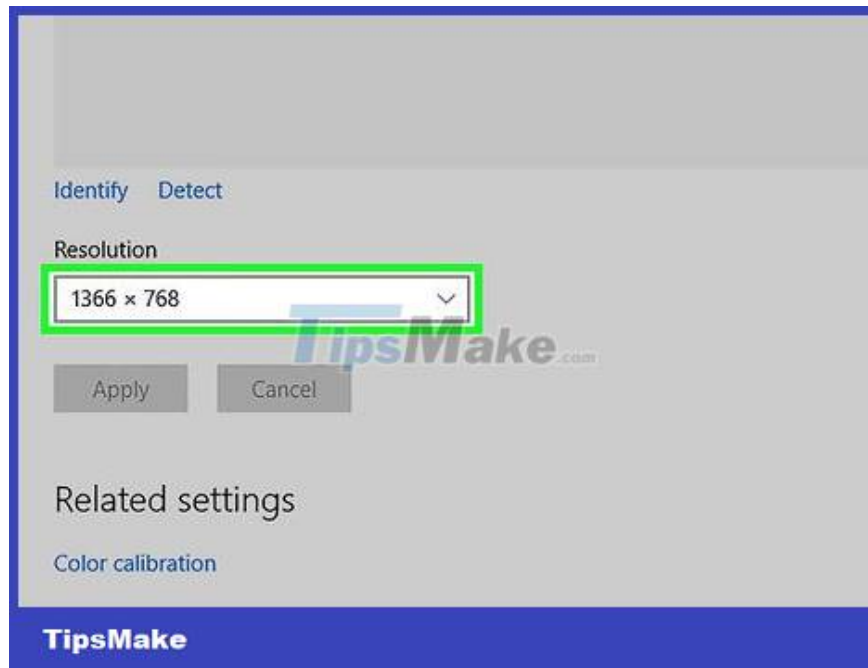
Right click on the screen. A menu will appear here.



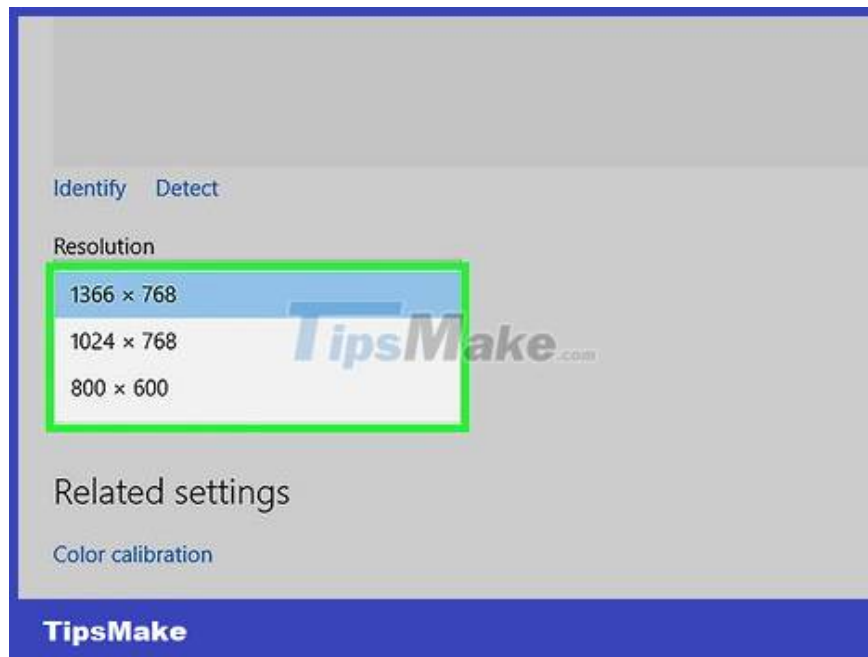
Click **Display settings** . This is the option at the bottom of the menu.



Scroll down and click **Advanced display settings** . This link appears at the bottom of the page.

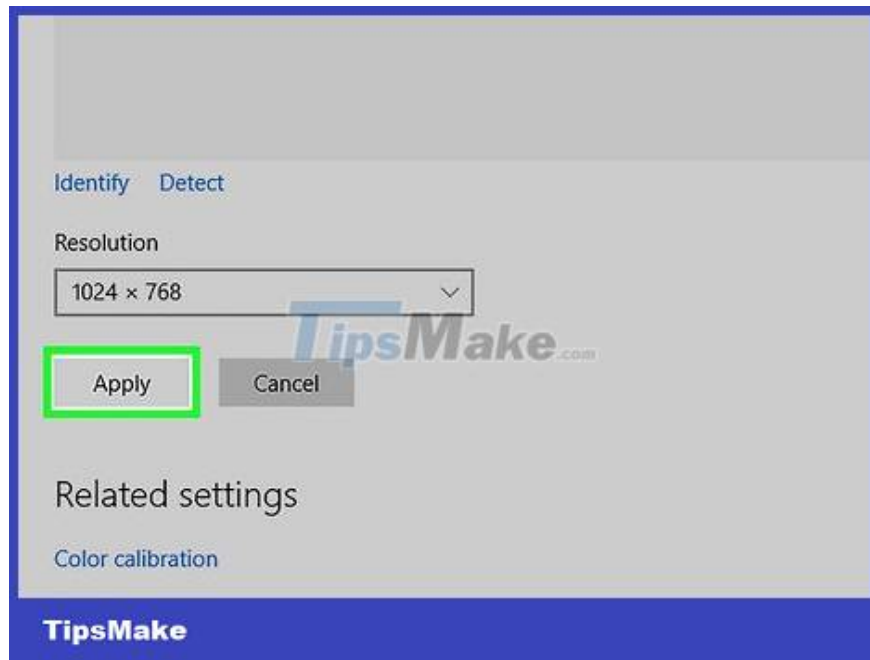


Click the bar below the "Resolution" heading. You'll see a screen displaying a list of different resolutions (such as "800 x 600").

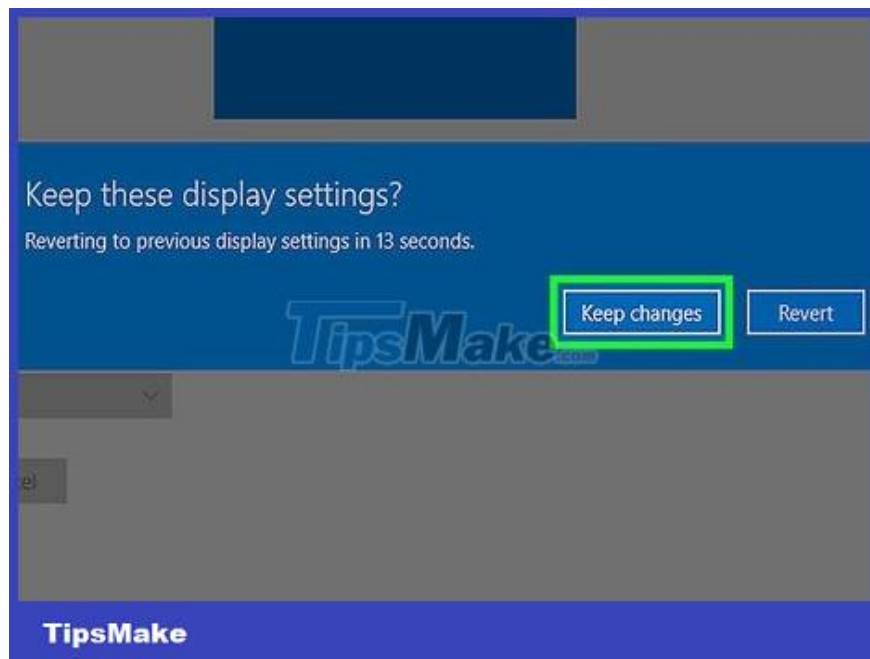


Click a resolution. The resolution that best suits your computer screen usually has the word "(Recommended)" next to it.

The higher the resolution, the smaller the size of text and symbols on your computer.

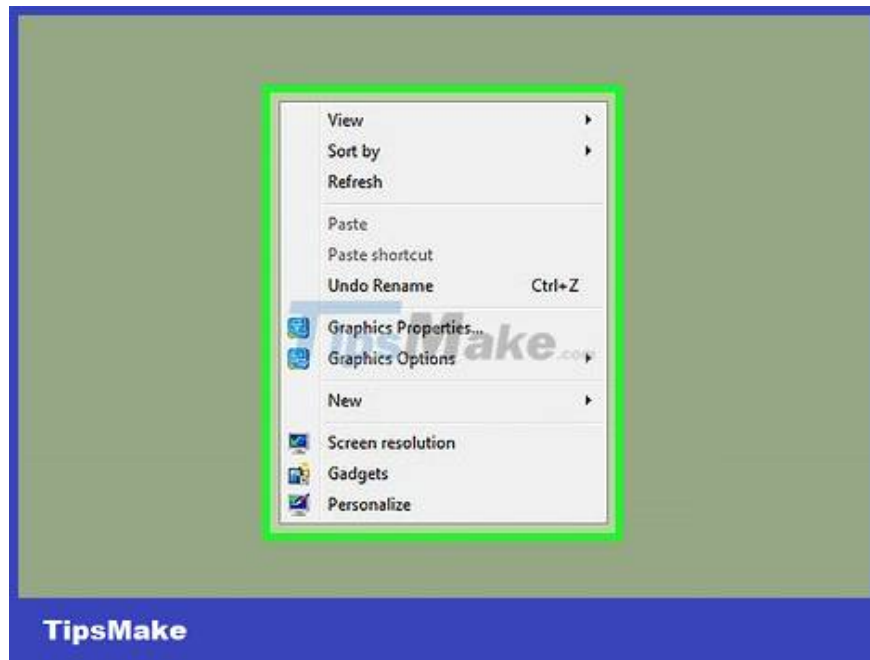


Click Apply . This is the button below the "Resolution" bar. With this operation, the screen will have the resolution you selected.

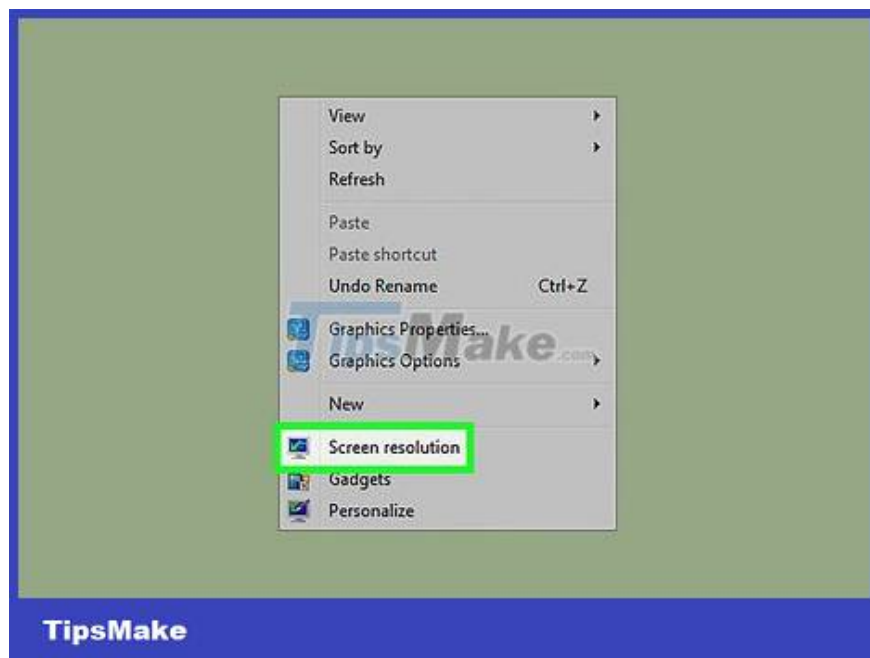


Click Keep changes . If you don't like the new resolution, you can click **Revert** or wait a few seconds until the screen automatically returns to the default resolution.

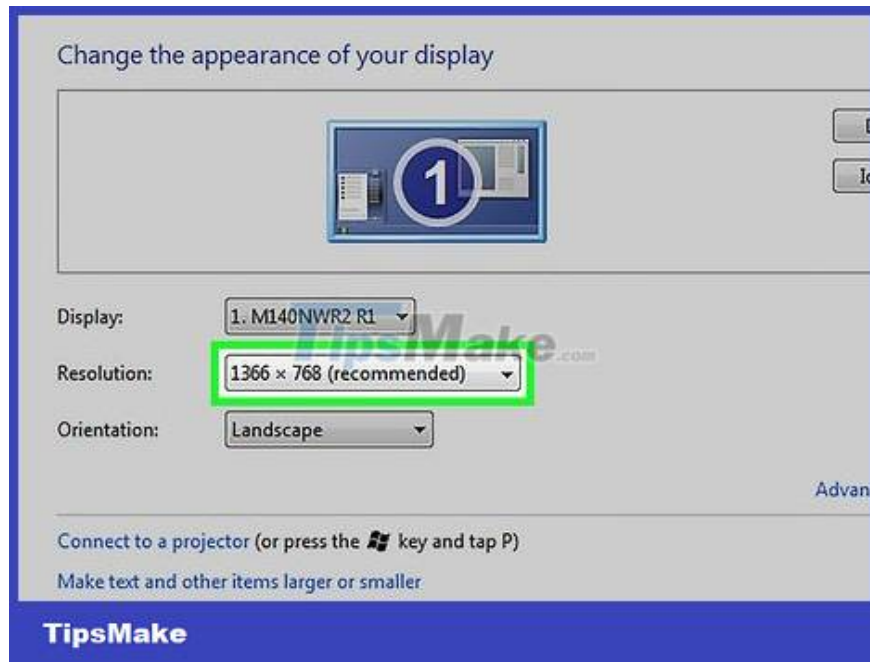
Windows 7 and 8



Right click on the screen. This will show you a menu.

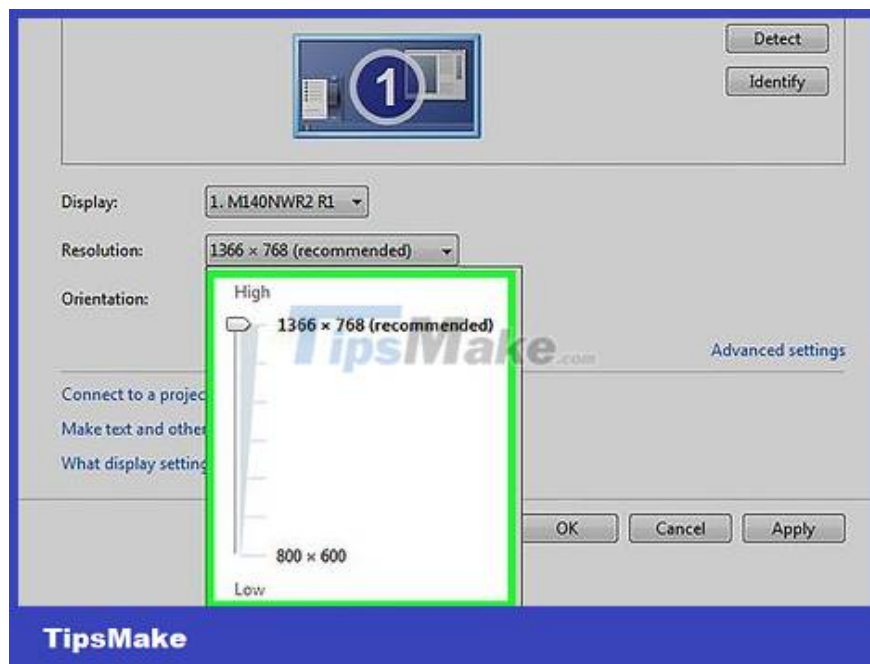


Click Screen resolution . This is the selection at the bottom of the right-click menu.



Click the resolution adjustment bar. This bar appears below the "Resolution" heading. You'll see a list of options with different resolutions, such as "1920 x 1080".

On Windows 7, it will be a vertical slider that allows you to click and drag the adjustment knob up or down to increase or decrease the resolution.



Click a resolution. The resolution that best suits your computer screen will have "(Recommended)" next to it.

The higher the resolution, the smaller the size of text and symbols displayed on the computer.



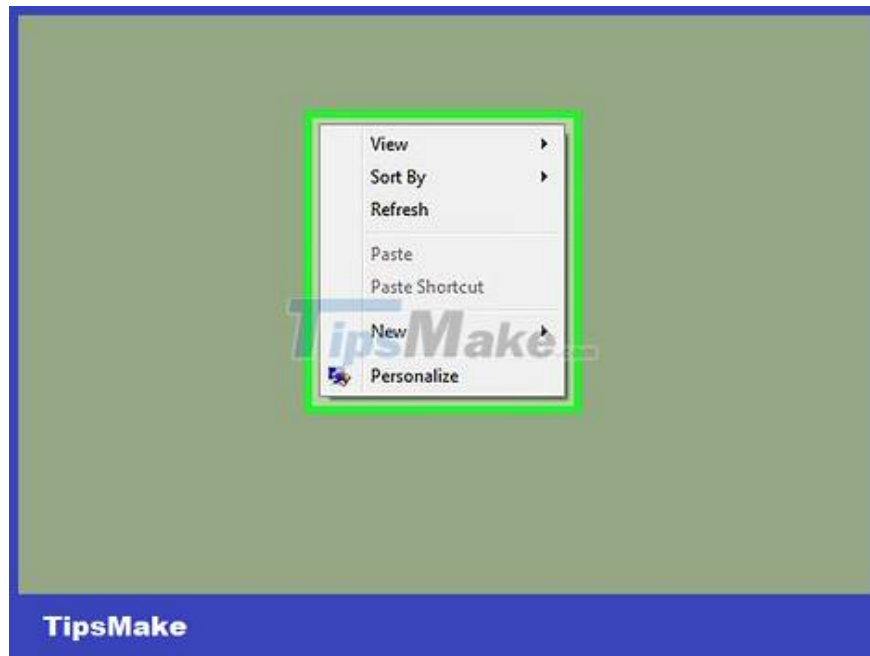
Click OK . This is the button below the window. This will ask you to confirm your selection.



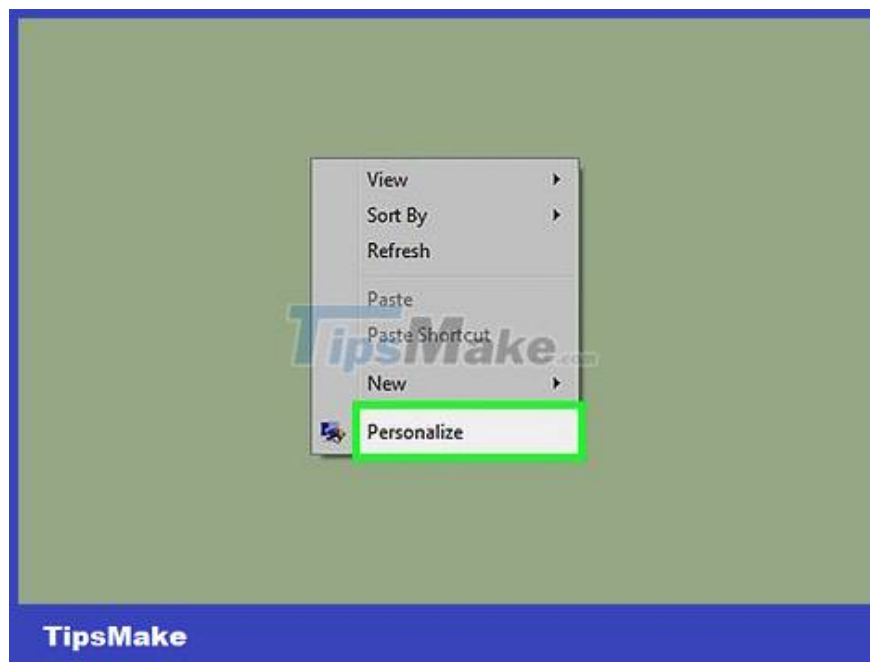
Click Yes when asked. Thus, the resolution you just selected will be saved.

If you don't like the new resolution, you can click **Revert** or wait a few seconds until the screen automatically returns to the default resolution.

Windows Vista

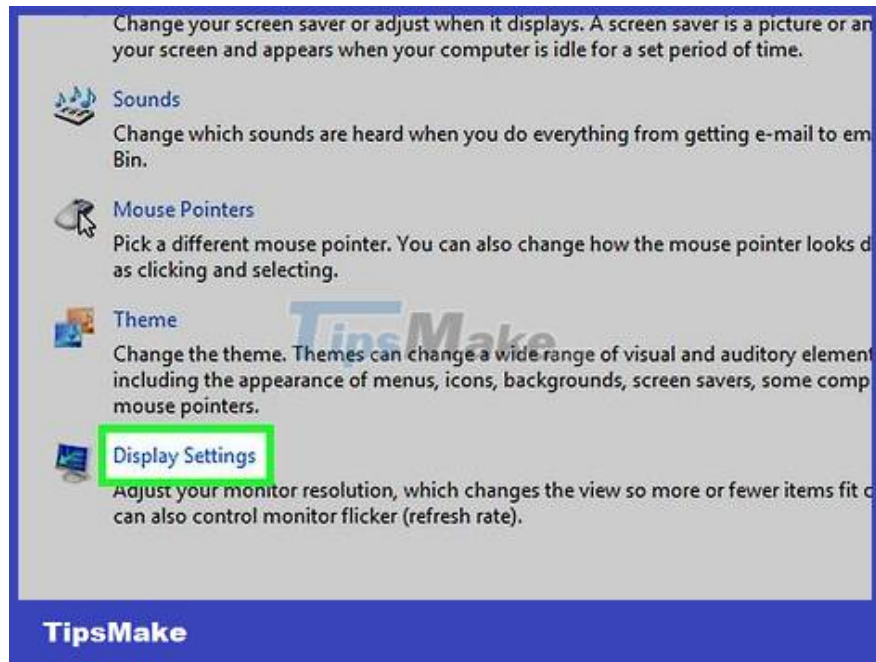


Right click on the screen. A menu will appear here.

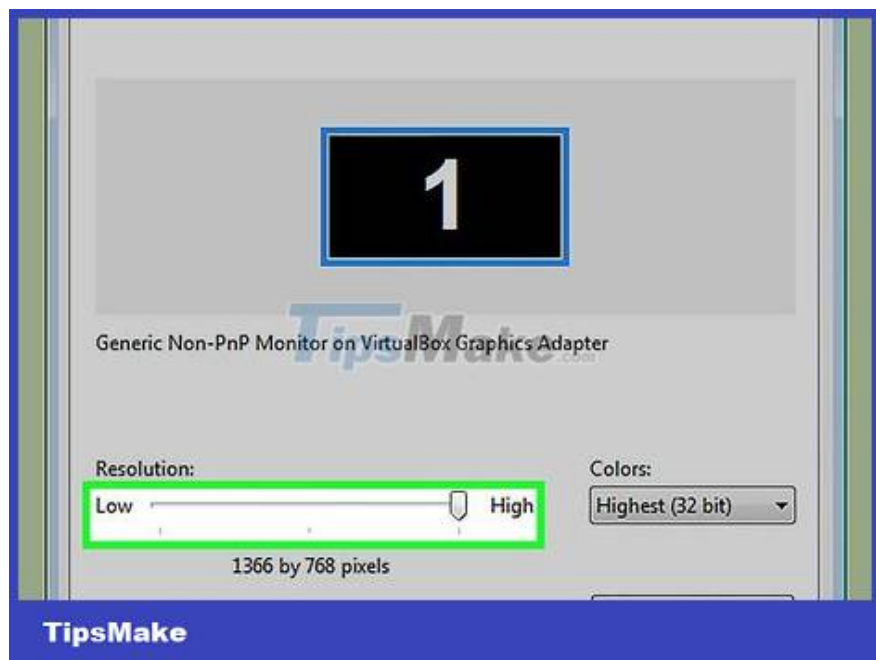


Click Personalize . This is the selection at the bottom of the right-click menu.

On some versions of Vista, this option is also called **Properties** .



Click **Display Settings** . This path appears at the bottom of the "Personalize" window.

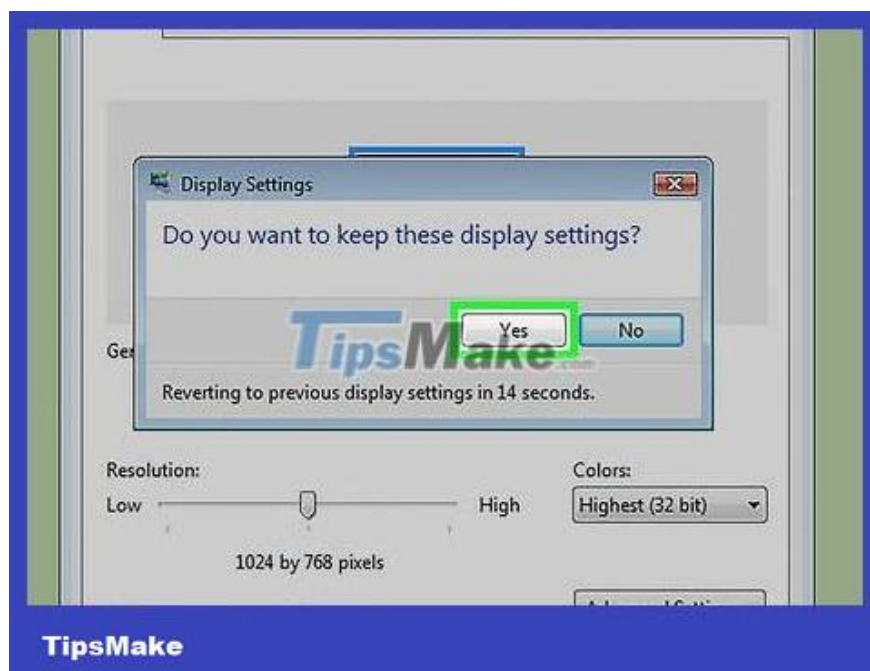


Click and drag the slider on the "Resolution" bar left or right. You will see this adjustment bar below the "Display Settings" window. Dragging the slider to the left will decrease the screen resolution, while dragging the slider to the right will increase the resolution.

As resolution increases, what is displayed on the screen becomes smaller in size; As the resolution drops, the size of what you see on the screen gets bigger. If you can't see your computer screen clearly, reduce the resolution. If you want to see the clearest image, you will have to increase the resolution to match the screen.



Click **OK** below the window. This will ask you to confirm your selection.

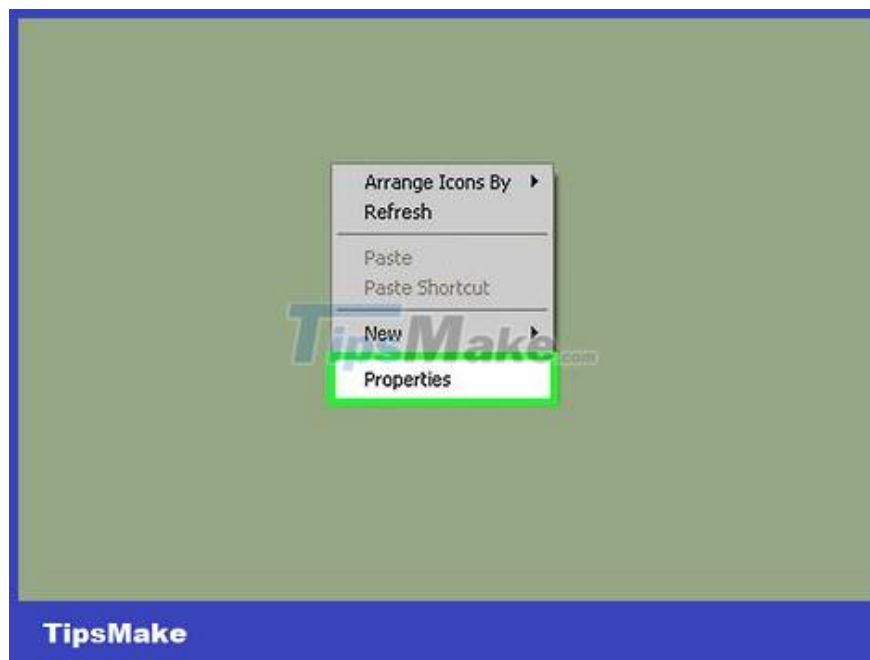


Click **Yes** when asked. Thus, the new resolution you just selected will be saved.

Windows XP

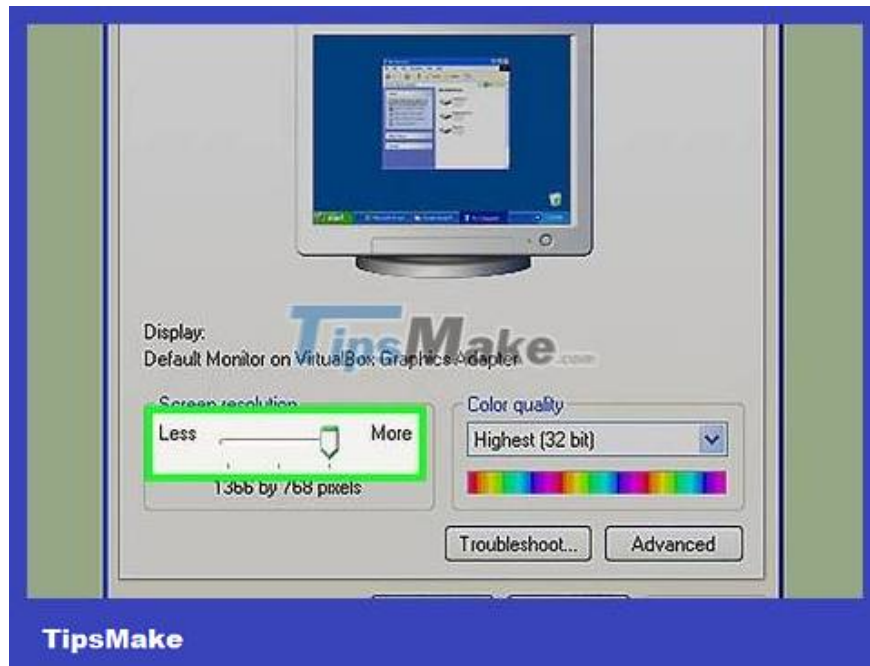


Right-click anywhere on the screen. You will see a menu appear on the screen.



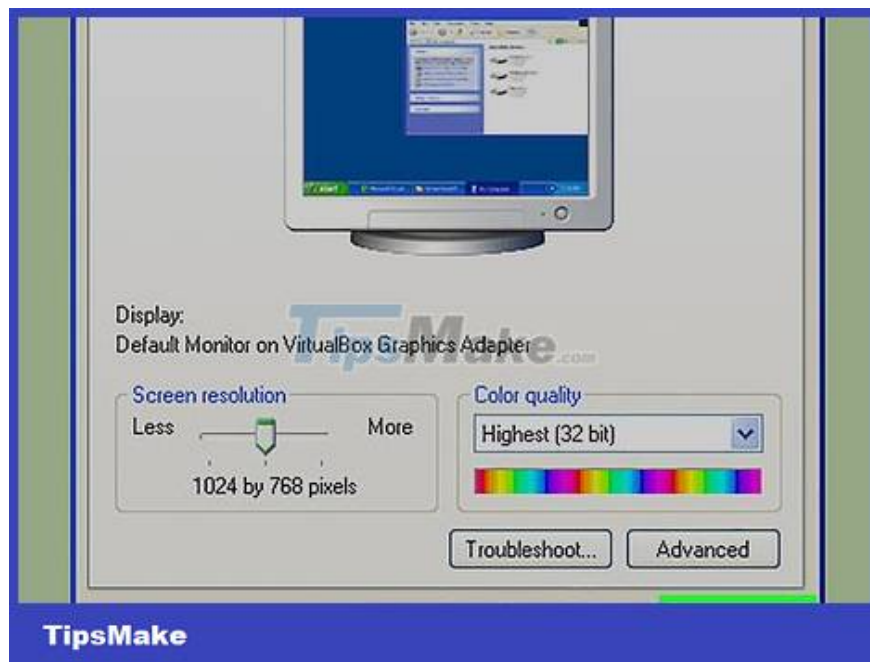
Click Properties . This is the option at the bottom of the menu. The "Display Properties" window will be displayed after this operation.

If the "Display Properties" window doesn't automatically open to the "Settings" tab, you'll click this option at the top of the window.



Click and drag the slider on the "Resolution" bar left or right. This is an option below the "Display Settings" window. Dragging the slider to the left will decrease the screen resolution, while dragging the slider to the right will increase the resolution.

As resolution increases, what is displayed on the screen becomes smaller in size; As the resolution drops, the size of what you see on the screen gets bigger. If you can't see your computer screen clearly, reduce the resolution. If you want to see the clearest image, you will have to increase the resolution to match the screen.

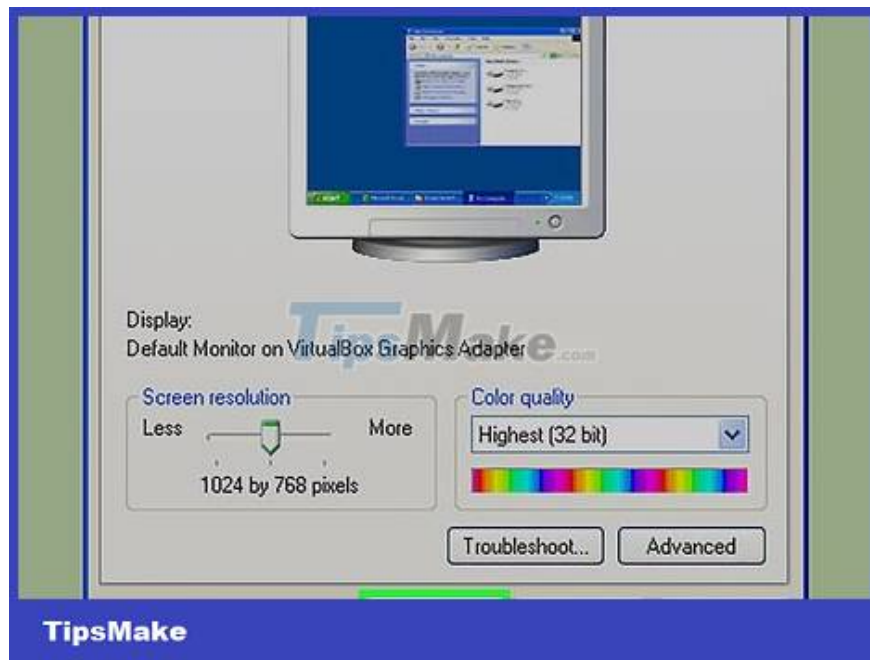


Click Apply . This is the option at the bottom of the window. After this operation, the screen will change resolution and display a confirmation frame.



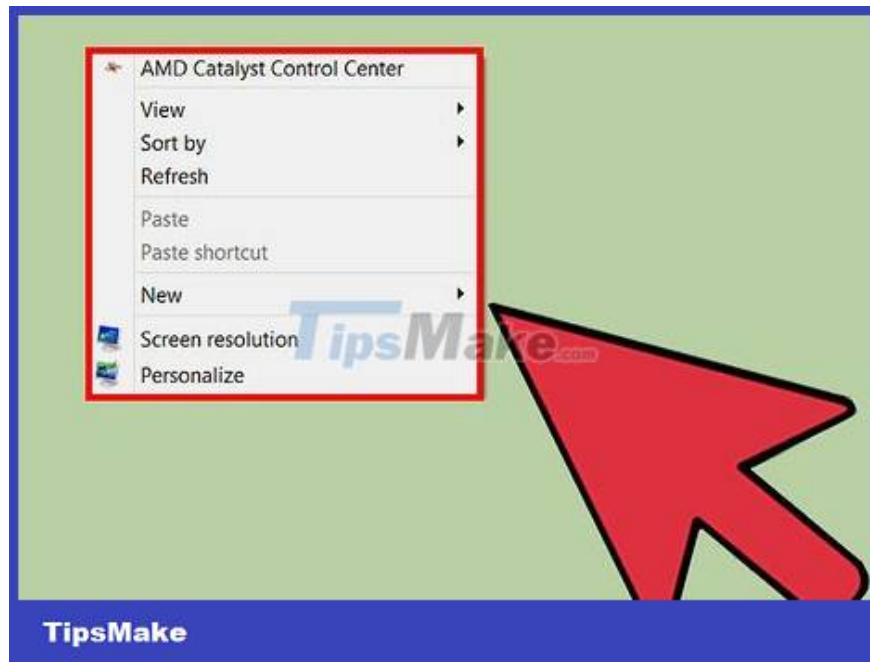
Click Yes when asked. Thus, the resolution you choose will be saved.

If you don't like the new resolution, wait a few seconds; The screen will return to the old resolution.

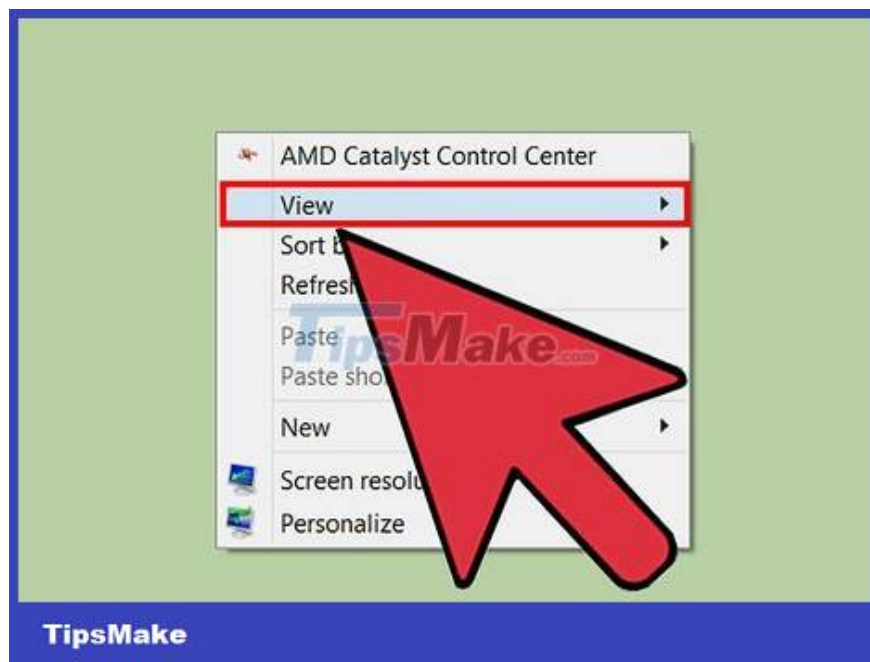


Click OK to close the "Display Properties" window. Your new resolution will be saved.

Windows ME



Right click in an empty area of the screen. A menu will appear here.



Drag the scroll bar to the View section. The next thing is to adjust the size of the icons.
